

Following is the GSA plan to complete the renovation of the Secret Service Health Facility by August 30, 1982.

Work has already been initiated for relocation of equipment and general clean-up which will be completed by July 12. In order to meet the August 30 completion date, GSA group forces will be used to perform construction tasks. The GSA group forces will begin work on July 12 referencing completed construction drawings. The design will be completed by July 16 and group forces will continue to complete the work.

A meeting will be conducted with the Secret Service on July 17 to review progress and regularly scheduled meetings will be planned in order to review construction progress. At the July 26 meeting a detailed construction schedule will be available.

Based on conversations with the Secret Service, the clearance procedure will be handled expeditiously in order to meet this completion date.

SUBJECT: ATF Reorganization

- The Treasury Department plan to disestablish ATF and transfer the firearms and explosives functions to the Secret Service and alcohol and tobacco functions to the Customs Service is dependent on a minimum budget of \$138 million.
- The original ATF budget for FY 1982 was set at \$150 million. The Senate revised this figure down to \$120 million per OMB as part of the Administration's budget reductions for FY 1982. If the Senate version holds, the transfer of functions to the Secret Service would be impossible because over 800 ATF agents will have to be RIFed.
- Decisions will probably be made today or tomorrow with respect to a continuing resolution on the FY 1982 budget. The NRA has expressed some concern over a large number of ATF agents (1200) going to the Secret Service because they see firearms enforcement in terms of "business as usual."
- We have some indication that the Senate may decide on a continuing resolution figure of \$120 million for the ATF FY 1982 budget. This figure would mean that agent RIFs would have to start immediately and the advantage to the Secret Service would be lost.
- It is important that Senators Abdnor (R.-S. Dak.), Chairman of the Subcommittee on Appropriations and Senator DeConcini (D.-Ariz.), Ranking Minority Member on the Subcommittee on Appropriations, be contacted and advised of

the importance of the ATF merger to strengthen the Secret Service in its protective mission and <u>not</u> as a means of stricter enforcement of the firearms laws. Under the reorganization there will be several hundred less agents working on firearms matters.

As you know, the threat level for the President and other Secret Service protectees is unprecedented. The ATF resources are vitally needed in view of this factor.

I had a conversation with Nina Wormser on Wednesday, April 29. Nina told our advance agent for Mrs. Reagan's Jacqueline Kennedy Garden Function on Thursday, April 30, that she was advised by persons in her office that she need not provide identifying information for a social function.

I explained to Nina exactly what was needed. She was cooperative but stated that her office and other offices dealing with social events at the White House are unaware of the specific policy relative to acquiring identifying information.

I then told her that the attached memorandum was discussed with you, and she would probably be receiving a copy of it in the near future.

I would like to respectfully recommend that all offices scheduling events at the White House be given a copy of the memorandum or at least the text of the information contained therein with your sanction.

If you still feel a briefing is needed, I will be happy to select with you the appropriate groups on the White House Staff and set up separate briefings.

All protection after the basic package is authorized -upon a finding that a serious threat warranting such protection exists-
