"A 1984 business contract on file with the Justice Dept's foreign agents' registration unit showed the Sandinistas agreed to pay \$164,870 a year to a New York firm, Agendas International, to conduct a public relations campaign aimed at the American media. Agendas' officials said Nicaragua actually pays \$23,032 a month, or \$276,384 a year. Owners Donald Casey and Darryl Hunt are former Maryknoll priests who developed the Sandinista connection through Nicaraguan Foreign Minister Miguel D'Escoto, also a Maryknoll priest. 


