



AIDE-MEMORIE

The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985, passed by the House of Representatives in the last session of Congress, contains a provision which requires, with certain exception, that all of the offshore oil platforms and other structures installed on the outer continental shelf of the United States be built in the United States from articles, materials, or supplies at least 50 percent of which, by cost, are of U.S. origin. This legislation will again be considered by the House and Senate conferees during the next session of Congress.

If enacted into law, this provision will constitute a clear violation of the obligations of the United States under Article III of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) to treat imported products no less favorably than products of U.S. origin. Officials of the U.S. Administration, including Ambassador Yeutter, have acknowledged that this provision is unlawful under GATT and have strongly opposed it on this basis as well as others. The Government of the Republic of Korea hopes that these officials will strongly recommend that President Reagan veto this legislation if it is presented to him, and thus avert serious damage to U.S.-Korean economic relations.

The Government of the Republic of Korea is constrained to note that, if this legislation is enacted, Korea will reserve all its rights under the GATT on this matter.
