SUBJECT: CANADIAN RETALIATION OVER SHAKES AND SHINGLES HITS USDOLS ONE BILLION IN U.S. EXPORTS

SUMMARY

1. QUICKLY FOLLOWING THE U.S. REFUSAL TO COMPENSATE CANADA FOR OUR "ESCAPE CLAUSE" DUTY INCREASE ON SHAKES AND SHINGLES, THE GOC ANNOUNCED A RETALIATION PACKAGE FOCUSING ON: BOOKS, COMPUTER PARTS AND SEMICONDUCTORS, AND MISCELLANEOUS TARIFF ITEMS. WHILE THE CANADIAN TARIFF INCREASES WILL AFFECT COOLS 1.4 BILLION IN U.S. EXPORTS, THE TOTAL VALUE OF NEW DUTIES IMPOSED WILL AMOUNT TO CDOLS 79.4 MILLION ANNUALLY. THE GOC ESTIMATES THE NEW U.S. 35 TARIFF ON CANADA'S CDOLS 233 MILLION IN EXPORTS OF SHAKES AND SHINGLES WILL AMOUNT TO NEW DUTIES OF CDOLS 79.8 MILLION. EXTAFF AND FINANCE OFFICIALS ARGUE THAT THE RETALIATION PACKAGE WAS TAILORED TO MEET THE U. S. / CANADIAN BILATERAL SAFEGUARDS AGREEMENT, BOTH IN TERMS OF USING NEW DUTIES COLLECTED AS THE BASIS FOR COMPENSATORY WITHDRAWALS, AND IN TERMS OF USING A THREE-YEAR AVERAGE TRADE AS THE BASE PERIOD. THEY FURTHER ASSERT THAT, WHILE A BROADER SWEEP OF U.S. TRADE WILL FACE A SOMEWHAT HIGHER, BUT MANAGEABLE, TARIFF, THE U.S. ACTION IS HIGHLY CONCENTRATED IN ITS GEOGRAPHIC AND ECONOMIC IMPACT. REFTEL ADDRESSED THE POLITICAL BACKOROP WHICH LED THE PH TO TAKE THIS HARDLINE POSITION. SEPTEL WILL CONVEY EMBASSY

SUGGESTIONS ON HOW WE MIGHT MANAGE THE SITUATION. MEANWHILE. EVEN THE OPPOSITION SEEMS TO BE COMING TO ITS SENSES. WITH CALLS FOR FURTHER BILATERAL CONSULTATIONS TO HALT FANNING THE FLAMES OF A TRADE WAR. END SUMMARY.

CANADA ANNOUNCES RETALIATION

2. AS EXPECTED, THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCED ON JUNE 2 ITS REJALIATION PACKAGE OVER THE U.S. SECTION 281 "ESCAPE CLAUSE" ACTION ON RED CEDAR SHAKES AND SHINGLES. CANADA HAS INCREASED DUTIES ON A RANGE OF "UNBOUND" ITEMS (I.E., TARIFFS WHICH CAN BE RAISED WITHOUT A LEGAL OBLIGATION UNDER THE GATT TO COMPENSATE SUBSTANTIAL SUPPLIER COUNTRIES). THESE INCREASES WILL TAKE EFFECT, JUNE 6, THE SAME DAY THE U.S. UNBOUND TARIFF ON RED CEDAR SHAKES AND SHINGLES IS RAISED TO 35 PERCENT. WHILE THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT CAN INCREASE DUTIES IMMEDIATELY BY ORDER IN COUNCIL ON BOOKS, COMPUTER PARTS, SEMICONDUCTORS AND TEA BAGS, THE REMAINING "MISCELLANEOUS" ITEMS REQUIRE" PARLIAMENTARY APPROVAL OF LEGISLATION. NEVERTHELESS. BY TABLING A "NOTICE OF WAYS AND MEANS MOTION" BEFORE THE HOUSE. THE CANADIANS NOW HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO BEGIN COLLECTING THESE DUTIES ON JUNE 6, UNTIL THE LEGISLATION PASSES (A FOREGONE CONCLUSION UNDER THE PARLIAMENTARY SYSTEM).

CALCULATION BASIS OF RETALIATION

3. TOTAL CANADIAN EXPORTS OF RED CEDAR SHAKES AND SHINGLES, COVERED UNDER U.S. ESCAPE CLAUSE ACTION IMPOSING A 35 PERCENT DUTY, AMOUNTED TO CDOLS 233

MILLION IN 1985 (NOT COOLS 250,000 MILLION INDICATED BY GOC EARLIER, WHICH INADVERTENTLY INCLUDED WHITE CEDAR SHAKES AND SHINGLES FROM EASTERN CANADA). THE YEARLY LEVELS OF CANADIAN RED CEDAR SHAKES AND SHINGLES EXPORTS TO THE U.S. FOR THE 1983-85 PERIOD, IN MILLIONS OF CDOLS, WERE: 211, 239 AND 233, RESPECTIVELY. THIS YIELDS AN ANNUAL AVERAGE OF CDOLS 228 HILLION ACCORDING TO STATISTICS CANADA DATA, AND CONSTITUTES THE BASE PERIOD FOR THE CANADIAN RETALIATORY PACKAGE. WE UNDERSTAND THESE NUMBERS DIFFER SOMEWHAT FROM U.S. TRADE DATA.

4. THE GOC PACKAGE WAS CALCULATED ON AN "EXTRA DUTIES COLLECTED" BASIS, WHICH THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT ARGUES BT

THE CANADIANS WOULD BE ENTITLED TO DO UNDER GATT LE THE U.S. DUTY INCREASE HAD BEEN ON A "BOUND" ITEM. EXTAFF ALSO ARGUES THAT THE 1984 U.S./GOC BILATERAL SAFEGUARDS UNDERSTANDING CLEARLY PROVIDES IN ARTICLE 12 (A) THAT "COMPENSATION OR SUSPENSION OF SURSTANTIALLY FOULVALENT CONCESSIONS WILL BE FOUAL TO THE ADDITIONAL DUTIES LIKELY TO BE COLLECTED DUE TO THE TARIFF INCREASE." AS ONE OFFICIAL WHO NEGOTIATED THE UNDERSTANDING FOR THE GOC NOTED, THIS PROVISION WAS INCLUDED BY BOTH SIDES BECAUSE OUR BILATERAL DISPUTES OVER THE LEVEL OF TRADE IMPAIRMENT FROM PAST GATT ARTICLE 19 ACTIONS HAD "EFFECTIVELY PRECLUDED CONCLUDING ANY AGREEMENT ON COMPENSATION IN LIVING MEMORY." THE GOC RETALIATION PACKAGE USES THE THREE-YEAR BASE PERIOD NOTED ABOVE, ALSO IN CONFORMITY WITH THE BILATERAL SAFEGUARDS UNDERSTANDING. THE GOC PACKAGE IS NOT DIGRESSIVE (FOR NOW) SINCE THE GOVERNMENT ASSUMES THIS ENTIRE ISSUE WILL BE SUBSUMED IN TARIFF ELIMINATIONS UNDER THE US/CANADIAN BILATERAL TRADE NEGOTIATIONS OVER THE NEXT EIGHTEEN MONTHS.

5. ANNUAL CANADIAN EXPORTS AFFECTED, USING THE BASE PERIOD CALCULATION, ARE CDOLS 228 MILLION. THE GOC COMPUTED INCREASED DUTIES OF 35 PERCENT ON THIS BASE TO ARRIVE AT THE 'NEW DUTIES COLLECTED' OF CDOLS 79.8 MILLION, ON WHICH THEY BASED THEIR RETALIATION

PACKAGE. THE GOC FOCUSED THEIR RETALIATION ON THE 35 PERCENT U.S. TARIFF IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRST 30 MONTHS. HOWEVER, THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT WILL REVIEW ITS MEASURES IN LIGHT OF INTERIM DISCUSSIONS WITH THE USG ON SHAKES AND SHINGLES OR AT THE TIME OF THE USG 38-MONTH REVIEW. THE CANADIANS WILL SCALE DOWN OR PHASE OUT THEIR MEASURES TO MIRROR U.S. ACTION.

- 6. IN CONVERSATIONS WITH DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND WITH EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, EMBASSY TRADE POLICY DFFICER ARGUED THAT TRADE IMPAIRMENT WOULD HAVE BEEN A FAIRER AND MORE BALANCED APPROACH SINCE THIS WAS NOT A BOUND ITEM REQUIRING COMPENSATION UNDER THE GATT, TO WHICH OUR SAFEGUARDS UNDERSTANDING WAS PRIMARILY DIRECTED. EMBOFF ALSO ARGUED THAT U.S. ACTION ONLY AFFECTED CDOLS 233 MILLION IN CANADIAN EXPORTS, WHILE THE GOC PACKAGE WILL AFFECT APPROXIMATELY COOLS 1.4 BILLION IN U.S. EXPORTS (ADMITTEDLY WITH CONSIDERABLY LESS IMPACT ON INDIVIDUAL ITEMS). BOTH OFFICIALS CLAIMED THERE WAS NO REALISTIC WAY FOR THE GOC TO ANALYZE TRADE IMPAIRMENT, SINCE ESTIMATES OF THE LOSS OF U.S. MARKET SHARE TO THEIR SHAKES AND SHINGLES EXPORTERS RANGED FROM TEN PERCENT TO "OBLITERATION" OF THE CANADIAN INDUSTRY.
- 7. EMBOFF RESPONDED THAT PRELIMINARY U.S. ESTIMATES INDICATE THE CANADIAN MARKET SHARE COULD REMAIN IN THE RANGE OF 60 PERCENT, A SIGNIFICANT, BUT PROBABLY MANAGEABLE, DROP FROM THEIR CURRENT 75 PERCENT SHARE. FURTHERMORE, A FIRMING UP OF U.S. PRICES IN THIS MARKET SHOULD OFFSET SOME OF THE DETRIMENTAL IMPACT OF THE TARIFF AND, COUPLED WITH A STRONG SURGE IN U.S. HOUSING STARTS THAT MAY OFFSET SUBSTITUTION OF OTHER PRODUCTS, COULD LEAD TO FAR LESS DAMAGE TO THIS CANADIAN INDUSTRY THAN THE INITIAL DOOMSDAY PROGNOSIS OF THE CANADIAN PRESS. ONE SENIOR EXTAFF OFFICIAL ADMITTED THAT TIME PRESSURE ON THE BUREAUCRACY TO COME UP WITH A PACKAGE PRECLUDED AN INDEPTH ANALYSIS OF INJURY, BUT THAT THE GOC WILL MONITOR CLOSELY THE INDUSTRY'S SITUATION.

8. FULL TEXT OF THE FINANCE MINISTER'S JUNE 2 ANNOUNCEMENT IN PARLIAMENT, ALONG WITH A BACKGROUND INFORMATION PRESS RELEASE, WERE FAXED TO USTR (AMBASSADOR HURPHY) AND STATE (EUR/CAN) ON JUNE 2.

FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF TARIFF ITEMS INCREASED, LEVEL OF INCREASE, TOTAL CANADIAN IMPORTS, IMPORTS FROM THE U.S., AND ESTIMATED VALUE OF NEW DUTIES:

(A) REIMPOSITION OF A 18 PERCENT TARIFF ON CERTAIN BOOKS, CERTAIN PERIODICALS AND OTHER PUBLICATIONS, WHICH HAD BEEN ALLOWED DUTY-FREE ENTRY IN EXCHANGE FOR A CANADIAN EXEMPTION FROM THE MANUFACTURING CLAUSE OF THE U.S. COPYRIGHT ACT. SEPTEL WILL ADDRESS IMPLICATIONS OF THIS CHANGE FOR RENEWAL OF U.S. COPYRIGHT LAW, WHICH EXPIRES, JULY 1, 1986. BOOKS FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND LIBRARIES AND RELIGIOUS LITERATURE WILL BE EXEMPTED FROM THE INCREASE AND THUS CONTINUE TO ENJOY DUTY-FREE ENTRY. THE NEW TARIFF WILL NOT APPLY TO NEWSPAPERS OR PERIODICALS ISSUED ON LESS THAN A QUARTERLY BASIS (I.E. TIME OR NEWSWEEK). HOWEVER, CATALOGUES OF PUBLICATIONS ISSUED OUTSIDE CANADA AND CERTAIN PUBLICATIONS TO ENCOURAGE ENROLLMENT IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS OUTSIDE CANADA, WILL REVERT TO 20.6 PERCENT, WHILE PRINTED HUSIC WILL RETURN TO 5.5 PERCENT.

IN SUM, THE CANADIAN TARIFF WILL BE RESTORED ON THE FOLLOWING CANADIAN TARIFF ITEMS: 16980-1 (NOVELS, TO 18 PERCENT), 17188-1 (OTHER BOOKS AND PERIODICALS, TO 10 PERCENT), 17800-6 (FOREIGN SCHOOL CALENDARS, TO 28.6 PERCENT), 18838-2 (MAPS AND CHARTS, TO 18.2

PERCENT), AND 18200-2 (PRINTED MUSIC, TO 5.5 PERCENT). THE U.S. PROVIDES NEARLY 90 PERCENT OF CANADIAN IMPORTS UNDER THESE TARIFF CATEGORIES, CONSTITUTING CDOLS 368 IN U.S. EXPORTS. NEW DUTIES COLLECTED FOR THIS OVERALL INCREASE WILL BE ABOUT CDOLS 36 MILLION.

(B) CANADA WILL PULL OUT OF THE US/CANADA/JAPAN TRILATERAL AGREEMENT, AND THUS RESTORE THE 3.9 PERCENT TARIFF ON COMPUTER PARTS AND THE 5.4 PERCENT DUTY ON SOME SEMICONDUCTORS, BOTH OF WHICH THEY JUST ELIMINATED ON JANUARY 20, 1986. CANADIAN IMPORTS OF COMPUTER PARTS LAST YEAR TOTALLED ABOUT CDOLS 1.1 BILLION, OF WHICH APPROXIMATELY COOLS ONE BILLION CAME FROM THE U.S. TO IMPLEMENT THE DUTY INCREASE, THE GOC WILL WITHDRAW ITS ORDER IN COUNCIL THAT ESTABLISHED TARIFF ITEM NUMBER 41417-3, PROVIDING DUTY-FREE ENTRY FOR COMPUTER PARTS. ON SEMICONDUCTORS, THE 5.4 PERCENT DUTY RESTORATION WILL APPLY ONLY TO TYPES MADE IN CANADA, BY REINTRODUCING TARIFF ITEM 44544-2. WHICH HAD BEEN ELIMINATED. WHILE TOTAL IMPORTS OF SEMI-CONDUCTORS AMOUNTED TO ABOUT COOLS ONE BILLION LAST YEAR, APPROXIMATELY COOLS 30 MILLION IN U.S. EXPORTS WILL BE HIT. THEREFORE, NEW OUTIES IMPOSED ON U.S. EXPORTS OF COMPUTER PARTS WILL TOTAL ABOUT COOLS 39 MILLION; AND ON SEMICONDUCTORS, ABOUT CDOLS 1.6 MILLION, FOR A TOTAL OF APPROXIMATELY CDOLS 48.6 MILLION.

(C) MISCELLANEOUS TARIFF INCREASES ON A NUMBER OF ITEMS, COVERING TOTAL U.S. EXPORTS OF CDOLS 20.7 MILLION, INTENDED TO RAISE NEW DUTIES TOTALLING COOLS 2.5 MILLION. LISTED BELOW ARE THE PRODUCTS AFFECTED BY: CANADIAN TARIFF NUMBER; PRODUCT DESCRIPTION; TOTAL IMPORTS; FOLLOWED BY U.S. IMPORTS, BOTH IN

REACTION TO THE RETALIATION

9. AFTER MONTHS OF LONG HAMMERING BY THE OPPOSITION THAT THE PM SHOULD STAND UP TO THE AMERICANS ON

SOFTWOOD LUMBER. THE SCOPE OF BILATERAL TRADE NEGOTIATIONS, AND THEN FINALLY THE U.S. ACTION ON SHAKES AND SHINGLES, THE PM ACTED. HOWEVER, THE GOC RETALIATION PACKAGE IS BRINGING EVEN THE OPPOSITION TO ITS SENSES. LIBERAL LEADER JOHN TURNER CHARACTERIZED THE PACKAGE. IN A DEBATE ON THE HOUSE FLOOR ON JUNE 3. AS "FANNING THE FLAMES OF A TRADE WAR." EVEN THE NORMALLY LESS THAN CONCILIATORY ED BROADBENT, THE LEADER OF THE NEW DEMOCRATIC PARTY WHO WAS EJECTED FROM THE COMMONS LAST WEEK FOR ACCUSING THE PM OF "MISLEADING THE HOUSE" ON THE SHAKES AND SHINGLES ISSUE, SUGGESTED ON JUNE 3 THAT CANADA AND THE U.S. SET UP A MECHANISM WHEREBY BOTH COUNTRIES MIGHT CHECK EACH OTHER FROM ENGAGING IN UNILATERAL ACTIONS WHICH SERVE AS BARRIERS TO TRADE. OTHER OPPOSITION MPS CALLED THE GOVERNMENT'S RETALIATION THE RESULT OF "CONVOLUTED LOGIC AND SELF-IMMOLATION" SINCE THE IMPACT OF GOC TARIFF INCREASES WOULD BE FELT BY CANADIAN CONSUMERS. ONE LEADING POLITICAL OPPONENT OF THE GOVERNMENT DESCRIBED THE RETALIATION PACKAGE AS "UNINTENDED BLACK HUMOR" IN IMPOSING DUTIES ON CHRISTMAS TREES AND PORRIDGE.

10. THE IMPACT OF THE PACKAGE HAS NOT YET BEEN FULLY ABSORBED BY THE CANADIAN CONSUMERS OR THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY. AS ONE COMPUTER MANUFACTURER NOTED, "THE GOVERNMENT HAS TAKEN CAREFUL AIM AT THE U.S. AND THEN SHOT ITSELF IN THE FOOT. " NILES

Original Mulroney Letters II and III

Attached are the signed original II and III Mulroney letters to the President.

I continue to be very upset with the slip-shod manner in which the GOC handles these letters. As you recall, it took over eight days for us to receive the signed original of the first Mulroney letter protesting our "Shakes and Shingles" decision, even though the President twice personally asked for that original. note that the second Mulroney letter dated May 31, 1986 is somewhat different from the version the Canadian Embassy sent us. Most importantly the salutation is "Dear Ron" vis "Dear Mr. President" and it is signed "Brian" as opposed to "Brian Mulroney." Ordinarily these may be minor concerns but the form of address and signature were the key elements that we looked for in the last two letters.

Attachments Original Mulroney Letters

Second Mulroney Letter

Issue

To read the letter from PM Mulroney on trade issues.

Facts

The PM wrote a stiff, formal note last week protesting our actions on the "Shakes and Shingles" issue. At Tab A is a second letter from Mulroney, written prior to his receiving your conciliatory note. Again, it is formal -- addressed to "Dear Mr. President" and signed "Brian Mulroney," -- but the tone is more positive.

Discussion

Mulroney commends your NAM speech, where you stated your determination to resist protectionism, and your positive references to the on-going U.S.-Canada trade negotiations. also stresses that the recent disagreements on trade matters underline the importance that there be "no surprises" as we encounter future difficulties. The PM endorses the commitment George Shultz and Joe Clark made in Halifax to identify ways to improve political oversight of the bilateral relationship.

Yesterday the Canadian government formally imposed a tariff on the importation of certain U.S. books, periodicals, and computer parts in retaliation for your "Shakes and Shingles" tariff.

We feel that no further reply from you to the PM is warranted.
