INNER CIRCLE members contribute annual membership dues of \$1,000.

The Republican Senatorial INNER CIRCLE is dedicated to working for continuing Republican control of the United States Senate through the reelection of present Republican members of the Senate, as well as the election of new Republican members. The Committee channels millions of dollars into Republican Senate campaigns via direct financial aid and professional assistance. All INNER CIRCLE funds are escrowed to go directly to Republican Senatorial incumbents and candidates.

MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

BIANNUAL WASHINGTON MEETINGS

INNER CIRCLE members are invited to two meetings a year held in Washington, D.C. The first is in the spring, the second in the fall.
