-- That said, there is no doubt that we are deeply concerned about Qadhafi's support for terrorism.

- o Qadhafi has been threatening and supporting terrorism for some time. That's nothing new.

-- The United States will not be intimidated by threats. We are aware of Libyan preparations, under way for some time, for possible terrorist operations against Americans. We will hold Qadhafi fully accountable.

How Would We Respond to a Terrorist Incident?

- o We do not forecast what we might do. We have a variety of options we are willing to use, as appropriate.

Advice for Travelers Overseas

- o As always, prudence and common sense should be exercised.

NATIONAL SECURITY DECISION
DIRECTIVE NUMBER 245

REAGAN-GORBACHEV PREPARATORY MEETING (U)

I have agreed to meet with General Secretary Gorbachev in Reykjavik, Iceland, October 11 - 12 in an effort to accelerate progress in resolving issues in our relations with the Soviet Union. I expect the meetings to be very private and plan to take only a minimal support staff with me. The discussions will be serious and business-like and social functions will be conducted at the minimal level appropriate to the occasion. (S)

It is imperative for all U.S. Government officials to adhere totally to the press guidance established by my own statements and those approved by the State Department and the White House. No official is authorized to originate public statements regarding the Reykjavik meeting, or to provide comments in background briefings that go beyond statements made publicly by the White House or Department of State. All written remarks concerning U.S.-Soviet relations must be approved in advance by the White House or the Department of State. Should public statements or background briefings by other U.S. Government officials on particular aspects of U.S.-Soviet relations seem desirable, they may be undertaken only with the specific approval of the White House. Requests should be submitted through the Operations Coordinating Committee of the NSC. (S)

In going to Iceland, the United States demonstrates to the world that we are prepared to exert every effort to establish a constructive and serious dialogue with the Soviet leadership. I wish to stress however, that I do not anticipate signing any agreements in Reykjavik. (S)

Objective

My objective for this meeting is to increase the likelihood that the coming Summit in the United States will be productive by:

- Demonstrating my commitment to solving problems in the U.S.-Soviet relationship, to the degree the Soviets are willing.

- Identifying issues with reasonable prospects of solution, and accelerating efforts to resolve them. I will press the General Secretary to agree to acceptable approaches to outstanding key issues in order to intensify ongoing negotiations.
- Engaging the Soviets in substantive and serious discussions on the entire range of issues on the US agenda. I will not permit the meeting to focus exclusively or disproportionately on arms control, and I will ensure that regional, bilateral and human rights issues are thoroughly reviewed.
- Demonstrating to our Allies and to the American public that the policy we have pursued toward the Soviet Union -- based upon realism, strength, and dialogue -- has created the potential for effective negotiations with the Soviet Union. I will, of course, continue to avoid preemptive or one-sided concessions and steadfastly resist Soviet pressures and threats. (S)

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TALKING POINTS

- Mr. President, this luncheon provides opportunity to review our preparations for your meetings with General Secretary Gorbachev in Reykjavik Saturday and Sunday.

- You have indicated that your meetings with the General Secretary will be very private. Principally one-on-one with Gorbachev.

- Mr. President, in keeping with the low-key and serious approach that you have directed we take toward this preparatory meeting, the discussions will be business-like and social functions will be minimized. We have also taken steps to implement your guidance that you wish the USG presence in Iceland to be at an absolute minimum level. *with*
for a one-on-one meeting with the president

- In our public diplomacy efforts we have stressed that you do not envision the meetings in Iceland to result in substantive agreements. Rather, the point is to narrow our differences on key issues in preparation for the General Secretary's visit to Washington and to ensure that all four points of our agenda be addressed.

- You stressed your key objective for this meeting is to increase likelihood that Washington Summit will be productive by: demonstrating commitment to solving problems in US-Soviet relationship; identifying issues with

reasonable prospects of solution, and accelerating efforts to solve them; engaging the Soviets on the entire range of issues on the US agenda -- not permitting the meeting to focus exclusively on arms control; and demonstrating to Allies/American public that your Soviet policy -- based on realism strength and dialogue -- has created the potential for effective negotiations with the USSR.

- This afternoon you will have opportunity to reiterate your objectives publicly at a meeting with exchange executives. Tomorrow you can underline the importance of human rights in the Soviet relationship by meeting with key Jewish and other religious leaders, and possibly with Yuri Orlov. Wednesday, your remarks on behalf of Broyhill will include a strong reiteration of your objectives for the Reykjavik meeting.
- You will be leaving Thursday morning, arriving Iceland about 7 p.m., and will meet with Icelandic leaders Friday. You have three sessions with Gorbachev, Saturday morning and afternoon and Sunday morning, each for about two hours. We suggest addressing bilateral, regional and human rights issues in the first session, and arms control in the second. Sunday's session would aim at wrapping up any guidelines which might be agreed upon as a result of the first day's session.
- Bill Henkel will have more on the trip's schedule in just a minute. George will now provide us with an overview of

Gorbachev's goals and objectives for Reykjavik and will review key issues on the non-arms control agenda. George.

-- Bill, could you review trip logistics? I understand Gorbachev may have a "climatic advantage."

-- Larry, you might want to say something about our communications plan.

-- Let's open the meeting now to general discussion.

-- That wraps up our discussion. Thank you.
