1. ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~ - ENTIRE TEXT

2. THERE WILL BE MUCH DETAILED REPORTING OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL DAYS ON THE ISSUES COVERED AND REACTIONS AMONG VARIOUS OFFICIAL AND PUBLIC AUDIENCES TO THE PRESIDENT'S VISIT. BUT I WANT INITIALLY TO RECORD SOME OF MY OWN OBSERVATIONS AND IMPRESSIONS REGARDING THE VISIT.

3. THE OVERALL IMPACT OF THE TRIP IS ALREADY CLEAR, AND IT HAS BEEN IN MANY WAYS QUITE REMARKABLE. IN A DAY AND A HALF THE PREVAILING IMPRESSION OF A DETERIORATING RELATIONSHIP HAS BEEN SHARPLY MODIFIED. AMONG GOC OFFICIALS IT HAS LARGELY BEEN REPLACED BY CAUTIOUS OPTIMISM. THE MEDIA HAS GENERALLY MOVED FROM PREDICTIONS OF DISASTROUS CONFRONTATION TO A GRUDGING RECOGNITION THAT THINGS SEEM TO HAVE GONE RATHER WELL, DESPITE THEIR DIRE FOREBODINGS.

4. THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THIS TRIP RESTED IN PART ON THE POWERFUL SYMBOLISM OF THIS FIRST STATE VISIT TO CANADA IN NINE YEARS, COMING AS IT DID WITHIN THE FIRST TWO MONTHS OF THE NEW ADMINISTRATION. ALSO, THE WARM AND GENUINELY FELT CEREMONIAL EXCHANGES WERE ACCOMPANIED BY SOME SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS ON ISSUES.

5. FOR EXAMPLE, THE PRESIDENT'S DIFFICULT AND COURAGEOUS DECISION TO WITHDRAW THE EAST COAST FISHERIES TREATY AND

GO FORWARD WITH THE BOUNDARY TREATY WAS A KEY ELEMENT IN THE SUCCESS WHICH WAS ACHIEVED. IT TOOK THE ISSUE HEAD ON IN AN HONEST AND STRAIGHTFORWARD WAY THAT HOLDS REAL PROMISE FOR ACHIEVING A RESOLUTION OF THIS SEEMINGLY INTRACTABLE DISPUTE. A NUMBER OF SENIOR GOC OFFICIALS HAVE ALREADY PRIVATELY EXPRESSED TO ME THEIR APPRECIATION OF THE PRESIDENT'S ACTION, WHICH ALLOWS THEM TO REGRET AND DISSOCIATE THEMSELVES FROM THE DEMISE OF THE TREATY, WHILE BEGINNING TO WORK TO BUILD A MORE CONSTRUCTIVE FISHERIES RELATIONSHIP TO THE BENEFIT OF BOTH COUNTRIES.

6. BEYOND THE FAVORABLE IMPACT ON THE PARTICULAR ISSUE, THE FISHERIES DECISION CONVEYED A SENSE OF HONESTY AND UNWILLINGNESS TO STRING CANADIANS ALONG THAT WAS GREATLY WELCOMED AND SET THE TONE FOR EXCHANGES IN OTHER AREAS.

7. THE SIGNING OF TWO AGREEMENTS DURING THE VISIT -- NORAD AND SOCIAL SECURITY -- PROVIDED A MEANINGFUL AND TANGIBLE DEMONSTRATION OF HOW AT OUR BEST WE CAN WORK TOGETHER NOT ONLY TO PROVIDE FOR OUR MUTUAL SECURITY BUT ALSO TO BETTER THE LIVES OF OUR PEOPLE. IN MY VIEW, BEYOND THE MERITS OF THE AGREEMENTS THEMSELVES, THE SYMBOLISM OF SIGNING THOSE TWO UNDERSTANDINGS IN SUCH DIFFERENT AREAS CONTRIBUTED GREATLY TO THE SUCCESS OF THE VISIT. (INTERESTINGLY, TED LEE, DIRECTOR OF THE U.S.A. BUREAU IN EXSTAFF, TELLS ME THAT THE GOC WOULD HAVE BEEN MOST RELUCTANT TO SIGN THE NORAD AGREEMENT DURING THE VISIT IF THE SOCIAL SECURITY AGREEMENT HAD NOT ALSO BEEN SIGNED.)

8. A LESS TANGIBLE, BUT HIGHLY IMPORTANT RESULT OF THE VISIT WAS THE CLOSE RAPPORT AND GOOD FEELING THAT WAS SEEN TO DEVELOP BETWEEN THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER TRUDEAU. CANADIAN AMBASSADOR TO THE UNITED STATES PETER TOWE TOLD ME DURING THE STATE DINNER THAT THE PM HAD MADE A POINT OF TAKING HIM ASIDE TO COMMENT ON HIS PLEASURE AT THE WARM AND OPEN PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP HE HAD BEEN ABLE TO ESTABLISH WITH THE PRESIDENT AND HOW MUCH HE VALUED THE STRAIGHTFORWARD AND UNDERSTANDING WAY IN WHICH THE PRESIDENT APPROACHED THE ISSUES IN THE RELATIONSHIP.

9. IN SUMMARY, I BELIEVE THIS HAS BEEN A VISIT OF MAJOR SIGNIFICANCE TO THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA. A CONSTRUCTIVE AND POSITIVE FRAMEWORK HAS BEEN LAID WHICH WILL SERVE US WELL FOR MANY YEARS TO COME AS WE SEEK WITH SENSITIVITY AND DETERMINATION TO UNDERSTAND AND DEAL WITH THE PROBLEMS THAT WILL CONTINUE TO CONFRONT US. 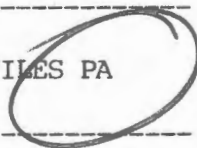

First Lady's Contribution to a Successful State Visit:

According to Charge Smith, Mrs. Reagan's presence during the Ottawa visit contributed greatly to the creation of an atmosphere of friendship and understanding on which the President's administration can build the close and sound relationship it desires with Canada. The First Lady's entire special program led to admiring comments from leading Canadians and excellent press coverage, and she was perceived by all as a warm and deeply caring person. In sum, Smith believes Mrs. Reagan clearly radiated the warm and good feelings both she and the President have for Canada and for all Canadians, and her presence was of material benefit in achieving the visit's prime purpose. 4. A LAST MINUTE POTENTIAL PROBLEM DEVELOPED IN CONNECTION WITH MRS. REAGAN'S VISIT TO THE CLIFFORD BOWEY SCHOOL. ON SUNDAY, MARCH 8TH, AN OTTAWA BOARD OF EDUCATION TRUSTEE ANNOUNCED HIS INTENT TO PRESENT A MOTION TO THE BOARD AT A MEETING SCHEDULED FOR THE EVENING OF MONDAY, MARCH 9TH, THAT THE FIRST LADY'S VISIT TO THE SCHOOL BE SCRAPPED. THE TRUSTEE INDICATED HE WAS MAKING THE MOVE TO PROTEST THE REAGAN GOVERNMENT'S PROPOSED CUTS IN SPENDING FOR EDUCATION, ITS PLANNED INCREASE IN MILITARY SPENDING AND ESPECIALLY U.S. INTERVENTION IN EL SALVADOR. ON MONDAY NIGHT THE OTTAWA BOARD OF EDUCATION OVERWHELMINGLY DEFEATED THE LONE TRUSTEE'S MOTION BY A VOTE OF 12 TO 1. THE PRESS REPORTED THAT "TRUSTEES REACTED TO THE MOTION LIKE A HOME OWNER FINDING SOMETHING BROUGHT IN BY THE CATS THEY TOUCHED IT ONLY FOR THE FEW SECONDS IT TOOK TO BURY IT". THE BOARD OF EDUCATION CHAIRMAN CONFIRMED THAT THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT REQUEST FOR MRS. REAGAN'S VISIT TO THE SCHOOL WAS HANDLED NO DIFFERENTLY THAN A REQUEST FOR A SIMILAR VISIT BY QUEEN ELIZABETH A FEW YEARS AGO.

5. THE FIRST LADY'S VISIT TO THE CLIFFORD BOWEY SCHOOL BECAME AN UNFORGETTABLE HIGHLIGHT OF HER SPECIAL PROGRAM. SHE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY CANADA'S FIRST LADY, LILLY SCHREYER, WIFE OF THE CANADIAN GOVERNOR GENERAL, EDWARD SCHREYER. MRS. WE WILL BE CONSULTING WITH ISRAEL AND EGYPT SHORTLY TO COMPOSE A LIST OF COUNTRIES THAT COULD BE ASKED TO JOIN US IN SUCH A FORCE. WE WILL NOT BE MAKING A FORMAL REQUEST UNTIL WE HAVE THEIR APPROVAL, AND I AM UNDERTAKING THIS INFORMAL CONTACT ONLY

THE TREATY PROVIDES FOR FOUR LIMITED ARMAMENT AND DEMILITARIZED ZONES TO BE ESTABLISHED, THREE IN SINAI AND ONE IN ISRAEL. IN THE EASTERNMOST ZONE IN SINAI, A UN FORCE WAS TO BE SET UP. WE HAVE KNOWN FOR SOME TIME THAT OBTAINING UN SECURITY COUNCIL AGREEMENT FOR SUCH A FORCE IS LIKELY TO BE IMPOSSIBLE OWING TO SOVIET OPPOSITION. SUBJECT: Telephone Call from Prime Minister Trudeau

The Department understands from the Canadian Ambassador that Trudeau intends to telephone you within the next few days. According to Ambassador Towe, Trudeau will want to discuss the Ottawa Summit, the timing of a US-Canada-Mexico meeting, and a possible brief visit to Washington by Trudeau in late June or early July.

Towe raised some of these issues last week with the Vice President, who sent you a memorandum on the subject.

Trudeau plans to visit Germany, France and the UK in late June to meet with Schmidt, Mitterrand and Thatcher. Details have not been settled, and arrangements will have to be made around the French legislative elections, on June 14 and 21. Trudeau would like to come to Washington after his European trip to meet briefly with you to discuss Summit issues.

It would be useful to encourage Trudeau to visit Washington. This would provide you with a first-hand reading on the views of the Europeans on the major issues at the Ottawa Summit.

You will recall that Trudeau originally developed the idea of a US-Canada-Mexico meeting during your Ottawa visit in March. He wants to discuss this with you by telephone before you meet with President Lopez Portillo next week. Both Canada and Mexico have been wary of US suggestions for closer association, and during your Ottawa visit you reassured Trudeau that your proposal for closer relations is not a threat to Canada's and Mexico's sovereignty.

Trudeau told Tom Enders ten days ago that (a) he wants the Tripartite meeting, (b) domestic sensitivities prevent him from discussing Canada-US business at it, and (c) the meeting might usefully focus on the Caribbean Basin.

I think a low-key meeting between you, Trudeau and Lopez Portillo either just before or just after the Cancun Summit in October would be useful. The meeting could help create a framework for dealing with North American issues, and would demonstrate the confidence of both Canada and Mexico in dealing with the US.

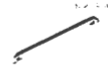

I met May 29 with Canadian Ambassador Peter Towe at his request to discuss the Ottawa Economic Summit and acid rain. He indicated that Prime Minister Trudeau would like to fly down before the Ottawa Economic Summit (July 19-21) to meet with you for about an hour to discuss the Summit. Trudeau also plans to talk to Schmidt and Mitterand prior to the Summit.

Trudeau would like to call you to set up the meeting.

We agreed that the Summit should be a general exchange of views and opportunity to build personal relationships with no goal or quota setting. He was clearly interested that the communique reflect progress, especially on North-South issues. As host, Trudeau wants the Summit to be amicable and productive. His special interest in the Third World leads him to want North-South as a centerpiece. It is indeed an important subject in light of the coming Cancun Summit, but we have taken the view that East-West economic relations is a more important focus. Economic policies also will be a key agenda item.

In addition to discussing the Summit, Ambassador Towe expressed great concern about acid rain, worrying that the U.S. is not moving quickly enough to minimize it. As you know, we have increased research funding but the Canadians want stricter enforcement of standards. I explained that we must review the Clean Air Act but that we will enforce the standards that we consider necessary.

SUBJECT: Request by Prime Minister Trudeau for Meeting (C)

Prime Minister Trudeau plans to call the President later this week to arrange a short preliminary meeting late this month or early in July before the Ottawa Summit. Trudeau plans to swing through Europe to meet with Schmidt and Mitterrand first, and then to see the President on his return. The Vice President yesterday sent a memo to the President on the subject (Tab A), and State is preparing another memo supporting the idea of a meeting. (C)

I have talked with Henry Nau, Rud Poats and Chuck Tyson on the subject. All feel that the danger of such a meeting is that Trudeau, having lobbied heavily for his North-South agenda in Europe, will be attempting to smoke it by the President. Henry was particularly concerned and preferred that we put Trudeau off. I do not feel we can do so. Rud, Chuck and I recommend that Trudeau be invited for a brief stop on his way to Europe, so the President and Vice President can make clear our preferences for the Ottawa agenda. We can either tell Trudeau on the phone we would like him to come here first in order to convey the President's regards to European leaders, or we can plead schedule. I have prepared a memo from you to the President to that effect. (C)
