The three wines are our 1981 Chardonnay Vineyard Selection, our 1981 Gewurztraminer Rose Vineyard Selection, and our 1981 Merlot Vineyard Selection. We are, of course, very proud of these wines and feel that they are of a quality level that is most appropriate for White House usage.

The Chardonnay Vineyard Selection 1981 has never been entered in a major tasting, but we feel the wine is developing rapidly into an outstanding Chardonnay, suitable for a dry aperitif wine before dinner or an excellent choice to offer with salad or a light entree such as sauteed fillet of sole.





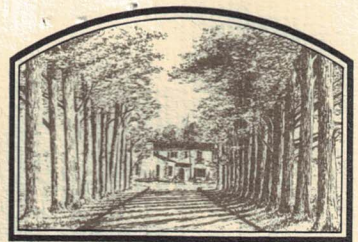
