CHUN 1. (S) ENTIRE TEXT.

2. IN A VERY WARM AND CONGENIAL SESSION LASTING SLIGHTLY MORE THAN ONE HOUR, THE PRESIDENT IN MEETING WITH SECRETARY CARLUCCI STRESSED FAMILIAR THEMES. AFTER FORMALITIES OF CONGRATULATIONS AND AWARDING A DECORATION TO THE SECRETARY, THE PRESIDENT TALKED ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ALLIANCE, HIS SUPPORT OF PRESIDENT REAGAN'S PEACE THROUGH STRENGTH EFFORTS, AND THE FACT THAT FOR THE 1980'S THE U.S. AND KOREA WERE ON CLOSER TERMS THAN EVER BEFORE. PRESIDENT CHUN TALKED ABOUT KOREA'S NECESSITY FOR SUSTAINED ECONOMIC GROWTH, NOTING THE GOAL TO GAIN A GNP ONE-TENTH THAT OF JAPAN'S. HE HOPED THE U.S. WOULD HELP IN ACHIEVING THIS GOAL. IN THAT WAY, HE SAID, KOREA COULD CARRY ITS FAIR SHARE OF THE DEFENSE BURDEN.

3. THERE WAS CONSTANT REFERENCE TO JAPAN ON THE PART OF THE PRESIDENT, INDICATING THAT JAPAN WAS NOT CARRYING ITS FAIR SHARE. HE ALSO MADE REFERENCE TO A RADIO BROADCAST THIS MORNING REPORTING THAT PRIME MINISTER SUZUKI EXPRESSED DISAGREEMENT WITH THE U.S. POSITION ON THE MAGNITUDE OF THE SOVIET THREAT.

4. OF COURSE, THERE WAS JUBILATION OVER THE DECISION OF THE IOC FOR SEDUL AS THE VENUE FOR THE 1988 OLYMPICS, PRESIDENT CHUN USED THIS GOOD NEWS TO STRESS HIS VIEW THAT KOREA CAN PLAY AN INTERMEDIARY ROLE AS A BRIDGE BE-TWEEN THE U.S. AND THE THIRD WORLD. HE POINTED OUT THAT THE DECISION PROBABLY EMANATED IN PART FROM THIRD WORLD DISTRUST OF THE ECONOMIC SUPER-POWERS AND THAT IN HIS MEET-INGS WITH THIRD WORLD LEADERS, AS WELL AS OTHER LEADERS, HE

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HAS CONSTANTLY STRESSED THE NEED TO UNITE BEHIND THE U.S. TO OPPOSE "COMMUNIST TOTALITARIANISM". SECRETARY CARLUCCI ENCOURAGED PRESIDENT CHUN IN THESE ENDEAVORS.

5. SECRETARY CARLUCCI, IN ADDITION TO GIVING REASSURANCES ABOUT THE INTIMACY AND COMMITMENT INVOLVED IN THE U.S. KOREAN ALLIANCE, STRESSED THE CHANGED POSTURE OF THE U.S. UNDER THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION AND OF OUR UNDERSTANDING OF THE NECESSITY OF KOREA'S ROLE, THE SECRETARY SAID HE APPRECIATED A REMARK MADE BY THE ACTING FOREIGN MINISTER AT THE RECEPTION LAST NIGHT THAT KOREA'S FRONT LINE LIES IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

6. THE MEETING WAS CHARACTERIZED BY CORDIALITY AND WARMTH. THE PRESIDENT USED EXCEPTIONALLY COURTEOUS LANGUAGE IN RE-FERRING TO THE SECRETARY AND THE VISIT WAS CHARACTERIZED BY MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING.

7. THIS MESSAGE HAS NOT BEEN CLEARED BY SECRETARY CARLUCCI. DETAILED NOTES TAKEN BY MR. ARMITAGE AND OTHER DEFENSE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS WILL BE TAKEN PERSONALLY TO WASHINGTON. WALKER

AFTERNOON OF OCTOBER 8, ACTING FOREIGN MINISTER KIM DONG WHIE (M-R: KIM TONG-HWI) SAID THAT FINNISH PRIME MINISTER KOIVISTO HAD RELAYED TO ROK PRIME MINISRER NAM DUCK WOO (M-R: NAK TOK-U) IN CAR ON WAY TO AIRPORT ON SEPTEMBER 9, THAT THE USSR HAD ASKED HIM TO PASS THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE TO THE KOREAN PM: (1) THAT IN THE PAST WHEN ROKG HAD MADE APPROACHES TO THE USSR, THE REPLIES HAD BEEN NEGATIVE. THE INTENTIONS HAD NOT REALLY BEEN LIKE THAT; (2) THE USSR DOES NOT HAVE OVERLY FAVORABLE FEELINGS TOWARD NORTH KOREA: AND (3) IF THERE IS ANYTHING WHICH THE ROKG WISHES TO ASK THE USSR, PLEASE LET THEM KNOW THROUGH KOIVISTO. ROKG HAS BEEN MULLING OVER THIS MESSAGE AT HIGHEST LEVELS, APPARENTLY ONLY AT BLUE HOUSE AND WITH FOREIGN MINISTER AND DEPUTY FOREIGN MINISTER. THEY ARE NOW TURNING TO USG TO SEEK ADVICE AND OUR ANALYSIS OF SOVIET INTENTIONS. MINISTER KIM EXPLORED SOME OF THE POSSIBLE KOREAN RESPONSES, EXPRESSING HIS VIEW THAT DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH USSR COULD TAKE A LONG TIME, BUT INDICATING THAT TOP OFFICIALS WERE CONSIDERING SUCH OPTIONS AS MORE OPEN TRADE, KOREAN PARTICIPATION IN DEVELOPMENT, AGREEMENTS ON FISHERIES, PREPARING FOR THE 1988 OLYMPICS THROUGH AN DLYMPIC ATTACHE" OR EVEN THE EXCHANGE OF UNDFFICIAL TRADE ROKG HAS NOT LEAKED THEIR SERIOUS REPRESENTATIVES. CONSIDERATION OF THIS SOVIET INITIATIVE. IT IS BEING "TIGHTLY HELD". THEY HOPE WE WILL DO SAME AND ARE ANXIOUS FOR OUR OPINIONS. OF INTEREST IS KIM'S REQUEST

FOR MY OWN ANALYSIS AND APPROACH "AS A SCHOLAR FAMILIAR WITH THE USSR SYSTEM", WHICH IS CLEARLY EXPECTED RATHER PROMPTLY AS COMPARED WITH HIS QUERY AS TO WHAT WOULD BE THE USG APPROACH WHICH HE OBVIOUSLY EXPECTS TO TAKE LONGER. END SUMMARY

MOFA CALLED LATE THURSDAY AFTERNOON, OCTOBER 8, TO 3. REQUEST THAT I MEET AT 1730 HOURS WITH THE ACTING FOREIGN MINISTER KIM DONG WHIE. NO SUBJECT OR REASON WAS GIVEN. I WENT TO HIS OFFICE AS REQUESTED AND WE HAD A SESSION LASTING ALMOST AN HOUR IN WHICH HE REVEALED TO ME DETAILS OF THE SOVIET OVERTURE TO THE ROKG THROUGH THE FINNISH PRIME MINISTER REPORTED IN OUR CABLE OF OCTOBER 2. KIM INDICATED THAT SERIOUS DISCUSSION OF THIS IS BEING HELD AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL, THAT I SHOULD CONSIDER DUR CONVERS-ATION AS "HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL", NOTING THAT NO ONE ELSE WAS PRESENT IN THE ROOM, NOT EVEN THE USUAL SECRETARY. TWICE DURING HIS PRESENTATION, HE REFERRED TO HIS DISCUSSIONS OF THIS ISSUE WITH THE TOP PEOPLE AT THE BLUE HOUSE. HE DIVIDED HIS PRESENTATION INTO THREE PARTS, FIRST DESCRIBING THE DETAILS OF THE APPROACH, THEN GIVING THE CONTENT OF THE SOVIET MESSAGE, AND FINALLY REVEALING SOME OF THE OPTIONS WHICH THE ROKG IS CONSIDERING. KIM'S REQUEST TO ME WAS TO ASK ME TO MULL OVER THIS 4. APPROACH "AS A SCHOLAR FAMILIAR WITH THE SUVIET SYSTEM" AND OFFER MY OWN PERSONAL OPINION ON WHAT WOULD BE A SUIT-ABLE RESPONSE, AND SECOND, TO FIND OUT WHAT IS THE USG ANALYSIS AND REACTION. HE OBVIOUSLY WANTED TO MAKE CLEAR THAT IN RESPONSE TO SUCH A SOVIET INITIATIVE, THE ROKG WANTED TO BE IN FULL HARMONY WITH "OUR MOST IMPORTANT ALLY".

5. ON SEPTEMBER 9, THE FINNISH PRIME MINISTER CAME TO PRIME MINISTER NAM DUCK WOD'S HOTEL TO ACCOMPANY HIM TO THE AIRPORT. THE TWO RODE ALONE FOR 30-40 MINUTES. PRIME MINISTER KOIVISTO INDICATED THAT THE USSR HAD ASKED HIM TO CONVEY A MESSAGE TO THE ROK PM. NAM ASKED WHETHER THE SOVIETS HAD ACTUALLY AND SPECIFICALLY ASKED THIS. KOIVISTO REPLIED IN THE AFFIRMATIVE AND ADDED, "LOUDLY AND CLEARLY". THE FINNISH PM INDICATED THAT THERE WAS SOME URGENCY IN GETTING THE MESSAGE THROUGH AND STATED THAT IT WAS NOTEWORTHY THAT IT DID NOT COME FROM THE USSR FOREIGN MINISTRY BUT FROM THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF THE CP. 6. THE SOVIET MESSAGE WAS FIRST TO NOTE THAT ON NUMEROUS OCCASIONS BEFORE, WHEN THE ROKG HAD MADE APPROACHES TO THE USSR, MOSCOW HAD GIVEN A NEGATIVE ANSWER, BUT THAT THE REAL INTENTION OF THE SOVIET GOVERNMENT WAS NOT LIKE THAT. CONDITIONS HAD NOT BEEN RIGHT FOR A POSITIVE RESPONSE.

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SECOND, THE SOVIET OFFICIAL ASKED THE FINNISH PM TO TELL BT #2513 NNNN

THE KOREAN PM THAT THE USSR DOES NOT HAVE "TOO FAVORABLE" AN ATTITUDE TOWARD THE DPRK. THIRDLY, THIS HIGH RANKING CP OFFICIAL TOLD KOIVISTO TO RELAY TO NAM THE MESSAGE THAT IF THERE IS ANYTHING THE ROKG WISHES TO ASK OF THE USSR, PLEASE LET THEM KNOW (PRESUMABLY THROUGH THIS CHANNEL). 7. ACCORDING TO KIM, THE ROKG HAS BEEN MULLING OVER THIS APPROACH, AND PRESUMABLY THE FACT THAT IT IS BEING GIVEN SERIOUS CONSIDERATION IS TIGHTLY HELD. KIM INDICATED THAT NO ONE BELOW HIS LEVEL AT THE FOREIGN MINISTRY IS AWARE. COMMENT: AS OUR CABLE OF OCTOBER 2 INDICATES, OBVIOUSLY THE FACT OF THE FEELER IS QUITE WELL KNOWN SINCE MOFA DIRECTOR GENERAL OF EUROPEAN AFFAIRS TOLD OUR POLCOUNS ABOUT IT, AND UNIFICATION MINISTER LEE BUM SUK (M-R: YI POM-SOK) MENTIONED IT TO DAS O'DONOHUE. PERHAPS IT IS THE SERIOUS CONSIDERATION BEING GIVEN AND THE FACT THAT U.S. ADVICE IS SOUGHT WHICH IS CONSIDERED SO "HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL", A TERM WHICH KIM REPEATEDLY USED. END COMMENT. THE FINNISH PM ASKED NAM TO LET HIM KNOW WHAT HE SHOULD SAY TO THE USSR.

8. KIM BEGAN HIS DISCUSSION OF THE ROKG DELIBERATIONS BY NOTING THEIR APPRECIATION THAT THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ANY FORMAL DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH THE SOVIET UNION WOULD TAKE A LONG TIME, INDICATING WHAT I REGARD AS CURRENT ROKG RELATIVE SOPHISTICATION ON THE NORTH MOREAN PROBLEM AMONG MANY WESTERN TRAINED PEOPLE LIKE KIM, HE NOTED THAT A WIDE RANGE OF OPTIONS AND RESPONSES WERE OPEN FOR SEOUL. FIRST, HE POINTED OUT THERE ARE REAL POSSIBILITIES IN THE FIELD OF TRADE AND ECONOMIC ACTIVITY. HE OBSERVED THE SOVIETS HAVE TIMBER AND MINERALS IN AREAS CLOSE TO KOREA; THAT KOREAN FIRMS HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN AIDING DEVELOP-MENT PROJECTS WITH SKILLED LABOR IN THE MIDDLE EAST OF WHICH THE SOVIETS MUST BE AWARE, AND SPECULATED THAT PERHAPS AN EXCHANGE MIGHT BE WORKED OUT IN THIS FIELD.

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HE ALSO MENTIONED JAPANESE INTERESTS IN THIS SORT OF ACTIVITY.

9. A SECOND AREA WHERE KIM FELT CURRENT SLIGHT CONTACTS MIGHT BE EXPANDED LIES IN PERSONNEL EXCHANGES FOR INTER-NATIONAL CONFERENCES AND SPORTING EVENTS.

10. THIRDLY, HE NOTED THAT THE ROKG IS MOST ANXIOUS TO ENSURE THE SUCCESS OF THE 1988 SUMMER OLYMPICS WHICH THEY WILL NOW HOST AND THEY DESIRE THE PRESENCE OF SOVIET BLOC COUNTRIES. THE ROKG IS WONDERING WHETHER IT MIGHT NOT BE POSSIBLE FOR THE USSR TO ASSIGN AN "OLYMPIC ATTACHE" TO SEDUL TO HELP PREPARE FOR THE PARTICIPATION OF A SOVIET OLYMPIC TEAM.

11. A FOURTH POSSIBILITY LIES IN THE EXCHANGE OF TRADE REPRESENTATIVES, A TECHNIQUE FREQUENTLY USED WHEN GOVERNMENTS DO NOT RECOGNIZE EACH OTHER. KIM NOTED THAT THE KOREAN REPRESENTATION IN THE USSR COULD RANGE FROM A KOREAN TRADERS ASSOCIATION (KOTRA--SEMI-OFFICIAL) REPRESENTATIVE DOWN TO SETTING UP OFFICES IN MOSCOW BY SOME OF THE PRIVATE KOREAN FIRMS.

12. FINALLY, WHILE NOTING THAT THE UNITED STATES HAD GENEROUSLY INCREASED THE KOREAN FISHERIES QUOTA FOR THE COMING YEAR AND EXPRESSING AWARENESS OF SOME OF OUR CONSERVATION CONCERNS, HE WONDERED WHETHER SOME AGREEMENT MIGHT BE REACHED FOR KOREAN FISHERIES OFF KAMCHATKA AND IN OTHER NORTHERN WATERS, KIM NOTED THAT THESE ARE JUST SOME OF THE OPTIONS UNDER DISCUSSION.

13. AS "ACTING" FOREIGN MINISTER, KIM OBVOUSLY ENJOYED BEING "IN" ON THIS. HE INDICATED THE ROKG NOW WISHES TO TURN TO THE UNITED STATES FOR OUR "EXPERT" ANALYSIS OF THE SOVIET MESSAGE. WHAT ARE THE SOVIET INTENTIONS, HE ASKED. WHAT IS THE APPROACH WHICH THE U.S. GOVERNMENT WOULD TAKE? WHAT WOULD IT SUGGEST THAT ROKG DO IN RESPONSE TO THIS INITIATIVE?

14. KIM CONCLUDED BY NOTING THAT APPARENTLY THE FINNISH PRESIDENT IS VERY FEEBLE AND ILL, AND WHILE NOT LOOKING FORWARD TO THE DEATH OF KEKONNEN, IN CASE THERE WERE A FUNERAL, A HIGH RANKING ROKG OFFICIAL COULD DELIVER A MESSAGE TO KOIVISTO PERSONALLY. HE GAVE THE IMPRESSION THAT TIME IS SOMEWHAT OF THE ESSENCE IN GETTING THE VIEWS OF THE AMBASSADOR AND OF THE U.S. GOVERNMENT. COMMENT: THE DISCUSSIONS WERE CONDUCTED WITH WARMTH AND CORDIALITY AND ON A FIRST NAME BASIS, I CONSIDER THIS POSITIVE IN MANY WAYS: FIRST, THE INITIATIVE FOR CLOSE COOPERATION AND CONSULTATION OBVIOUSLY COMES FROM THE BLUE HOUSE. SECOND, I BELIEVE THE BLUE HOUSE ACCEPTS OUR PREFERENCE FOR HANDLING FOREIGN POLICY ISSUES OF THIS

SUBJECT: Your Meeting with Korean Foreign Minister Lho on October 8 at 9:30 a.m.

Shinyong Lho has been going around town beating the drums for increased American support for Korea's massive aid request from Japan. Lho has been rebuffed in each of his demarches, but being a good Korean may give it one more try with you. In response, I suggest you say:

- The US will not play the role of the ping pong ball between Japan and Korea.
- The Japanese clearly understand the need to get to know the new Korean leadership and are making genuine efforts to be accommodating.
- Both we and the Koreans wish the Japanese would move more quickly on such things as defense spending and giving larger amounts of aid, but we must be realistic in our expectations.
- We recognize and appreciate Lho's moderating role within the Korean Government in limiting the kind of anti-Japanese jingoism which could be very destructive.

On other subjects, the following points can be raised:

- We are most interested in Korea's efforts to establish more meaningful contact with North Korea.
- We urge that these efforts be kept well coordinated on the Korean side (this is a veiled reference to Johnny Sohn's efforts which appear not well coordinated).

If the President were able to drop in on this meeting, the Koreans would be ecstatic. I hope very much that the President's letter to Chun will be available for you to pass to Lho Thursday.

RECOMMENDATION

That you use the above points in your meeting with Lho.

headed the ROK Permanent Observer Mission to the UN European Office in Geneva for four years. While in Geneva, Lho specialized in North-South issues and economic affairs.

Lho has been a highly effective emissary for his country in international and bilateral forums, particularly involving the Third World. As Consul General in New Delhi (1973) and later Ambassador to India (1973-74), he cultivated a wide range of contacts, successfully worked to increase Korean-Indian trade, and demonstrated a capacity for keeping his own counsel in the negotiations leading to the establishment of diplomatic relations. In 1975, as Vice Foreign Minister, he headed special diplomatic missions to various Asian, African and Latin American capitals in an effort to

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
gain support for a favorable resolution on the Korean question in the UN General Assembly. Most recently, in November 1980, he visited West Africa as President Chun Doo Hwan's special envoy.

Early Life and Career

Lho was born in South Pyongan Province in what is now North Korea. He is a graduate of the College of Law of Seoul National University, and he earned an M.A. degree at either the University of Kentucky or Kansas State University in 1955.

Lho entered the toreign service in 1956 and held several administrative posts before being assigned as first secretary in Washington (1959-60) and Ankara (1961). As chief of the Treaty Section during 1961-62, he supervised the preparation of the South Korean draft of the US-ROK Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA). He was named to the ROK negotiating team but did not participate in the SOFA negotiations because he was reassigned as director of the Archives Bureau. Lho served as counselor in Bangkok during 1963-64 and in Rome during 1966-67. In the interim he headed the Asia Bureau, in which capacity he coordinated South Korean aid to Vietnam. In 1967 he was named director of the Office of Planning and Management at the Foreign Ministry. The following year Lho was assigned to Los Angeles, where he served for four years as Consul General.
