

WHITE HOUSE
SITUATION ROOM

When Prime Minister Trudeau called the President on November 17, he discussed the results of his "peace initiative" to date and again raised, as he did in his October 24 letter, the possibility of meeting with the President on this matter. The President indicated, as did his reply to the Trudeau letter, that he looks forward to such a meeting "for a detailed discussion" without mentioning a date.

We recommend that the President receive Trudeau for approximately 60 minutes sometime before Christmas. A brief private visit held in the near future offers several advantages. It would enable us to hold the meeting which Trudeau has been eagerly seeking well before the start of Canada's upcoming election campaign, which may begin as early as next spring. A meeting with Trudeau early on would also enable us to avoid granting the Prime Minister a full-fledged official visit, which he has been seeking since last summer and which he feels he is owed. An official visit would be much more demanding of the President's time and also risk the appearance of our involvement in the Canadian election. Lastly, a pre-Christmas visit offers two other advantages regarding Trudeau's "peace initiative", which we have avoided criticizing publicly despite our scepticism. First, it would give the President an early opportunity to steer Trudeau away from ideas which could be especially difficult for us (such as a CDE Summit in Stockholm in January). Second, since Trudeau's initiative is poorly timed and unlikely to win strong support from the Allies, an earlier rather than a later meeting would help us avoid being blamed should his effort fail to achieve substantial results.

Subject: Brief Trudeau Meeting With The President

SITE - OADR

When Prime Minister Trudeau called the President on November 17, he discussed the results of his "peace initiative" to date and again raised, as he did in his October 24 letter, the possibility of meeting with the President on this matter. The President indicated, as did his reply to the Trudeau letter, that he looks forward to such a meeting "for a detailed discussion" without mentioning a date.

We recommend that the President receive Trudeau for approximately 60 minutes sometime before Christmas. A brief private visit held in the near future offers several advantages. It would enable us to hold the meeting which Trudeau has been eagerly seeking well before the start of Canada's upcoming election campaign, which may begin as early as next spring. A meeting with Trudeau early on would also enable us to avoid granting the Prime Minister a full-fledged official visit, which he has been seeking since last summer and which he feels he is owed. An official visit would be much more demanding of the President's time and also risk the appearance of our involvement in the Canadian election. Lastly, a pre-Christmas visit offers two other advantages regarding Trudeau's "peace initiative", which we have avoided criticizing publicly despite our scepticism. First, it would give the President an early opportunity to steer Trudeau away from ideas which could be especially difficult for us (such as a CDE Summit in Stockholm in January). Second, since Trudeau's initiative is poorly timed and unlikely to win strong support from the Allies, an earlier rather than a later meeting would help us avoid being blamed should his effort fail to achieve substantial results.

SUBJECT: Call on the President by Canadian Conservative
Leader Mulroney

We strongly recommend that the President receive, for no more than 15 minutes, Canada's new Conservative Leader and probable next Prime Minister, Brian Mulroney. Since being elected Opposition Leader earlier this year, Mulroney has consolidated his political position and now leads Prime Minister Trudeau's Liberals by more than 2 to 1 (56% to 27%) according to recent polls. Mulroney has been outspoken in his support of the US and of the President, whom he has publicly called Canada's "greatest friend." Concerning the Grenada rescue operation, he chided the Trudeau Government for not giving the US "the benefit of the doubt."

Since the President met with Trudeau on December 15, we recommend a brief White House meeting and photo opportunity for Mulroney as early as possible to avoid any appearance of US favoritism in the general election campaign that will take place sometime in 1984.

RCM HAS SEEN

We are briefing Canadian opposition leader Joe Clark tomorrow from 10:45 - 11:45 in the situation room on our overall approach to arms control questions and East-West relations. Ron Lehman and Jack Matlock will conduct the briefing and you are slated to make a drop-by around 11:30.

-- Clark, a former Prime Minister, has been designated to be the Conservative Party's expert on disarmament questions, in response to the success that Trudeau has gleaned from his peace initiatives. We want to provide Clark a substantive overview, but we are low-keying his visit to the West Wing in order to stay aloof from Canadian politics.

-- I would suggest that I come out just before you make your appearance in order to give you a sense of what issues have been covered and what you might hit on in your remarks. I would suggest that you give Clark a sense of the importance we attach to the arms control process and to an improvement in East-West relations, since Ron and Jack will probably cover the substantive issues in some depth.

-- You should be aware that we have just received a press notice that Trudeau, at a Conference in Davos attended by Ken Dam, apparently challenged American assertions that the U.S. has cut the number and megatonnage of its nuclear weapons and further charges that the U.S. would not risk nuclear war to defend Western Europe. Our response, worked out with State, refers to the official statement made by the Canadian Ministry of External Affairs that "Canada's commitment to NATO and its policies remains unchanged". We will quietly implore Clark to take the same tack while he is in the U.S.

-- Clark will be accompanied by Ambassador Gotlieb, Political Counselor Kinsman and staffer Peggy Mason.
