Thanks for sending me the new Atlantic Council report on "The Western Stake in the Future of the Soviet Economy." It is an articulate statement of where we are headed. I say "articulate" because it states the rationale in all its logic and is probably the best case that can be made.

Nevertheless, the logic is really pathetic: The key argument is that any other policy would be highly divisive among the Western allies. I.e., the West may be committing suicide by doing this but for us to fight the trend would cause bigger problems. I would hope we could show some firmness and act as a serious restraint here, and not be so accommodationist.

Perhaps sheepish about this line of argument, the report then seeks refuge in utter naivete about how East-West trade will by itself mellow and open up the Soviet system. How convenient that what is profitable is hereby deemed to be automatically good strategically.

I continue to belong to the old school that believes the West ought to regain some political/governmental control over this trade so that it can be used somehow in the service of a political strategy. The report tries to discourage this. I would not try heavy-handed linkage but would like at least to regulate the pace of new openings-up of trade in line with real improvements in Soviet foreign policy. It probably is impossible to turn off the spigot once opened, but at least we can slow down and control the opening up. Otherwise, all the fancy talk is just an abdication of political thought.
