Further to my letter and our telephone conversation last week on the unitary taxation issue, I am sending the original of the letter from Prime Minister Trudeau to the President, together with a copy of our Diplomatic Note presented to State Department last week on the circumstances involving Alcan Aluminum Limited.

As I mentioned earlier, concern about this issue is still mounting in the Canadian business community and accordingly so is its prominence on our list of matters requiring bilateral management.

SUBJECT: Follow-up to Stoessel Mission to Europe on Soviet Human Rights Performance

As part of the follow-up to the July 4 -14 Stoessel Mission to Europe to discuss Soviet human rights performance, Assistant Secretary Abrams will be travelling to Ottawa October 12 - 13 to continue these exchanges with Canadian Government officials. Specifically, Abrams will seek to encourage continued Canadian support on this matter and to discuss possible U.S.-Canadian joint steps we might take in the short-term in order to keep European attention focused on Soviet human rights abuses.

At Tab II is a memorandum from State recommending that Assistant Secretary Abrams carry a letter from the President to Prime Minister Trudeau (Tab A) which thanks the Canadians for their assistance in making the July Stoessel Mission a success, and suggests continued exchanges on this matter. A memorandum to the President is attached at Tab I. A response is needed by Monday, October 10. Speechwriters and State have cleared text.
