Scheduling Proposal for Braithwaite Meeting with
the President

In response to your request for our thoughts on the meeting:

- A Presidential meeting with Braithwaite on February 13, is a good idea.
- Braithwaite has several other items on his agenda besides the private sector initiatives we have undertaken. These include: the duration of our 250-man force on the island and proposals regarding their elections.
- Prime Minister Eugenia Charles of Dominica noted these matters in her meeting with the President on February 3.
- Braithwaite may also be concerned about the effect of our legislation to implement the NBCCA report on the Caribbean island states.

If we have room in the schedule, we should try to get Braithwaite in to see the President for the 15 minutes proposed. Prior to the meeting, we need to arrive at some conclusions about how we can complete the airfield project at Pt. Salines. Craig Fuller had a meeting on this issue Friday, February 3, with AID and NSC.

Further to our memorandum of November 20, 1984, we have learned that Prime Minister Mulroney would like to announce the President's acceptance of his invitation to visit Canada during a major policy speech Mulroney is giving for the Economic Club of New York on December 10. You will recall that we recommended that the President agree to meet with Mr. Mulroney in Quebec City in March, 1985. Given the cooperative and forthcoming posture of the new government in Ottawa, we now recommend that we agree to Mr. Mulroney's proposal to announce Presidential acceptance on December 10th. We would ask the Prime Minister to refer to an "early 1985" time frame, with the precise date to be worked out later.

In addition, State has requested approval for a 30-minute meeting in the spring with Tunisian President Bourguiba. Bourguiba, who is 83 years old and in failing health, wishes to make a visit to the United States while he is still able to travel, and we believe a brief meeting will serve to enhance our important relationship with Tunisia.

This was a difficult six-month period to establish priorities for Official Working Visits. We have had to pass over visits by the newly-elected President of Guatemala, Prime Minister Schluter of Denmark and Prime Minister Hermannsson of Iceland. We look to giving priority to these visits in early 1986, or substituting them for individuals on the first page who cannot visit in 1985.
