MEMORANDUM FOR DONALD T. REGAN ROBERT C. MCFARLANE

Alex Semyonov, the son of Elena Bonner, and stepson of Sakharov -- who is in the 11th day of a hunger strike outside of the Soviet Embassy -- came in with his grandmother (Bonner's mother), for 20 minutes. He is anxious for some kind of Administration response to his plea for renewed interest and activity in the Sakharov case -- so he can end his strike. Told him I could promise nothing, other than to deliver his message. The impression I got is that he wants a) either a White House statement, or b) a meeting with the Vice President. I informed him the Veep was out of town for the week. Last week also, Avital Scharansky, who has come in before, came in to say that her husband has been moved back into punishment detention; and his physical condition is deteriorating. Clearly, both the Scharansky and Sakharov family see this occasion, pre-summit, as a time for them to get some action on the release of their family members.

From speaking with Semyonov, I have the impression he might be willing to end his hunger strike, if he could see and speak his case to the First Lady. That might also provide an occasion for Avital Scharansky to get a hearing as well. Apparently, Mrs. Bonner had such a meeting in the works before the President's hospitalization. Any interest in pursuing this?
