
Dear Mr. Deaver:


Dear Mr. Deaver:

The Smithsonian Institution has scheduled a number of events during the spring of 1984, many of them continuing over a period of time, such as: Lecture series, 8 lectures, "Key Decisions of the Truman Presidency" - and a documentary film series which will run for four weeks. (A separate brochure will be printed covering all Centennial events at the Smithsonian, the Library of Congress and the Archives and should be available sometime in late January.)

Activities approved by the Reserve Officers Association of the United States include: (1) dedication of an area of the National Headquarters building as "The Harry S. Truman Hall of Achievement"; (2) the May 1984 issue of The Officer magazine will be principally devoted to President Truman, with his picture on the cover; (3) the 1984 convention in Chicago, June 27-30, will be dedicated to President Truman; observances by all departments and chapters in conjunction with department convocations. Also, appropriate observance will be held at the Reserve Officers International meeting in Rome in February 1984.

The NAACP has indicated that its members will participate in the Centennial and it is appointing national and regional committees for this purpose.

The AFL-CIO has issued a statement calling upon its affiliates and members to participate in the Centennial. A copy of the AFL-CIO statement will be included in a First Day Issue cover put out by the Samuel Gompers Stamp Club, which you should receive about 3 weeks after the issuance of the Truman Stamp on January 26, 1984.

The Masons have indicated that appropriate observances will be held by the Grand Lodges in each state. The Shriner organizations throughout the country will also schedule commemorative events.

There are many other events currently under consideration or in the early planning stages, both in Washington and around the country. The schedule of events will be updated from time to time.

NOTE: A 16 mm. film about President Truman, which runs a little less than 30 minutes, is being prepared by the Smithsonian Institution. Copies of this film will be available after April 1, 1984 through the National Audio-Visual Center, Orders Section, Washington, D.C. 20409.

TRUMAN CENTENNIAL

It was a very great pleasure to see you again at lunch today, to hear from you how your plans were progressing for celebrating this most important Centennial and to let you know what progress we had been able to make in the United Kingdom. As you know, I am a great Truman fan, having been Vice Consul in New York City during part of his Presidency. In particular I was there when he promulgated the doctrine of aid to Greece and Turkey in March 1947, which reversed the whole trend of American history since Washington, Jefferson and Munroe.

Just to keep you up to date, perhaps I could recap how far we have got in Britain.

First there will be a three day conference at Wilton Park from the 11th to 15th of March under the general title "The USA and Europe: Partners or Rivals?" The British Foreign Secretary, Sir Geoffrey Howe, and the United States Deputy Secretary of State, Mr Kenneth Dam, will be the principal speakers.

Secondly, Ditchley Park will hold a commemorative conference at Ditchley Park, near Oxford, on the 15th to 17th June entitled "Thirty Years since the Truman Doctrine: The Evolution of the Policy of Containment and the Continuing US Commitment to the Defence of Europe".

Thirdly I have written to the editors of the principal British national newspapers - the Sunday Times, The Times, The Observer, The Guardian, The Daily Telegraph, The Financial Times, The Daily Mail, The Daily Express and The Daily Mirror in order to encourage them to take note of the Centenary. I have also written to the editors of the weekly magazines: The Economist and Spectator, and to the monthly magazines, Encounter and Illustrated London News. I have also written to senior people at the principal TV and radio stations.

Fourthly I understand that both the London branch of the English Speaking Union and also the Europe/Atlantic Group in London are proposing to hold commemorative dinners to celebrate the Centennial. I will let you know when I know who will be the principal speakers. I gather we are experiencing a little reluctance on the part of the Pilgrims of Great Britain also to hold a dinner.

Fifthly, I mentioned to you the fact that there would be a meeting in or around Washington at the end of May (May 29-31) of the Ministerial Council of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation, which will bring the Foreign Ministers of all countries of the Alliance to this side of the Atlantic. I wondered out loud whether a Truman flavour could not be given to this meeting. You mentioned that you had already been in touch with the Secretary General of NATO, Joseph Luns.

Finally, I mentioned to you an idea which is still in embryo, but which would, if it came off, commemorate the memory of Harry Truman in a rather more permanent fashion. It is that the Royal Institute of International Affairs, at Chatham House, St James's Square, London, might establish a Truman fellowship. Such a fellowship might invite a distinguished United States scholar to spend up to an academic year at Chatham House, in order to do research on a subject of his choosing but connected with the Truman Presidency and his impact on the recovery and the defence of Europe. This will of course cost a lot of money: the sum of £50,000 (approximately \$75,000) per annum has been suggested. I am working on the idea. It occurs to me that there might be some United States subsidiaries of British companies, who do well out of business in the United States, who might be willing to make a contribution.

That's as far as I have got so far. I will, if I may, keep in touch as matters develop. But I feel sure that your British ally will make, and will be seen to be making, a worthy contribution to the celebration of the Birthday.
