I. PURPOSE

To exchange views on the Soviet Union with Mrs. Massie following the Moscow Summit.

II. BACKGROUND

You have met with Suzanne Massie three times earlier this year, most recently on May 17 together with six other experts on the Soviet Union. Today's luncheon will provide you and the First Lady an opportunity to discuss the impressions you gained about the Soviet Union during the recent Moscow Summit and to compare notes with Mrs. Massie.

Mrs. Massie visited the USSR again immediately following the Moscow Summit, mainly to attend the celebrations commemorating the Christian Millenium. In addition to her activities in the religious area, she also renewed her many contacts among the Soviet intellectual and cultural elite, and had a unique visit to a Don Cossack village more than a thousand miles from Moscow.

Mrs. Massie will want to discuss with you and Mrs. Reagan her latest activities and conclusions about the current Soviet scene -- especially how Gorbachev's reforms are encouraged, furthered, or opposed by various elements of the population. She will probably have collected anecdotes about the Summit and may have interesting post-Summit perceptions from Soviet citizens about you, the First Lady, and America. Most especially, however, she will be interested in what you and Mrs. Reagan have to say -- about your meetings with students, writers and artists, and other Soviet citizens, your visits to special places -- especially the Kremlin, the Danilov Monastery, and Leningrad -- and your thoughts about Gorbachev and his policies.

Dear Mr. President,

First I want to thank you for the wonderful surprise and joy of your call when I returned from the Soviet Union three weeks ago! You are so very thoughtful and and you touched me deeply. To tell the truth, my spirits were really sagging that day when I came back to face nothing but problems. Your call filled me with new energy and hope and made me feel it wasn't time to throw the towel in just yet! Thank you so much

I said I would let you know when I was coming down toward Washington, and about a week ago General Powell called to ask. I will have to spend some days in Boston and New York from July 30 through August 5. If your schedule should permit it, the best time for me to come to Washington would be August 1st or 2nd. Based on my most recent trip to the Soviet Union there are quite a few things-- as well as some suggestions for the future, that I would like to talk over with you at slightly greater length than is possible in a brief formal meeting. Would there be any chance that you could accord me a lunch? Is there any chance that Mrs. Reagan might join us as she has on occasions in the past? That would indeed be wonderful.

I hope you have had a restful, happy vacation on the ranch -- along with some good riding. I am very much looking forward to seeing you. With every good wish to you and Mrs. Reagan as always,
