

SUBJECT: 1985 PIC INVITATION/TICKET ALLOCATION

Attached you will find a "rough cut" at an allocation proposal which was developed by Margaret Tutwiler, Karen Hart and myself. It is presented in a "percent of total distribution" format and is based on the historical levels of the 1973 and 1981 Inaugurals. It is envisioned that 400,000 Commemoratives will be printed. The quantities of all other categories and actual invitation list development must await event and site selections.

For the allocation within the 50-states category, we recommend using the RNC formula for delegate selection. This formula takes into account relative state size, percent of Republican office holders in the state, and percent of total state votes accorded President Reagan. The RNC has agreed to update this for us with the 1984 results.

Obviously, these ratios would undergo some adjustment as the fulfillment and capacity figures become more firm. At this juncture, we ask for approval of this general approach. If approved, refined versions, including specific numbers in each category, would be provided for review.
