SUBJECT: Alternate Dinner

The average cost per head (food, beverage, flowers, invitations and labor) for a State Dinner is \$90.

We average 35 guests for Alternate Dinner, a cost of \$3,150.

Last year we had nine State Dinners, and the cost for alternate guests was \$28,350.

The real reason for our concern is that time, space and personnel required for the Alternate Dinner should be directed to the President's Dinner.

SUBJ: White House Diplomatic Dinner

Last year's two Diplomatic Dinners were outstanding successes and should be repeated. We were able in two nights to accommodate all of the Chiefs of Mission, their spouses, as well as the Permanent Representatives to the OAS and their spouses. Guests began arriving at 7:15 and were served cocktails. At 8:00pm the President and Mrs. Reagan arrived on the State Floor and went to the Blue Room. The guests went through the receiving line and were photographed with the President and Mrs. Reagan. The receiving line terminated at 8:30 and dinner was served. At 9:30 toasts were given by the President and by the ranking Ambassador. At 9:45 the President and Mrs. Reagan went to the Color Rooms for coffee and liquers and the Diplomatic Corps was given the opportunity to meet briefly with them both. At 10:15 the President and Mrs. Reagan left the State Floor for the residence. By 10:45 all guests had departed.

For many Ambassadors this is their only opportunity to dine with the President. The photographs taken and the evening's events helped cement many relations. The President's involvement is approximately two hours each night. No entertainment is necessary which means less costs and time. I believe it would be a great mistake not to repeat the event in the same format. The Diplomatic community does not view a reception in the same light as a White House dinner. We should not omit the Representatives to the OAS. They were invited last year and a change would send an incorrect signal to representatives of crucial areas.

RECOMMENDATION:

That we repeat last year's two Diplomatic Dinners in the same format.

Attached is the annual report on gifts for the past year which we are required by law to transmit to the Congress. If you remember, I sent you a similar one some months ago. *which covered 1980.*

While this document is generally regarded as "confidential", there is always the possibility of press getting hold of it. Therefore, I wanted you to be aware of its contents and prepared for questions should it come up. You may wish to show this to Mrs. Reagan.

So far the Congress has understood and been extremely cooperative in keeping the information closely held. They are aware of the sensitivities involved, and how this could adversely impact on our foreign relations if world leaders began to compare the relative values of the gifts we give them. I hope this sense of discretion and good taste continues.

SUBJECT: Report to Congress on Gifts Given

Public Law 95-105 effective October 1, 1977, requires the Secretary of State to report annually to Congress all gifts given to foreign individuals of more than a minimal value (\$140.00 since October 1981). Reports for fiscal years 1978, 1979 and 1980 were negative. 1981 was the first year when gifts which cost the Government more than \$140.00 were given by the President, Vice President and the Secretary of State.

Reports before FY 81 erroneously used the cost of the gift in determining whether it was of minimal value. In FY 81 the retail value of gifts to foreign individuals was first reported to Congress.

*Note **
The report for FY 82 is attached for your information. (Tab A) You may wish to remind the Secretary and the White House that this information will possibly draw press attention. Total values of gifts given are as follows: Secretary - \$10,115 (actual cost \$4,129), Vice President - \$13,497 (actual cost \$7,796), President - \$87,967 (actual cost \$33,963).

RECOMMENDATION

That the attached report be forwarded to the Assistant Secretary for Congressional Relations for transmittal to Congress.

In addition, previous reports assumed that no other agencies gave gifts of more than minimal value since:

1. "No appropriated funds other than funds from the Emergencies in the Diplomatic and Consular Service" account of the Department of State, may be used to purchase any tangible gift of more than minimal value for any foreign individual unless such gift has been approved by the Congress." (Public Law 95-105, Sec. 515(b) (1).
2. No agency has ever reported giving such a gift, nor were they specifically requested to do so.

The Legal Office, in a memorandum on May 4, 1982, stated that other agencies should be specifically queried on the question. (Tab B) We propose to alert other agencies to the requirements of the law by requesting that records be kept of applicable gifts given during FY 83 for inclusion in next year's report to Congress. A proposed letter and reporting format is attached. (Tab C)

RECOMMENDATION

That this letter be sent to other agencies now, and their responses specifically requested at the end of FY 83. .

SUBJECT: Report to Congress on Gifts Given

Your memorandum of March 29, 1982 to Gene Malmborg raised certain questions concerning the Department's responsibilities under Section 515(b)(2) of P.L. 95-105 relating to the reporting of gifts given by the United States to foreign individuals. Your memo also attached a proposed memorandum to Federal agencies requesting information with which to complete the annual report.

My answers to your specific questions are as follows:

1. I believe that the Department should report gifts which have U.S. retail value of \$140 or more, regardless of whether that sum was required for their purchase. The underlying purpose of the requirement is to monitor gift-giving to foreign governments and individuals, and this purpose would be largely defeated if low cost-basis items (e.g., donated materials) were excluded entirely.
2. The Department should ask other agencies for a report on any gifts made by them. It is the Department's responsibility to submit a comprehensive, Government-wide report.
3. Other agencies should report all gifts given which are valued at more than minimal value, whether or not purchased with appropriated or non-appropriated funds.

Your proposed memorandum to all Federal agencies looks good.

SUBJECT: Submission to Department of State of Listing of
Gifts of More Than Minimal Value Given to Foreign
Individuals during Fiscal Year 1983

The Secretary of State, under Section 515(b) (2) of Public Law 95-105, 91 Stat. 866, is required to transmit annually, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate, a report containing details on (1) any gifts of more than minimal value (\$140.00) purchased with appropriated funds which were given to foreign individual during the previous fiscal year, and (2) any other gifts of more than minimal value given by the United States Government to a foreign individual which were not obtained using appropriated funds.

Value is defined as the retail value in the United States. Minimal value, \$100 before October 20, 1981, is now \$140.

In order to enable the Secretary of State to discharge his responsibility under the law, each employing agency or its delegate must, not later than October 31 of each year, transmit a compilation listing all gifts given to foreign individuals which fall under one of the two categories listed above. Each agency should prepare its compilation for Fiscal Year 1983 on copies of the enclosed report sheets. Reports should be addressed to the Secretary of State, Attention: Office of Protocol, Department of State, Washington, D.C. 20520. In submitting the report, please provide the name and telephone number of the individual who may be contacted, if necessary, concerning its contents.

Agencies whose responses have not been received by October 31, 1983 will be presumed not to have given any reportable gifts during fiscal year 1983.

Please note the attached memo from Mrs. Roosevelt.

The exact same thing happened with King Hassan in the same week. Chuck Tyson assured us there would be no gift because it was a working visit, and we almost duplicated giving a belt buckle to the Prince because Mrs. Roosevelt obtained gifts from our gift unit at the last minute for the Prince and Princess. I have since advised Mary Power to always let Dave and I know when State Department uses our gifts for these visits so we don't duplicate them.

I advised the President about the desk set for President Gemayel and he was pleased that we were doing this. I also suggested to him that we do the same thing (or something very similar) for King Hassan since he also brought the antique sabre sword for the President. He wholeheartedly agreed.

I know this can be a problem for State Department because they sometimes don't know until the last minute. However, isn't there some kind of special gifts we can have made up and hold in abeyance for such emergencies?

I know Mrs. Roosevelt is as concerned about this problem as we are. Any objections in my contacting her about a gift for King Hassan?
