Here's where we stand:

1. Concept Paper - agency comments have been worked in (they were minor. OSD wants to downplay the meeting to such an extent that it is but one point on a continuum. I have finessed the point, since I think some of their comments cross the line into setting up the conditions for failure at the meeting. I have a cover memo from you to RCM, asking his blessing on the concept paper, and promising that an action plan to flesh this out will be available ASAP. Steve Steiner chaired the first meeting of the Public Diplomacy Sub Committee on Friday, 8/30. The concept paper was discussed, and agencies asked to provide comments by COB 9/2. All complied. The revised concept paper will be available for distribution to the group once approved by RCM. EUR/SOV was asked to draft "public themes" on the November meeting, which they will submit shortly (possibly this afternoon, I can't confirm). One major action item: Bud has spoken to Larry Speakes about offering the Soviet and East European press an interview(s) with the President. I do not know whether the offer was already made publicly at this morning's press briefing, or whether it still needs to be staffed. At any rate, this is one we will want to pursue quickly.

2. Action Plan - per discussions with Korengold, we plan to have an action plan drafted by COB Friday, which we will run through the Public Diplomacy subcommittee on Monday, 9/9, asking for agency comments/fixes by COB Tuesday. A revised action plan will then be ready for the CC meeting next Wednesday. Bud is prepared to talk about the action plan at this afternoon's meeting.

3. Schedule of Fall Publications -
