● To honor U.S. Drug Enforcement agent Enrique Camarena Salazar, who was killed in the line of duty in Mexico in March, the students of his hometown high school in Calexico, Calif., formed the "Enrique Camarena Club" dedicated to combating drug abuse. Some 200 students have written a charter, pledging to stay away from drugs, support friends who are hooked and want to quit, and education programs—and sent off the charter to the White House. Yesterday, President and Nancy Reagan became members by signing the charter and sent it back to the school.
