A. Main theme: Terrorism is not psycho-sociological phenomenon. Look for who is behind it. Soviet Union works through proxies to develop organization, logistics, communications, funds (heads the "Mafia of Terrorism"). Bulgaria is #1 Soviet proxy. U.S. Government needs to keep a steady policy course. See subversion, espionage, disinformation and terrorism as a continuum.

B. What should be done, that is not currently done in combatting terrorism?

- 1. Much scurrying around but no direction in combatting terrorism. No one pulls it together in U.S. Government. Each agency is inherently parochial. Too much "coordination" and no real action.
- 2. Government needs to lead the media. Franker talks between government and media reps.

C. What is being done that could be improved upon? Raise priority of collection against terrorism. Articulate consistent government policy to combat terrorism (tell public/terrorists JSOC capabilities).

D. Areas to focus on to improve U.S. Government effectiveness in combatting terrorism: Finger the Soviets - show they are involved. Need strong element at NSC land to take charge.

PAUL HENZE

Paul Henze is a Resident Consultant at The Rand Corporation Washington Office.

Following three years' military service in Europe during World War II, he received a B.A. from St. Olaf College (history and languages) and an M.A. from Harvard University (Russian program). He also did graduate work at several other universities and took numerous courses at U.S. Government facilities such as the Foreign Service Institute. He served 30 years in various U.S. Government and government-related organizations, including Radio Free Europe, the Departments of State and Defense, U.S. embassies in Turkey and Ethiopia, and the Johns Hopkins Operations Research Office. From 1977 to 1980 he was a key member of Zbigniew Brzezinski's National Security Council Staff.

Since retirement from government at the end of 1980, Mr. Henze has served as a business consultant, journalist, researcher, and writer. He was a Wilson Fellow at the Smithsonian Institution in 1982. He is a regular contributor to the *Christian Science Monitor* and writes frequently on a wide range of subjects for professional and scholarly journals. He is a widely recognized specialist in the affairs of the Horn of Africa, Turkey, and the Eastern Mediterranean, Soviet nationalities questions, and the history and politics of Russia and Eastern Europe. He is a contributing author of more than half a dozen books. He published *Ethiopian Journeys* (Ernest Benn Ltd., London) in 1977 and *The Plot to Kill the Pope* (Scribners, New York/Croom Helm Ltd., London) in 1983, and is currently at work on a history of U.S. and Soviet involvement in the Horn of Africa.

Mr. Henze has traveled in more than 50 foreign countries, speaks more than half a dozen foreign languages and is a member of many professional organizations and scholarly societies.

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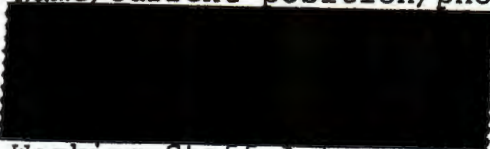

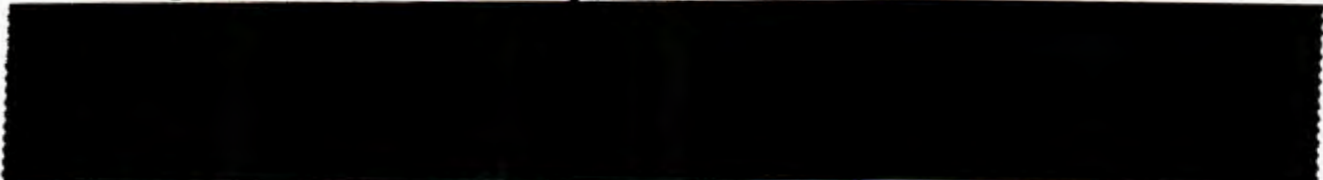

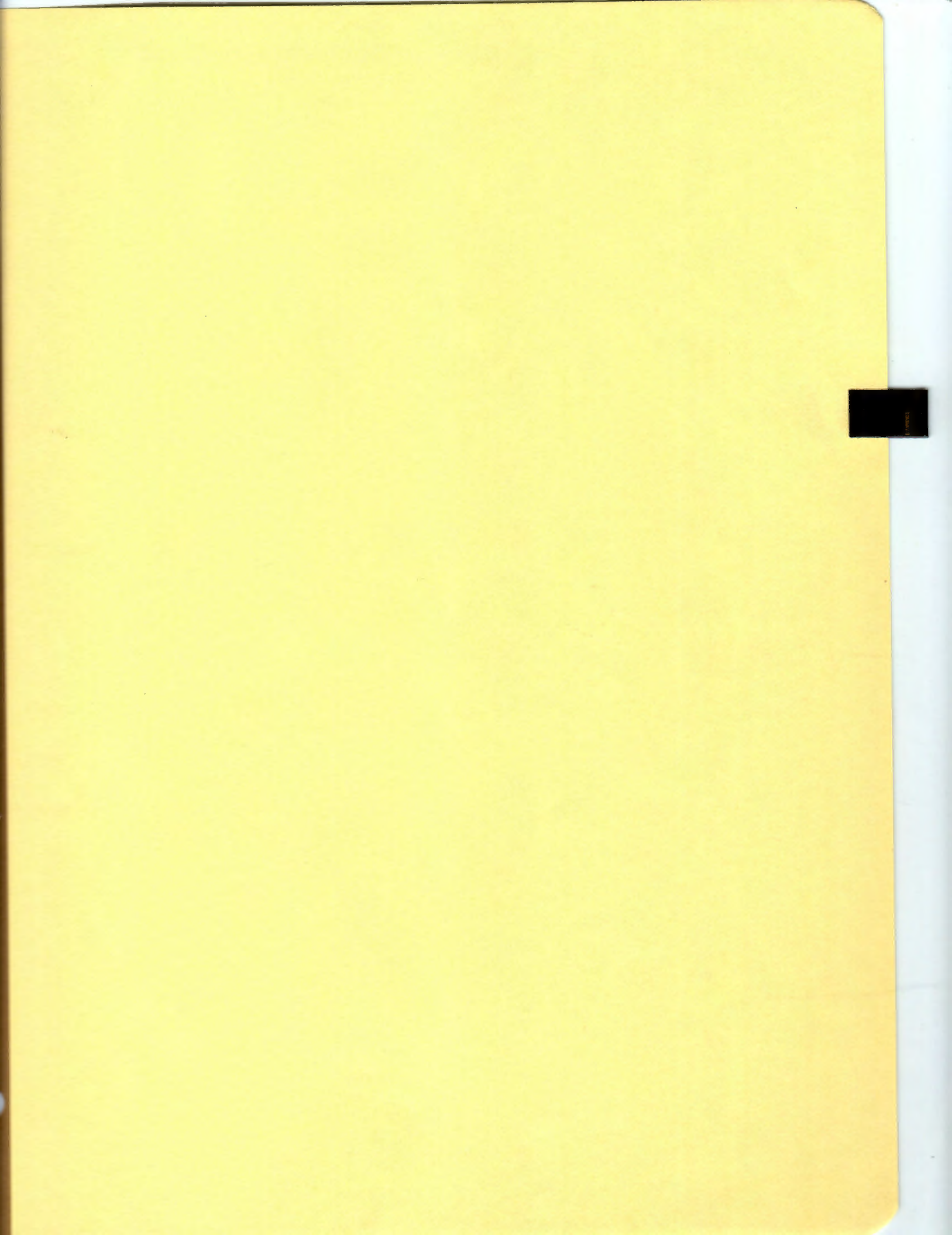

6. Summary of subject(s) comments and recommendations.

A. Main theme: Provided background on charter of panel and cited influences over period of the report preparation (7/84 to 6/85) that drove findings (i.e., Bierut Embassy attack, Soviet Technical penetrations of Embassy Moscow, increasing trend of incidents and U.S. targets led to focus on 10 years out to meet threat). Need to fix accountability. Secretary of State determined report delivery technique. Physical security emphasis to deter.

B. What should be done, that is not currently done in combatting terrorism?
Develop Security organization/personnel. Get "predictive" intelligence. Get in position to act quickly.
Develop clear U.S. policy (CT) and mechanism to execute it. Avoid inter-cabinet bickering.

C. What is being done that could be improved upon?
Better interagency/state/local cooperation/interoperability on VIP protection
Current "collegial" decision making (TIWG/IG/T) not reliable
Need "Geneva Convention" to work out international cooperation/legal/diplomatic position on terrorism.

D. Areas to focus on to improve U.S. Government effectiveness in combatting terrorism:
Put organizational "fix" (i.e., coordinator) at NSC (or state but not on current consultation structure).

6. Summary of subject(s) comments and recommendations.

A. Main theme: Terrorism is on rise. There is a growing willingness of Governments to use, support, exploit it. It will become institutionalized and accepted as a policy option/device. Lack of action in response leads to the perception of importance which in turn stimulates terrorism. Define terrorism by quality of the act (e.g., crime) not by motive or perpetrator. Weigh retaliation option against likelihood of satisfying specific objectives, targets (state or terror organization), overt or covert.

B. What should be done, that is not currently done in combatting terrorism? Need to develop a larger "menu" of options and a Government mechanism to bring the capability to combat terrorism together. Get long range (interagency interest studies (e.g., terrorist psychological profiles) initiated and directed.

C. What is being done that could be improved upon?

Tone down rhetoric. Avoid "war" and medical (e.g., ^{CANCER} ~~conser~~) analogies that raise expectations to level of black and white, win and lose eradication. Also, do not so generalize that everything is "Soviet" or terrorist (e.g., KAL 007) because you lose allied support.

D. Areas to focus on to improve U.S. Government effectiveness in combatting terrorism:

Psychological operations and perceptions management against advisaries/terrorists. Get legislation to isolate/identify terrorists as belligerents, countries as sponsors.
