1. g - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. THE PRESIDENT HAS APPROVED A COURSE OF ACTION WITH RESPECT TO UNESCO WHICH INCLUDES: (A) NOTICE TO UNESCO THAT THE U.S. WILL WITHDRAW EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 1984; (B) FULL PARTICIPATION IN THE ORGANIZATION FOR THE MANDATORY ONE-YEAR NOTIFICATION PERIOD; (C) CAREFUL ATTENTION TO ANY DEVELOPMENTS IN UNESCO DURING THAT PERIOD THAT MIGHT REPRESENT SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS TOWARD MAJOR U.S. OBJECTIVES (LACK OF PROGRESS TOWARD WHICH UNDERLIES OUR DECISION TO WITHDRAW); AND (D) PRIOR NOTICE OF OUR DECISION TO THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT.

3. YOU SHOULD DELIVER MESSAGE IN PARA 8 BELO; FROM THE SECRETARY TO CHEYSSON AND DRAW ON FOLLOWING POINTS IN DISCUSSIONS OF ISSUE WITH SENIOR GOF OFFICIALS:

--THE UNITED STATES WILL WITHDRAW FROM UNESCO EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 1984; NOTICE TO THE DIRECTOR GENERAL WILL BE

GIVEN IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THIS DISCUSSION WITH YOUR GOVERNMENT.

-- THE PRESIDENT HAS DIRECTED ME TO CONSULT WITH YOU BECAUSE OF OUR RESPECT FOR YOUR ROLE AS HOST TO THE ORGANIZATION. WE RECOGNIZE THAT YOU AND WE, FOR SOME TIME, HAVE SHARED CONCERNS WITH THE POLICIES, BUDGETS, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION. YOUR INTERESTS, HOWEVER, ARE UNIQUE.

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- -- OUR DECISION IS NOT DIRECTED IN ANY WAY AT YOUR GOVERNMENT, NOR DOES IT REFLECT IN ANY WAY ON YOUR ROLE AS HOST. ON THE CONTRARY, WE APPRECIATE YOUR PATIENCE, AND THE HOSPITALITY WHICH YOU HAVE PROVIDED TO THIS IMPORTANT PART OF THE UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM. WE APPRECIATE EVEN MORE THE STEADY AND WISE HAND WHICH YOU HAVE TAKEN IN ITS AFFAIRS. OUR DECISION IS BASED ENTIRELY ON OUR ANALYSIS OF RECENT TRENDS IN THE ORGANIZATION, AND ON OUR EVALUATION OF THE POSSIBILITIES FOR CONSTRUCTIVE CHANGE AND IMPROVEMENT.
- -- WE WERE A FOUNDING MEMBER OF UNESCO, AND OUR INTERESTS THERE HAVE BEEN IMPORTANT. AT ITS BEST, UNESCO HAS BEEN A VALUABLE INSTRUMENT FOR COOPERATION IN EDUCATION, SCIENCE, CULTURE AND COMMUNICATION. AT ITS WORST, IT HAS, BY DIVERTING ITS ENERGIES TO COSTLY AND POLITICIZED ACTIVITIES, HARMED OUR INTERESTS, CRITICIZED OUR VALUES, ATTACKED FREE-MARKET ECONOMIC PRINCIPLES AND FREE FLOW OF INFORMATION, AND MIS-MANAGED ITSELF.
- -- IN THE PAST THREE YEARS, WE HAVE GIVEN UNESCO EVERY ENCOURAGEMENT AND INCENTIVE TO RID ITSELF OF ITS ANTI-WESTERN TONE AND ITS UNWILLINGNESS TO DEFEND THE IDEALS OF FREE THOUGHT AND FREE EXPRESSION UPON WHICH UNESCO WAS FOUNDED. WE HAVE URGED REFORM OF ITS EXPENSIVE AND INEFFICIENT MANAGEMENT PRACTICES. IT HAS NOT RESPONDED ADEQUATELY.
- -- ALONE AMONG UN AGENCIES, UNESCO HAS JUST PASSED A BUDGET FOR 1984-85 WHICH INCLUDES SUBSTANTIAL PROGRAM GROWTH. MOREOVER, IT CONTINUES TO PRESS FOR THE SO-CALLED "NEW WORLD INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS ORDER," WHICH DIRECTLY THREATENS THE PRINCIPLE OF FREE EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION AND A FREE PRESS. IT IS A COMFORTABLE HOME FOR PRO-SOVIET AND STATIST DEBATES AND IDEOLOGICAL POLEMICS. IT REJECTS SOUND MANAGEMENT PRINCIPLES IN FAVOR OF SELF-SERVING AND SELF-PROMOTING PROCEDURES. ALSO, IT HAS STRAYED FAR FROM ITS FOUNDING PRINCIPLES BY PROMOTING COLLECTIVE RIGHTS RATHER THAN

INDIVIDUAL HUMAN RIGHTS AND BY PERMITTING MANIPULATION OF "DISARMAMENT AND PEACE" THEMES IN ITS TECHNICAL FIELDS.

-- AGAINST THESE SIGNIFICANT AND GROWING LIABILITIES,

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UNESCO HAS LESS AND LESS TO OFFER IN ITS TECHNICAL FIELDS OF COMPETENCE.

- -- IN EDUCATION, IT PROMOTES LITERACY, STANDARDIZATION OF DEGREES, PUBLICATION OF VALUABLE INFORMATION, AND USEFUL ASSISTANCE TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN SUCH FIELDS AS TEACHER TRAINING. BUT IT INCREASINGLY ORIENTS ITS EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES TOWARD SUCH PURPOSES AS "PEACE AND DISARMAMENT," NOT AS THEY ARE LEGITIMATELY SOUGHT AFTER BY MANY PEOPLES, INCLUDING AMERICANS, BUT AS THEY ARE PROMOTED AND DISTORTED IN SOVIET PROPAGANDA.
- -- IN SCIENCE, UNESCO HAS BEEN VALUABLE,

 POLITICS HAS BEGUN TO MAKE ITSELF FELT EVEN HERE, WITH
 THE INJECTION OF SUCH CONCEPTS AS "SCIENTISTS FOR PEACE,"
 AND "SCIENTISTS FOR DISARMAMENT." THE MOST VALUABLE
 FORMS OF SCIENTIFIC COOPERATION
 IN UNESCO
 ARE A PRODUCT OF LONG-STANDING INTERNATIONAL BODIES,
 WHICH WOULD CONTINUE TO EXIST, AND WHICH WE COULD SUPPORT
 WITHOUT HOLDING UNESCO MEMBERSHIP.
- -- IN CULTURE, UNESCO HAS HELPED SAVE IMPORTANT MONUMENTS AND HISTORICAL SITES, SPONSORED USEFUL INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS IN THE COPYRIGHT FIELD, AND PROMOTED VALUABLE HISTORICAL AND CONTEMPORARY RESEARCH. BUT ITS FUNCTION IS CONTRIBUTORY, AND ITS EFFORTS DIFFUSE. THERE ARE OTHER WAYS TO ORGANIZE CAMPAIGNS TO SAVE THREATENED MONUMENTS, AND THE UNITED STATES WOULD CONTINUE TO BE A MEMBER OF THE UNIVERSAL COPYRIGHT CONVENTION, WHICH IS GENUINELY IMPORTANT, EVEN WHEN WE WERE NOT PARTICIPATING IN UNESCO.
- -- FINALLY, WITH ITS VIRTUAL ABANDONMENT OF THE CONCEPT OF A FREE FLOW OF INFORMATION, UNESCO DOES ALMOST NOTHING OF VALUE TO THE U.S. IN COMMUNICATIONS. WE WOULD SEEK TO DEVELOP MEANS OF CONTINUING OUR PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF COMMUNICATION, WHICH IS IMPORTANT.-
- -- IN SHORT, THE BENEFITS OF MEMBERHIP IN UNESCO ARE FEW, DECLINING, AND REPLACEABLE. THE COSTS--FINANCIAL AND POLITICAL--ARE LARGE AND GROWING.
- -- WE HAVE WORKED AT THE UNESCO PROBLEM FOR ALMOST THREE

YEARS, AS WE HAVE WITH THE OTHER INTERNATIONAL

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ORGANIZATIONS. SIX MONTHS AGO, WE BEGAN A THOROUGH REVIEW OF COSTS AND BENEFITS: WE SOLICITED THE VIEWS OF ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES OF GOVERNMENT, OF OUR ALLIES AND FRIENDS, AND OF THE ;U.S. PRIVATE SECTOR. OUR CONCLUSIONS NOW TAKE ACCOUNT OF THE RESULTS OF THAT REVIEW.

- -- OUR WITHDRAWAL FROM UNESCO DOES NOT PRESAGE ANY WIDER DISENGAGEMENT FROM THE UN OR ITS OTHER SPECIALIZED AGENCIES. ON THE CONTRARY, AS THE PRESIDENT MADE CLEAR AT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY LAST SEPTEMBER, WE ARE DEEPLY ATTACHED TO THE PRINCIPLE THAT GENUINE INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IS ESSENTIAL TO OUR PURPOSES IN THE WORLD, AND TO PEACEFUL PROGRESS FOR ALL.
- -- NOR DOES OUR WITHDRAWAL SIGNAL AN END TO U.S. COOPERATION IN INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION, SCIENTIFIC, CULTURAL, AND COMMUNICATIONS ACTIVITIES. HERE TOO, AS THE PRESIDENT SAID, GENUINE INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IS THE GOAL, AND WE RECOGNIZE OUR RESPONSIBILITIES IN THESE FIELDS.
- -- WE LEAVE UNESCO FAR MORE IN SADNESS THAN IN ANGER.

 OUR EVALUATION AND DELIBERATIONS WERE SERIOUS,

 OPENMINDED, BROAD-BASED. THEY EXTENDED OVER ALMOST THREE
 YEARS, WITH PARTICULAR INTENSITY IN THE SIX-MONTH POLICY
 REVIEW JUST COMPLETED.
- -- WE WILL CONTINUE AS FULL MEMBERS OF THE ORGANIZATION DURING ALL OF 1984. IT IS POSSIBLE THAT DEVELOPMENTS DURING THAT TIME WILL SUGGEST THAT THE ORGANIZATION HAS BECOME WILLING TO MAKE THE MINIMUM (BUT MAJOR) CHANGES WHICH WE HAVE SOUGHT FOR SEVERAL YEARS. THE PRESIDENT HAS DIRECTED THAT WE BE ATTENTIVE TO ANY SUCH DEVELOPMENTS. WE WILL WATCH FOR THEM CLOSELY. WE DO NOT EXPECT SUCH CHANGES, BUT NEITHER WILL WE IGNORE THEM SHOULD THEY OCCUR.
- -- WE ARE NOT SEEKING TO ENCOURAGE OTHER MEMBER STATES TO JOIN US IN WITHDRAWING. EACH MEMBER STATE MUST ASSESS ITS OWN INTERESTS IN THE ORGANIZATION, AND ACT ACCORDINGLY. FOR US, THE COSTS OUTWEIGH THE BENEFITS, AND WE ARE ACTING ON THAT CONCLUSION. OTHERS MAY FIND VALUE IN UNESCO, AND WE WISH THEM WELL. WE HAVE NO INTENTION TO DESTROY THE ORGANIZATION, OR TO DAMAGE IT; OUR PRIMARY GOAL IS TO PROTECT OUR OWN INTERESTS, NOT TO INTERFERE WITH THE INTERESTS OF OTHERS. WE HAVE IN FACT

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ADVISED THE DIRECTOR GENERAL THAT SUCH ALTERNATIVE MEANS

OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN EDUCATION, SCIENCE, CULTURE AND COMMUNICATION AS WE ESTABLISH MIGHT SERVE AS A BASIS FOR COOPERATION BETWEEN THE ORGANIZATION AND THE U.S., IF BOTH PARTIES AGREE THAT THAT IS DESIRABLE.

4. TEXT OF LETTER OF NOTIFICATION FOLLOWS FOR YOUR INFORMATION.

BEGIN TEXT.

DEAR MR. DIRECTOR GENERAL:

THE PURPOSE OF THIS LETTER IS TO NOTIFY YOU, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE II, PARAGRAPH 6 OF THE CONSTITUTION, THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL WITHDRAW FROM THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 1984.

YOU MAY BE ASSURED THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL SEEK TO MEET FULLY ALL OF ITS LEGITIMATE FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO THE ORGANIZATION ON THE DATE ITS WITHDRAWAL TAKES EFFECT.

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES, ALONG WITH THE AMERICAN PEOPLE GENERALLY, BELIEVE IN THE PRINCIPLES ENUNCIATED IN THE CONSTITUTION OF UNESCO. TODAY, AS IN THE EARLY YEARS OF THE ORGANIZATION, THESE PRINCIPLES SUMMON US TO A COMMITMENT OF EFFORT—AND RESOURCES—IN THE INTEREST OF BUILDING A STABLE AND ENDURING FRAMEWORK FOR PEACE IN THE WORLD. TODAY, AS IN THE EARLY YEARS, WE BELIEVE THAT EDUCATION, SCIENCE, CULTURE AND COMMUNICATION—ARE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS IN—BUILDING A PEACEFUL WORLD.

WHILE THE UNITED STATES CONTINUES TO DEVOTE SUBSTANTIAL RESOURCES TO THE ATTAINMENT OF THESE GOALS, IT MUST CHOOSE CAREFULLY THE PRECISE METHODS AND MEANS THROUGH

WHICH THESE RESOURCES ARE TO BE USED. THERE ARE MANY GROUPS AND ORGANIZATIONS WHOSE PURPOSES WE APPROVE, BUT WHICH ARE NOT EFFECTIVE AT CARRYING OUT THE KIND OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION THAT WILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE MAKING OF A PEACEFUL WORLD.

FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS. AS YOU KNOW FROM STATEMENTS WE

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HAVE MADE AT THE EXECUTIVE BOARD AND ELSEWHERE, WE HAVE BEEN CONCERNED THAT TRENDS IN THE POLICY, IDEOLOGICAL EMPHASIS, BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT OF UNESCO WERE DETRACTING FROM THE ORGANIZATION'S EFFECTIVENESS. WE BELIEVE THESE TRENDS HAVE LED ; UNESCO AWAY FROM THE ORIGINAL PRINCIPLES OF ITS CONSTITUTION. WE FEEL THAT THEY HAVE SERVED THE POLITICAL PURPOSES OF MEMBER STATES, RATHER THAN THE INTERNATIONAL VOCATION OF UNESCO. WE HAVE WORKED ENERGETICALLY TO ENCOURAGE THE ORGANIZATION TO REVERSE THESE TRENDS; TO REDIRECT ITSELF TO ITS FOUNDING PURPOSES; RIGOROUSLY TO AVOID BECOMING A SERVANT OF ONE OR ANOTHER NATIONAL POLICY; AND TO MANAGE ITSELF IN A WAY THAT REWARDED EFFICIENCY, PROMOTED FEARLESS PROGRAM EVALUATION, AND FOLLOWED PRIORITIES BASED ON PROGRAM VALUE RATHER THAN ON PAST HABIT, POLITICAL EXPEDIENCY, OR SOME OTHER EXTRANEOUS CONSIDERATION.

MANY OF THESE EFFORTS, YOURS AND OURS, HAVE BEEN PRODUCTIVE, AT LEAST IN RELATIVE TERMS. THE RESULTS OF THE RECENT GENERAL CONFERENCE PROVE THE POINT, AND WE APPRECIATE THE ROLE YOU PLAYED IN THE OUTCOME OF THAT CONFERENCE.

VIEWED IN A LARGER SENSE, HOWEVER, THE GENERAL CONFERENCE PROVES A DIFFERENT POINT: IF THE RESULTS OF THE CONFERENCE DEMONSTRATE THE BEST THAT CAN BE EXPECTED FROM THE ORGANIZATION AS IT IS PRESENTLY CONSTITUTED, AND AS IT PRESENTLY GOVERNS ITSELF, THERE CAN BE LITTLE HOPE FOR A GENUINE AND WHOLEHEARTED RETURN OF THE ORGANIZATION TO ITS FOUNDING PRINCIPLE.

FOR THE UNITED STATES, THAT CONCLUSION HAS BECOME INESCAPABLE. THE RESPONSIBILITY TO ACT UPON IT IS EQUALLY INESCAPABLE.

YOU, MR. DIRECTOR GENERAL, HAVE OUR ESTEEM, OUR APPRECIATION, AND OUR PLEDGE OF THE FULLEST COOPERATION TO MAKE THE YEAR INTERVENING BETWEEN THIS LETTER AND THE DATE OF OUR WITHDRAWAL AS; HARMONIOUS AS POSSIBLE. WE RECOGNIZE THAT YOU WILL CONTINUE TO DO YOUR BEST, IN THE DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH YOU OPERATE, TO MAKE UNESCO ACTIVITIES PRODUCTIVE AND RELEVANT TO THE UNMET

NEEDS OF THE WORLD.

FOR OUR PART, WE ARE CONVINCED THAT WE CAN DEVELOP OTHER

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MEANS OF COOPERATION IN EDUCATION, SCIENCE, CULTURE AND COMMUNICATION, WHICH WILL MORE CLEARLY EMBODY THE PRINCIPLES TO WHICH WE SUBSCRIBED IN UNESCO MANY YEARS AGO. WE ARE CONVINCED THAT SUCH COOPERATION NEED NOT BE DIMINISHED BY THE INJECTION OF POLITICAL GOALS BEYOND THE SCOPE OF THE COOPERATIVE ENTERPRISE, AND THAT ITS AUTHORITY NEED NOT BE WEAKENED THROUGH THE COMPROMISE OF SUCH GOALS AS INDIVIDUAL HUMAN RIGHTS AND THE FREE FLOW OF INFORMATION. IT MAY YET BE APPRECIATED THAT OUR SHARED AIMS COULD HAVE BEEN ACCOMPLISHED THROUGH ATTENTION TO THE PRINCIPLE THAT A FEW THINGS DONE WELL HAVE MORE IMPACT THAN A SUPERFICIAL EXAMINATION OF ALL THE WORLD'S ILLS.

WE PLAN TO USE THE RESOURCES WE PRESENTLY DEVOTE TO UNESCO TO SUPPORT SUCH OTHER MEANS OF COOPERATION. ANY ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS WHICH THE U.S. DEVELOPS COULD, IN PRINCIPLE, SERVE AS A BASIS FOR FUTURE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE U.S. AND UNESCO, SHOULD BOTH PARTIES FIND THAT ADVANTAGEOUS. WE WOULD BE PLEASED TO CONSIDER THAT POSSIBILITY AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME.

- 5. YOU SHOULD MAKE CLEAR TO GOF THAT WE WISH, AND EXPECT, TO BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE OUR DECISION DIRECTLY TO UNESCO. NO INDICATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE ORGANIZATION BEFORE THAT IS ACCOMPLISHED, AND WE WILL INFORM GOF PROMPTLY WHEN IT HAS BEEN.
- 6. WE WILL BE IN CLOSE TOUCH WITH GOF AS 1984 PROCEEDS, BOTH WITH RESPECT TO DEVELOPMENTS IN UNESCO, AND TO SUCH PRACTICAL PROBLEMS AS OUR WITHDRAWAL MAY PRESENT TO GOF IN THEIR ROLE AS HOST COUNTRY.
- 7. NOTE: FOR YOUR BACKGROUND AND USE ONLY IF QUERIED AS TO ANY POSSIBLE RECONSIDERATION OF U.S. DECISION.

- THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR MESSAGE OF DECEMBER 24 CONCERNING THE QUESTION OF UNITED STATES MEMBER-SHIP IN UNESCO.
- LET ME SAY AT THE OUTSET THAT WE SHARE THE IMPORTANCE WHICH YOUR GOVERNMENT ATTACHES TO THE CULTURAL MISSION WHICH UNESCO HAS BEEN CALLED UPON TO PLAY OVER MORE THAN 30 YEARS. WE ALSO VERY MUCH VALUE THE ROLE WHICH THE GOVERNMENT OF FRANCE HAS PLAYED IN UNESCO, BOTH AS HOST TO THE ORGANIZATION AND ONE OF ITS MOST ACTIVE AND INFLUENTIAL MEMBERS.
- THE UNITED STATES HAS BEEN CONCERNED FOR MANY YEARS OVER A GROWING TENDENCY ON THE PART OF UNESCO TO DEPART FROM THE PRINCIPLES ON WHICH IT WAS FOUNDED AND THE PURPOSES WHICH IT WAS CALLED UPON TO FULFILL. FOR SEVERAL YEARS, WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ACTIVELY WITH OTHER COUNTRIES TO REVERSE THIS UNACCEPTABLE TREND. GENERAL OF UNESCO.

DURING THE NEXT YEAR, THE UNITED STATES WILL REMAIN A FULL MEMBER OF UNESCO AND WILL PARTICIPATE IN ALL OF ITS ACTIVITIES, PAYING ITS FULL CONTRIBUTION TO THE ORGANIZATION'S BUDGET. WE WILL BE ATTENTIVE DURING THIS PERIOD TO ANY MEANINGFUL CHANGES IN UNESCO'S APPROACH TO ITS RESPONSIBILITIES, AND WE WILL WORK ACTIVELY WITH COUNTRIES WHICH SHARE OUR CONCERNS OVER UNESCO'S CURRENT POSTURE TO ACCOMPLISH SUCH CHANGES. - TIS DIFFICULT FOR ME TO BELIEVE THAT THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT INTENDS, WITHOUT CONSULTATION, TO WITHDRAW FROM AN INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION IN THE UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM DEDICATED TO CULTURAL MATTERS WHOSE WORK, ACHIEVED OVER MORE THAN THIRTY YEARS, IS SO WELL-RESPECTED. Ambassador Galbraith will be in Washington January 13 for one of his whirlwind consultation days. On Saturday, January 14 he travels to Annapolis at the invitation of the Governor of Maryland to participate in ceremonies celebrating the Treaty of Paris. This is the ostensible reason for arranging travel and consultations at this time. I believe he also has some campaign-related business he wants to discuss.

Galbraith has appointments (as of 1/10) with Ken Adelman, Dr. Ikle, Ed Rollins and lunch with Tony Dolan. He will also meet Chief of Protocol Roosevelt to discuss the Mitterrand state visit and his participation therein. He requested other appointments -- with Wick, Casey, NEA Asst Sec Murphy and Rumsfeld -- but all are out of town on the 13th.

With regard to his request to see Mr. McFarlane, I assume one principal reason is to touch base. It is evident that he wishes to have an independent entree to the White House and I personally believe ne would like to have the relationship with Mr. McFarlane that he apparently had with Judge Clark. You will recall that Galbraith asked to see McFarlane when he was last in town just before Thanksgiving; it was not possible to work out an appointment because Mr. McFarlane was leaving for California with the President.

On issues, the Middle East is very much on Galbraith's mind and without providing any specifics, he has confirmed that he wants to discuss this general subject with Mr. McFarlane. It's possible that he might raise the same point he did with Admiral Poindexter -- that too many special channels are operating with the French that in effect can serve to cut the Ambassador out of the primary communications network. Two possible examples: whether there was (or wasn't) military-to-military notification and/or coordination on the recent French redeployments; what are the extent of military-to-military consultations on the Iran-Iraq situation (if any) and Gulf security (which the French have just agreed to as Embassy Paris is aware).

On January 3 President Mitterrand drew Galbraith aside at a reception and indicated a desire to have a "brainstorming" session with the US on Lebanon. (Galbraith's reporting message was slugged for McFarlane as well as for Secretary Shultz, see Paris NODIS 217). As of the evening of January 9 there was some prospect that Rumsfeld might stop in Paris (and elsewhere) enroute back from the Mideast. (PS: Please protect me as the source of this info since I am not certain all the pertinent clearances had been worked out and have not heard where this idea stands today.)

Mr. McFarlane may wish to ask Galbraith for his assessment of where the French are heading in Lebanon. We are currently in the throes of trying to schedule an MNF meeting in Stockholm and are having problems getting time on Cheysson's calendar. We are not certain whether this is really a scheduling problem or whether the French are beginning a distancing game, as with the the Contact Group. We should have a clearer idea by Friday on this score.

Finally, since Galbraith has indicated a desire to consult on the Mitterrand state visit, Mr. McFarlane may wish to probe his thoughts on positive initiatives, etc. We will be doing that here in our talks with Amb. Galbraith.



Larry, I have gone over Van's cable, the State cable on non--proliferation and my cable to Saulnier and for the life of me I don't see anything inconsistent with the two cables. I guess it is just Van's pique at not knowing about the cable. What Van needs to understand is that periodically we will want to call Saulnier's attention to issues that are being discussed in other channels to indicate to the Elysee that the White House is interested enough in a topic to call it to their attention directly. We will not initiate or negotiate anything in this private channel that State doesn't know about. I thought I had made that clear to Van on his last trip here. Van did not raise the issue with Bud when he met with him last week. Bud agrees with my assessment of the situation. As I told you on the phone earlier today, I believe I straightened out any misunderstanding that might have existed with Saulnier over our failure to join in the Lebanon raid. He does not view that as a problem. (S)

- 1. There are objections in Paris to the American suggestion for a multilateral meeting so near in the future.
- 2. We feel that such a meeting must be preceded by a bilateral meeting between Ambassadors Kennedy and Martin in order to avoid the risks pointed out in the letter from President Kitterrand.
- 3. Reports indicate that this meeting between Kennedy and Enrich is contemplated for sometime around mid-January. I believe it would be most desirable if it could take place then.
