Pursuant to Sections 36(c) and 36(d) of the Arms Export Control Act, I am transmitting herewith notification of a proposed license for the export and production of major defense equipment in the Republic of Kores.

The transaction contained in the attached notification involves the export to the Republic of Korea of two (2) assembled and twenty (20) unassembled M105A2 Self-Propelled 155mm Howitzers, and a conmercial manufacturing license and technical assistance agreement for the assembly and production of these Howitzers for the Covernment of the Republic of Korea.

The United States Government is prepared to license the export of these items having taken into account political, military, economic, human rights, and arms control considerations.

More detailed information is contained in the formal notification which, though unclassified, contains business information submitted to the Department of State by the applicant, publication of which could cause competitive harm to the United States firm concerned.

Phase I involves immediate delivery of two complete Howitzers. Phase II entails delivery of twenty unassembled Howitzer kits and technical assistance for assembly of same in Korea, to be completed by October 1984. Phase III involves joint production of 250 Howitzers over a five-to-eight year period.

Dear Dr. Keyworth:

Many of us have become concerned over the quality and scope of the U.S. exhibition that we can now project for Tsukuba Expo '85. I know that you agree that U.S. national representation must be of high quality. An appropriate effort would cost between \$10 and \$14 million. However, with only \$4 million now anticipated in appropriations for official U.S. participation in the Expo and with disappointing outside fundraising results thus far, we cannot prepare an adequate exhibition. Time, too, is becoming tight since there are only 22 months left for preparations.

The Office of Management and Budget has discouraged the idea of additional funding. This year USIA has been forced to absorb the \$5.9 million cost of a building consolidation in Washington and to reprogram \$2 million to cover foreign press costs at the recent Williamsburg Summit. We cannot reprogram further within existing appropriations this late in FY 1983 without inflicting serious damage to program operations that are critical to national security interests. The FY 1984 resource situation is still far too uncertain and too burdened with potential resource demands for USIA to plan shifts now to add funds to the Tsukuba Expo '85 participation.

We perceive one slight opportunity to augment appropriations for this vital national effort. The opportunity must be seized quickly. USIA's FY 1983 enacted authorization legislation exceeds enacted and pending appropriations by \$4.1 million in general authority. Thus, if the Executive Office of the President quickly approves the idea, and if a Senator is willing to offer a floor amendment to the pending FY 1983 supplemental, Tsukuba funding may be augmented by a critical \$4.1 million, to be available until expended. Since this sum would be covered within USIA's existing authorization level, it could be considered absorbed in the context of USIA's FY 1983 budget.

If the supplemental approach succeeds, we hope to be in a better position to raise sufficient private funds to produce a moderately respectable national exhibition, although still on a more modest scale than anticipated. We are also seeking the cooperation of other departments and agencies of the government to secure adequate resources or to provide in-kind services which would allow some savings within our Tsukuba financial plan.

The House of Representatives passed the supplemental on May 25. The Senate is likely to vote on it during the week of June 6. We ask your help in taking advantage of this all too brief opportunity.

We wish to express our appreciation to Dr. John Marcum and his associates for their assistance in the continuing endeavor to produce an exhibition that will make us all proud.
