- o Picture drawn of flowers, trees, birds with message: "I hope you get better soon so you can enjoy everything you see."
- o Color drawing of four leaf clover with message: "Here is a four leaf clover to bring you good luck."
- o From a little girl, Dreama Whitt, "I bet if you eat a lot of jelly beans, some of your pain will go away."
- o From Nashua, NH, a class sent large poster which is artwork of a big American flag. Along white stripes, each child wrote a message. One from girl named Kathy, "It was not nice to have this happen to you." From a boy named Matthew, "I love you, Mr. President."
- o A four-foot long class project from Arago School, Myrtle Point, Oregon, a picture of a man holding a rope, and students as stick men with the school pictures attached as heads. Message reads: "Hang in there, Mr. President."
- O A hall way divider: "To President Reagan, the U.S. Congressional Pages would like to wish you a speedy and successful recovery." with 102 signatures.
- o Mrs. Reagan today is taking with her to the hospital a photograph that Bob Hope sent. It's a picture of him and Jill St. John in bunny costumes and he writes: "Dear Pres, If you need us for the White House lawn at Easter, call Central Casting."
