#### STATE VISIT BY PRESIDENT REAGAN TO SPAIN

In planning the itinerary of the forthcoming state visit by President Reagan on May 8-10, 1985, encouraging the growth of the private sector in Spain should be high on the President's agenda. This point was underscored in discussions on January 30, 1985, between Dr. Richard L. Lesher, President of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and Mr. Jose Maria Cuevas, President of the leading Spanish employers' organization the Confederacion Espanola de Organizaciones Empresariales (CEOE).

The state visit offers an excellent opportunity for the President personall, to make the case for the benefits of the free enterprise system to the Spanish public. This would be a valuable contribution to a country living under a socialist government with a minimal commitment to the private sector. (One significant index of the current neglect of the private sector by the Gonzales government is the sharp limitations on capital available to the private sector from the state controlled banking sector.) Furthermore, as a result of the domination of education and the communication media by the socialist government, the Spanish public is being systematically exposed to anti-private enterprise views.

The Spanish business leadership fears that the visit by President Reagan would be misrepresented by the Gonzales government as an endorsement of current socialist government policies in Spain. The Gonzales government has systematically sought to portray itself as the true friend of free enterprise, a claim that is strongly refuted by the Spanish business community.

Officials planning President Reagan's visit to Spain should give careful consideration to three actions that would help to insure that the President's trip gives maximum support to those forces in Spain seeking to strengthen the free enterprise system:

- 1. President Reagan should devote a major public address while in Spain to the basic principles of a free economy upon which the U.S. government believes healthy economic, social and political progress must be based. Ar. Cuevas has pledged the full efforts of his organization to arranging an appropriate platform for the President.
- 2. U.S. government support for substantial additional measures to encourage development of the private sector should be highlighted in the President's discussions with Spanish leaders. The so-called "pragmatic" character of the Gonzales government should not be permitted to obscure the heavy constraints which Spanish government policy continues to place upon the private sector in Spain. The capital markets are one concrete illustration.

3. As planning for the President's schedule proceeds, every opportunity should be made to support advocates of free enterprise in Spain, such as the Spanish employers' organization (CEOE) headed by Mr. Cuevas. In the judgment of the U.S. Chamber, the CEOE is providing vigorous, effective leadership to the business community in Spain and should be involved wherever appropriate during the President's visit.

There is no need to read the attached cable, but it reports that the French government may have made a policy decision to cut military aid to Africa (the fact that the info comes from Africa rather than Paris only increases its reliability, since we often get the first indication from irate French officers in the boonies talking out of school). The report, from a French captain who coordinates military aid programs in Niger, and who had just returned from a French milatt conference in Paris, states:

- -- All ongoing French military assistance programs in Africa would be affected; and
- -- That "agrement" had been reached with the Americans and West Germans to take up the slack.


We have been reviewing possible responses to the New Zealand port access ban. This consideration has taken place within the following parameters: New Zealand remains a friend but one that has changed the operational character of its military participation within the ANZUS alliance. Accordingly, we have indicated that, in response, we will have to reassess our cooperation with New Zealand under ANZUS. We have indicated that we are not seeking retribution, for example, by punishing New Zealand through imposition of economic sanctions.

The measures we propose are unlikely in and of themselves to move the GNZ to change its policy. They will, however, demonstrate that our security relationship with New Zealand has changed -- a message that will have political significance within New Zealand. Reduced security cooperation will also send a substantial signal to others in areas where maintenance of defense collaboration with the United States is deemed more essential than is the case in New Zealand.

Our strategy is to take measures that will create incentives and public sentiment in New Zealand for a change in the GNZ's position, while decreasing the attractiveness of emulating the port ban in other, more critical areas.

- Our principal objective is to demonstrate that New Zealand cannot enjoy the benefits of a good ally without complying with necessary responsibilities.
- o This would hopefully reinforce other allied governments, like Australia, that cooperate with us and face challenges from anti-nuclear elements.

At the same time, we want to leave the door open to allow a New Zealand return to the fold. We do not want to give way to petulance, thereby: (a) spoiling prospects for an eventual New Zealand policy reversal under either the current or a future government, (b) giving Lange ammunition to cast us as a "heavy", (c) upsetting our far more important relationship with Australia, and (d) encouraging a backlash against us and cooperating governments in third countries.

We have already taken the following actions:

- Cancellation of ANZUS exercise Sea Eagle (planning is proceeding for a bilateral exercise with Australia).
- Cancellation of four small ANZUS-related exercises or meetings beginning this week.
- Restructuring without New Zealand participation of two multilateral exercises.
- Cancellation of visit to New Zealand by Army Chief of Staff Wickham.
- Cancellation of visit to CINCPAC by New Zealand Parliamentary Defense Committee.

We now intend to move forward with the following additional actions:

1. Elimination of ANZUS-related military exercises during 1985 involving New Zealand, seeking where possible to substitute bilateral activities with Australia. Vacating of exchange slots held by New Zealand military personnel at the end of their tour (without terminating programs). Reduction in the level of U.S. military representation in regional activities in New Zealand. Restructuring, when feasible, of multilateral defense activities involving New Zealand. (See Tab 1 for specific recommended actions.)

- 3. Postponement of this year's ANZUS Council and ANZUS Officials' meetings. We would hold a U.S.-Australia bilateral consultation in July, but only if the GOA agrees to cancel the ANZUS Council jointly with us.
- 4. Review our public declaratory posture on alliance commitments to New Zealand. We will probably want to indicate in some way that U.S. willingness to perform its treaty obligations to New Zealand is subject to some question given the GNZ's failure to fulfill its alliance responsibilities. The precise formulation must be studied carefully because of implications for other alliance relationships. We can be deliberate with regard to the timing of this potentially dramatic move.

### The United States Military Relationship with New Zealand

The President has approved the following policy guidelines in adjusting the United States military relationship with the Government of New Zealand, in the wake of their refusal to allow access to their ports for the USS Buchanan. The Defense Department is directed:

- -- to cancel all bilateral military exercises scheduled with New Zealand for 1985, not schedule any new ones, and eliminate New Zealand participation from ANZUS exercises; (S)
- -- indefinitely postpone all scheduled visits by the New Zealand military officials to the U.S. and visits by U.S. military officials to New Zealand; (S)
- where New Zealand military personnel occupy billets on duty with U.S. forces, or U.S. military personnel are on duty with New Zealand forces, not to replace the personnel when their tours of duty are completed; (S)
- -- to defer Foreign Military Sales to New Zealand for the present. (S)

#### The United States Military Relationship with New Zealand

The President has approved the following policy guidelines in adjusting the United States military relationship with the Government of New Zealand, in the wake of their refusal to allow access to their ports for the USS Buchanan. The Defense Department is directed:

- -- to cancel all bilateral military exercises scheduled with New Zealand for 1985, not schedule any new ones, and eliminate New Zealand participation from ANZUS exercises; (S)
- -- indefinitely postpone all scheduled visits by the New Zealand military officials to the U.S. and visits by U.S. military officials to New Zealand; (S)
- -- where New Zealand military personnel occupy billets on duty with U.S. forces, or U.S. military personnel are on duty with New Zealand forces, not to replace the personnel when their tours of duty are completed; (S)
- -- to defer Foreign Military Sales to New Zealand for the present. (S)

Response to New Zealand Port Ban

We have been reviewing possible responses to the New Zealand port access ban. This consideration has taken place within the following parameters: New Zealand remains a friend but one that has changed the operational character of its military participation within the ANZUS alliance. Accordingly, we have indicated that, in response, we will have to reassess our cooperation with New Zealand under ANZUS. We have indicated that we are not seeking retribution, for example, by punishing New Zealand through imposition of economic sanctions.

The measures we propose are unlikely in and of themselves to move the GNZ to change its policy. They will, however, demonstrate that our security relationship with New Zealand has changed -- a message that will have political significance within New Zealand. Reduced security cooperation will also send a substantial signal to others in areas where maintenance of defense collaboration with the United States is deemed more essential than is the case in New Zealand.

Our strategy is to take measures that will create incentives and public sentiment in New Zealand for a change in the GNZ's position, while decreasing the attractiveness of emulating the port ban in other, more critical areas.

- Our principal objective is to demonstrate that New Zealand cannot enjoy the benefits of a good ally without complying with necessary responsibilities.
- o This would hopefully reinforce other allied governments, like Australia, that cooperate with us and face challenges from anti-nuclear elements.

O At the same time, we want to leave the door open to allow a New Zealand return to the fold. We do not want to give way to petulance, thereby: (a) spoiling prospects for an eventual New Zealand policy reversal under either the current or a future government, (b) giving Lange ammunition to cast us as a "heavy", (c) upsetting our far more important relationship with Australia, and (d) encouraging a backlash against us and cooperating governments in third countries.

We have already taken the following actions:

- Cancellation of ANZUS exercise Sea Eagle (planning is proceeding for a bilateral exercise with Australia).
- Cancellation of four small ANZUS-related exercises or meetings beginning this week.
- Restructuring without New Zealand participation of two multilateral exercises.
- o Cancellation of visit to New Zealand by Army Chief of Staff Wickham.
- Cancellation of visit to CINCPAC by New Zealand Parliamentary Defense Committee.

We now intend to move forward with the following additional actions:

1. Elimination of ANZUS-related military exercises during 1985 involving New Zealand, seeking where possible to substitute bilateral activities with Australia. Vacating of exchange slots held by New Zealand military personnel at the end of their tour (without terminating programs). Reduction in the level of U.S. military representation in regional activities in New Zealand. Restructuring, when feasible, of multilateral defense activities involving New Zealand. (See Tab 1 for specific recommended actions.)

- Without terminating program, vacate billets of New Zealand personnel serving with DoD components/agencies at the end of their of normal tour.
- Without terminating program, vacate billets of U. S. personnel serving with New Zealand Armed Forces at end of normal tour.
