The Polish "Renewal"

ISSUE DEFINITION:

Poland has embarked on a grass roots program of economic, political, and social "renewal" that is unprecedented in the socialist bloc. The new course is expected to be ratified and formalized at the Communist Party Congress scheduled to begin on July 14. The "renewal" program has progressed to a point where, short of Soviet intervention, it may be irreversible.

The first phase of the movement began in July 1980 with massive strikes and ended with a successful struggle by workers to establish independent trade unions, and gain other historic political and economic concessions from the Communist government.

In the second phase, the struggle over the course of Polish "renewal" has been waged primarily inside the Communist Party. Already, there have been major changes in the top level party leadership, with men committed to "renewal" led by new party leader Kania and Premier Jaruzelski seemingly in control. Further changes in the make-up of the Central Committee and Politburo are expected to result from the party congress in July. If established, new people will dominate the proceedings. The congress could provide the basis for a new social contract between the party, the church, and Solidarity, and could launch the third phase of Poland's evolution with the

focus on economic recovery and consolidation of the "renewal" program.

Poland's evolution is clouded by the continuing uncertainty of Soviet intentions. Soviet leaders have demonstrated their concern and misgivings over Polish trends with periodic campaigns of political, psychological, and military pressure. A letter addressed to the Polish Central Committee by the Soviet leadership in early June was the harshest warning to date. It called for a reversal of the democratization process and reestablishment of a central party control in Poland. It appears doubtful that the party leadership can or will meet these Soviet demands. Although the costs would be enormous to Moscow, the possibility of Soviet military intervention remains. A Soviet military move against Poland would create a crisis of the first order in Eastern Europe and in East-West relations. Even if the "renewal" program is successfully implemented, continuing Polish economic problems, including a major foreign debt crisis, may still necessitate austerity measures and create political unrest. To alleviate the debt problem, the U.S. Government, along with other Western countries, has been asked to provide several billion dollars in new loans at very favorable repayment terms. The Poles also urgently need material aid, including food.

## BACKGROUND

The current political crisis in Poland has deep economic roots. Economic growth and trade with the West burgeoned under Party Secretary Edward Gierek from 1971-78, fueled by Western credit and reasonably priced Soviet petroleum. An economic crisis in 1976 was deferred by a rollback of price increases and an increase in consumer goods subsidies. In 1979 the severe winter contributed to a need for costly grain imports and a diversion of coal, meat, copper and industrial goods from domestic consumption for export to the West and East, to pay for the grain and industrial machinery imports.

The economic difficulties of 1979 put Poland in a particularly precarious position, because many of the Western loans were scheduled to come due in 1980. By 1979 the debt service to export ratio had reached 95% and continued upward. The Soviet Union continued to raise oil prices and froze future oil deliveries at the 1980 level.

The Soviets' New 5-Year Plan (1981-1985)

ISSUE DEFINITION:

On Jan. 1, 1981 the Soviet Union's Eleventh Five Year Plan (1981-85) began. An analysis of the new plan provides some insights into Soviet priorities and economic prospects for the next half decade. The Draft Guidelines for the Eleventh Five-Year Plan, which were published in Pravda on Dec. 2, 1980 and formally adopted at the Twenty-Sixth Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, were designed to allocate sufficient investment funds to ensure adequate growth of output in industry, agriculture, transportation, energy, and other sectors; to raise consumer income sufficiently to provide needed incentives and increase consumer satisfaction; to meet security needs at home and abroad; and to import technology, grain and other goods needed to meet priority domestic goals. Since the Soviet Union is entering a decade of possibly deepening economic malaise, many Western analysts believe that the Soviets will find it difficult to achieve even the fairly modest goals of the Eleventh Five-Year Plan with the means available to them.
