Enclosed are flyers on our two newest releases - "Drugs: Don't Be Fooled" and "Dead Wrong - The John Evans Story."

"Drugs: Don't Be Fooled" is a 23 minute film which focuses on the effects of drug and alcohol abuse. The main thrust is on peer pressure and through short vignettes, we illustrate how peers can influence and cause a non-user to become a first-time user.

"Dead Wrong - The John Evans Story" is the true story of John Louis Evans III, who was executed in Alabama last year for the murder of a pawn shop broker in the presence of his two children. Evans agreed to make this tape in order to perhaps prevent other young people from choosing a life of crime as he did. This program aired on CBS January 24, 1984 as an after-school special. It has been nominated for 10 emmys.
