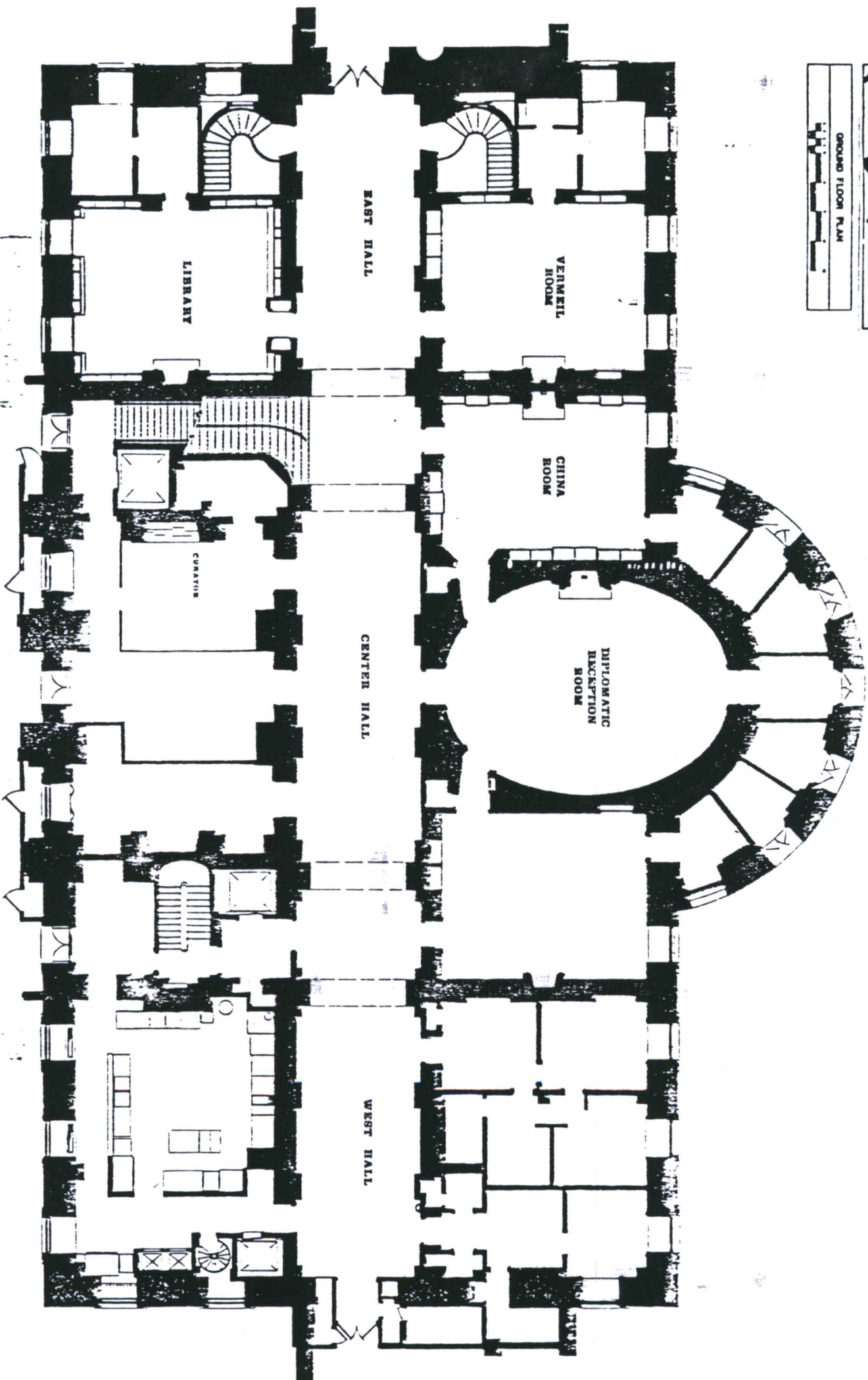

SUBJECT: SUMMIT OPERATING PROCEDURES

In order to facilitate and compress discussions with the Soviet advance team during the time that they are in Washington preparing for General Secretary Gorbachev's visit, we are dividing into two groups. One group will be concerned with the negotiation of overall schedule issues. This will involve a limited number of persons, who will pass on any decisions or information from this group to their respective offices and agencies for action.

A second Working Group will be comprised of those offices and individuals who will have operational responsibility for carrying out the decisions made by the first group. We anticipate that the Working Group will meet, as a group, with their Soviet counterparts on a regular daily basis. This will ensure a smooth flow of communication and information.

We have communicated with the Soviet advance team on this plan, and they are in agreement. Beginning with the meeting to be held on outstanding scheduling items later today, the Soviet numbers will be limited.

Accordingly, the following persons will participate in that meeting; and will be notified by telephone of the time and location. (Senior representatives of the persons listed below will be accepted as substitutes, but not as additions to the list.)

SUBJECT: WALLENBERG

President Reagan, as I mentioned the other day, has on several occasions publicly called for an accounting of Raoul Wallenberg by the Soviet Government. It is imperative that the President make this request of General Secretary Gorbachev during his upcoming visit.

We must keep in mind that on December 10th, the day after Gorbachev leaves, Human Rights Day will be commemorated. A simple request by the President of an accounting of Wallenberg could be mentioned on Human Rights Day underscoring the Administration's commitment to human rights, even in an era of arms reduction.

Recently Joseph Terelya, a Ukrainian Catholic who spent many years in the Gulag, visited the White House and claimed to have met Wallenberg in Valdampir-on-Klyazma prison in April of 1970, 23 years after Wallenberg's alleged death. Terelya is not the first to claim to have seen Wallenberg.

Specifically, I suggest the President address the issue to General Secretary Gorbachev in the following way: A Ukrainian who spent many years in Soviet prisons recently told members of my staff that he personally met Raoul Wallenberg in 1970 in the Valdampir-on-Klyazma prison. Wallenberg, according to this former prisoner, was in cell number 25 in that prison. This is not the first such sighting of a man who is a hero in the United States and throughout the world. I would appreciate your personal attention on this matter. Perhaps a tragic oversight has occurred in these many years and it would be very significant if you were to set the record straight.

The next day, Terelya could be introduced at the White House Human Rights Day ceremony. Without committing ourselves to the validity of the claim, we could announce that the matter was taken up with General Secretary Gorbachev and it would be a tremendous coup for President Reagan. It would ensure positive news coverage of Human Rights Day, which otherwise may well turn into a public relations nightmare unless we plan ahead. This suggestion is just as important if the Human Rights Day event is held before Gorbachev's visit. The President could announce he will ask the Soviet leader to investigate the reported Wallenberg sighting.
