Gaston: FYI.

Donna Proctor in Judge Clark's office transferred a call here from Fred Cloud, who was calling from Nashville and who is Director of the Metropolitan Human Relations Commission in Tennessee.

He was calling to express his concern about the issuing of a sales license this past Wednesday or Thursday by Commerce to sell 500 shock batons for the use of the Korean police.

He has taught in Korea in the past several years, knows some of the past and present VIPs in Korea. He thinks the impact of the sales license will impact negatively in the US, that it is a violation of 502B of the Foreign Assistance Act. He urges NSC intervention that this not be carried out by the Commerce Department.

He understands there have been 50 to 60 calls to the White House on this topic. The story was carried by UPI on Sunday.

He has called the offices of Senator Baker, Elizabeth Dole (who referred him to Clark's office; and his Congressman's office (Bonner).

OVER.

I listened to him giving his examples of human rights violations by the Koreans. He advises he has just returned from a Human Rights Conference and that this item (shock batons) was not on the agenda.

(I asked him if he had called State. He said no, that they were against the license to the Koreans. I asked if he was going to call them to give them his support; he said no because they were against the granting of the license.)

I asked if he was asking you to return his call. He said that it would not be necessary if I understood what he had said. When I told him I had, he asked only that his message be given to you.

Dear Secretary Baldrige:

We are writing to you in reference to the recent decision by the Department of Commerce to authorize sale to South Korea of electric shock batons for crowd control, which can also be used for interrogation and torture. We would like to register our strongest concern over this action, and to request that you personally reconsider it before it is carried out.

The well-documented history of human rights violations in the Republic of Korea raises the serious risk that riot control equipment of this kind would be used in the persecution and torture of Koreans pursuing the expression of their political views in ways we would regard as legitimate.

We take this issue very seriously, and would accordingly appreciate learning the results of your review as well as the criteria upon which it was based, including the views of the Department of State and other agencies.

DRAFT LETTER

Dear Mr. Kim:

Regarding your recent inquiry about the legal status of the Republic of Korea's Peaceful Unification Policy Advisory Committee (ROK/PUPAC): foreign governments may legally establish consultative bodies and similar organizations in the United States, and appoint U.S. residents as members, so long as the organizations and their members comply with the requirements of the Foreign Agents Registration Act and other relevant laws and regulations. The ROK/PUPAC, which to our knowledge has no office, staff, or organized program of activities in the U.S., apparently does not meet the criteria for an organization required to register under the Foreign Agents Registration Act. We have referred the matter to the Department of Justice for an authoritative determination.

As I mentioned over the phone the other day, there is a new organization called "Advisory Council for Peaceful Unification Policy for Korea", the exact name may be somewhat different.

Above named organization was formed in Seoul, Korea on June 5, 1981 in accordance with the Article 68 of Korean Constitution for the purpose of advising the President of Korea for "Peaceful Unification Policy" as an independant constitutional body. The chairman of the body is the President of Korea (CHUN, Doo Hwan) and it's executive director is the Minister of Unification Ministry.

About two weeks ago, there was two-day seminar and formation of "Branch" of the organization in Washington, D. C. attended by former Prime Minister of Korea and Korean Ambassador Lew, Byung Heon and other high ranking Korean government officials. About 32 members were appointed by the officials as the council member of Washington Branch.

This formation of Washington Branch caused some unfavorable reaction among the American-Korean residents in this area.

The main questions are:

- 1) Is it legal to establish foreign government branch in Washington, D.C. or other cities outside of the foreign embassy?
- 2) Is it legal to appoint residents to be member of foreign government organization by that government?
- 3). Should the residents who accepted the appointment register with the Department Justice for Foreign Agent?

I would appreciate if you could check this with State Department and let me know. I have feeling that the Korea Desk at the State Department would have some information on this subject.
