Meeting with President Belaunde of Peru

Attached is your meeting memorandum to President Reagan for the meeting with President Belaunde on Thursday, September 27 at 9:30 a.m. The memorandum describes the extensive problems that President Belaunde faces and outlines our interests in Peru. President Belaunde does not expect to walk out of his meeting with President Reagan with commitments of tangible amounts of dollar assistance; he sought this meeting seeking support and sympathy and was very grateful that the meeting was scheduled.

President Belaunde brought his three children for photographs with President Reagan which will be taken before the Oval Office meeting begins. Also, since President Belaunde speaks fluent English, an interpreter will not be needed. There is an additional \$5 million in PL-480 approved for FY-85 per OMB.



SUBJECT: MEETING BETWEEN PRESIDENT REAGAN AND PERUVIAN PRESIDENT FERNANDO BELAUNDE TERRY, SEPTEMBER 27- 1984

1. 8 - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. SUMMARY: PRESIDENT REAGAN MET WITH PRESIDENT BELAUNDE OF PERU FOR 3D MINUTES ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 1984, AT THE WHITE HOUSE. ALSO ATTENDING ON THE PERUVIAN SIDE WERE PRIME MINISTER MARIATEGUI, FINANCE MINISTER BENAVIDES AND AMBASSADOR TO THE U.S. MARCHAND. OTHER U.S. ATTENDEES WERE ACTING SECRETARY OF STATE 3AM, TREASURY SECRETARY REGAN, ARA 3AS KILDAY, AMBASSADOR TO PERU JORDAN, OAS PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE MIDDENDORF, NATIONAL SECURITY ADVISOR MCFARLANE AND MSC STAFF.

3. AFTER EMPHASIZING HIS PRIMARY GOAL OF A CONSTITUTIONAL TRANSFER OF POWER NEXT YEAR, BELAUNDE DISCOUNTED PRESS REPORTS THAT PERU IS BROKE, NOTING THAT IT DID HAVE A MULTITUDE OF PROBLEMS, PARTICULARLY COMMUNIST TERRORISM, A_COSTLY BATTLE WHICH PERU WAS FIGHTING ALONE BUT ON BEHALF OF THE CONTINENT. BELAUNDE REVIEWED GOT NARCOTICS

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CONTROL PROGRESS. HE EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR THE PRESIDENT'S DECISION NOT TO IMPOSE COPPER QUOTAS OR THRIFFS. AND THE POOR STATE OF COMMODITY PRICES HAS DISCUSSED. PRESIDENT REAGAN REVIEWED THE PROGRESS OF THE S. ECONOMY AND EXPRESSED HIS VIEW THAT THE PRIMATE OF COURAGE OUTH.

PRESIDENT REAGAN INFORMED BELAUNDE THAT ADDITIONAL PL-480 WAS BEING MADE AVAILABLE FOR PERU. BELAUNDE COMMENDED USAID AND INTERNATIONAL DONORS BUT STATED HIS BELIEF THAT COUNTERPART REQUIREMENTS HAD TO BE RELAXED TO MAKE USE OF AID. REGAN SAID THIS ISSUE SHOULD BE DISCUSSED AT THE DEBT MEETING NEXT APRIL. WHICH BELAUNDE SAID HOULD BE VERY IMPORTANT. BELAUNDE INVITED PRESIDENT REAGAN TO PERU. NO ACCEPTANCE WAS GIVEN. BUT THEY SHARED IT PRESSIONS OF CLOSE U.S.-LATIN HISTORICAL TIES.

5. PRESIDENT REAGAN ASKED ABOUT PERU'S SOVIET TIES. BE AUNDE REVIEWED THE HISTORICAL REASONS FOR THE PRESENT AR 15 SUPPLY RELATIONSHIP AND NOTED PRESENT BESIRES TO (NUIRE U.S. MATERIEL. REGAN THEN ASKED ABOUT BELAUNDE'S DI CUSSIONS WITH IMF MANAGING DIRECTOR LAROSIERE. BE AUNDE SAID THEY WERE POSITIVE BUT QUESTIONED INF IN ENSITIVITY TO THE SOCIAL COST OF THEIR PE OMMENDATIONS. REGAN SAID A L PERCENT FISCAL DEFICIT HOULD PROBABLY BE ACCEPTABLE TO THE THE AND BANKERS. DDE ZION TO MADE SATING MUULD NEED A BRIDGE LOAN OF DOLL BOD HILLION IN EARLY 1985. THE SAME SORT OF FACILITY THAT OTIERS HAD ENJOYED. REGAN OPINED PERU HIGHT PIND THE BANKS MORE FORTHCOMING IF IT TOOK STABILIZATION BELAUNDE EXPRESSED PUZZLEMENT OVER THE BANKS! ME: SURES. ATTITUDES, RECALLING THEIR RECENT REFUSAL OF A BOLS 100 MILLION LOAM. REGAN SAID THEY TAKE THEIR CUE FROM THE THE MEETING CLOSED WITH PLEASANTRIES. END SUMMARY.

DISCUSSION OPENED ON A LIGHT NOTE, WITH PRESIDENT REAGAN OFFERING A JOCULAR REMARK ON THE MIXED BLESSINGS OF LARE PRESS AND PRESIDENT BELAUNDE RESPONDING IN THE LAM FASHION ON THE SAME THEME (THEY HAD BEEN ACCOSTED BY PORTER IN THE ROSE GARDEN IMMEDIATELY BEFOREHAND).

PRESIDENT REAGAN EXPRESSED HIS PLEASURE IN RECEIVING THE SIDENT BELAUNDE, WHO IN RESTORING DEMOCRACY TO PERULAD CONTRIBUTED SO MUCH TO THE RESTORATION OF DEMOCRACY HROUGHOUT LATIN AMERICA.

PRESIDENT BELAUNDE REMARKED THAT HE WAS NOW PPPOACHING THE FINAL PART OF HIS ELECTED RULE SINCE HERE IS NO PROVISION FOR IMMEDIATE PRESIDENTIAL

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RE-ELECTION IN PERU. HE SAID HIS GOAL NOW IS TO HAVE A CONSTITUTIONAL TRANSFER OF OFFICE AND THEM TO RETIRE TO THE SENATE. UNDER PERUVIAN LAW, FORMER PRESIDENTS ARE SENATORS FOR LIFE. PRESIDENT REAGAN SAID THAT PERHAPS THE U.S. SHOULD ADOPT THE SAME PRACTICE. HE THEN INVITED PRESIDENT BELAUNDE TO RAISE ANY TOPICS THAT MIGHT BE ON HIS AGENDA.

8. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE OBSERVED THAT A RECENT WASHINGTON POST ARTICLE HAD ALLEGED TIAT PERU WAS BROKE. HE WISHED TO SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT. PERU IS NOT SWIMMING IN AFFLUENCE, HE SAID, BUT NEITHER IS IT DROWNING"IN BANKRUPTCY. HE SAID PERU FACED MANY PROBLEMS BUT HIS GOVERNMENT WAS ACTING VIGOROUSLY ON ALL FRONTS TO CONTAIN AND RESOLVE THEM. HE SPOKE AT SOME LENGTH ABOUT THE SENDERO LUMINOSO TERRORIST PROBLEM WHICH HE CHARACTERIZED AS A COMMUNIST EFFORT TO ESTAB' ISH A BEACHHEAD IN SOUTH AMERICA. HE SAID THAT PERU ALONE WAS COMBATTING THIS PROBLEM ALTHOUGH IT REPRESENTED A THREAT TO THE ENTIRE PRESIDENT BELAUNDE MENTIONED. AS AN EXAMPLE HEMISPHERE. OF THE FINANCIAL AND HUMAN RESOURCE COST OF THE PROBLEM. THAT PERU HAD JUST CONNITTED 2-000 TROOPS TO COMBAT THE TERRORISTS IN THE UPPER HUALLAGA VALLEY, AN AREA WHERE SENDERO TERRORISTS HAD BECOME ACTIVE IN APPARENT PURSUIT OF THE SAME OBJECTIVES AS THE "ARCOTICS-RELATE" TERRORISTS THERE.

TO ON THE MARCOTICS FRONT, PRESIDENT BELAUNDE SAID THAT PERU WAS HAKING GREAT PROGRESS, BURNING TONS, AND MILLIONS OF DOLLARS WORTH, OF COCA AND COCAINE. PERU, HE SAID, IS DOING ITS PART TO COCPERATE WITH THE ANTI-MARCOTICS CAMPAIGN DESCRIBED BY SECRETARY SHULTZ IN HIS RECENT SPEECH.

IN THE THEN CONGRATULATED PRESIDENT REAGAN ON HIS SPEECH AT THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR THE PRESIDENT'S DECISION NOT TO ADOPT QUOTAS OR SET DUTIES ON COPPER IMPORTS. PRESIDENT REAGAN SAID THAT IT WAS THE ONLY DECISION HE COULD MAKE AFTER REVIEWING ALL OF THE FACTS AND IMPLICATIONS OF THE COPPER ISSUE.

LI. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE LAMENTED THE LOW PRICE OF COPPER ON THE WORLD MARKET. HE SAID THAT IF COPPER TRADED TODAY AT 1980 PRICES, PERU WOULD BE EARNING DOLS WOU MILLION HORE A YEAR, AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO COVER PERU'S FINANCIAL PROBLEMS. THE PRESENT TERMS OF TRADE WERE VERY DISADVANTAGEOUS TO PERU. SECRETARY REGAN POINTED OUT THAT 1980 WAS THE HEIGHT OF INFLATION SO COMMODITY PRICES WERE AT A RECORD HIGH. IF THERE IS SUCCESS IN KEEPING

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INFLATION DOWN, CONMODITY PRICES ARE NOT GOING TO RETURN TO THEIR 1980 LEVEL. THIS IS A GOOD NEWS - BAD NEWS - BAD NEWS THE SITUATION: THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT INFLATION IS DOWN; THE BAD NEWS IS THAT WITH LOWERED AMPLATION, COMMODITY PRICES WILL REMAIN LOW. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE CALLED THIS A VERY SERIOUS SITUATION.

12. PRESIDENT REAGAN SAID THAT THE RECOVERY OF THE U.S. ECONOMY LARGELY WAS DUE TO GOVERNMENT ACTION TO REDUCE THIS HAD HELPED CREATE THE CONDITIONS FOR RESUMED TAXES. GROWTH BY ALLOWING INDIVIDUALS AND CORPORATIONS TO RETAIN A LARGER SHARE OF THEIR INCOME FOR RE-INVESTMENT. PRESIDENT DESCRIBED HIS RECENT VISIT TO THE TINKIN STEEL PLANT IN OHIO WHICH, WHEN COMPLETED, WILL BE A HIGHLY EFFICIENT, LOW-COST ENTERPRISE. HE SAID THAT HE HAD EARNED THAT THE COST OF THAT PLANT WAS EQUAL TO THO-THIRDS OF THE TOTAL CAPITAL VALUE OF THE TIMKIN COMPANY. THE OWNERS HAD TOLD HIM THAT THE INVESTMENT COULD NOT HAVE BEEN HADE WERE IT NOT FOR THE IDMINISTRATION'S TAX MEASURES OF LABL WHICH ALLOWED MORE PAPID DEPRECIATION AND RETENTION OF A LARGER SHARE OF ARNINGS. THE PRESIDENT THEN DESCRIBED THE ENTHUSIASTIC RECEPTION HE HAD RECEIVED FROM THE RANK AND FILE STEEL TORKERS EVEN THOUGH THE UNION LEADERSHIP AT THAT VERY THE WAS ENDORSING THE CANDIDATE OF THE DEMOCRATIC 'ARTY. THE PRESIDENT SAID THAT THIS SHOWED WHY IT IS ECESSARY FOR GOVERNMENTS TO REDUCE THEIR DEMANDS ON THE 'RIVATE SECTOR.

PRESIDENT BELAUNDE OBSERVED THAT, AFTER THE EVASTATION OF EL NINO, HE HAD ASKED PERUVIANS WHO EARNED ORE THAN DOLS 250 A MONTH TO PUT 10 PERCENT OF THEIR AGES INTO GOVERNMENT BANKS TO FINANCE DISASTER RELIEF PERATIONS. EVERYBODY COOPERATED EVEN THOUGH IT IS WELL NOWN THAT GOVERNMENT BONDS IN AN INFLATIONARY PERIOD ARE OT A GOOD INVESTMENT. THIS SHOWED THE WILLINGHESS OF HE PERUVIAN PEOPLE TO ACCEPT SACRIFICE FOR THE COMMON OOD AND THE NATIONAL INTEREST.

4. PRESIDENT REAGAN SAID HE WAS PLEASED TO BE ABLE TO HEARM PRESIDENT BELAUNDE OF AN ADDITIONAL DOLS 5 MILLION VAILABILITY IN PL-480 ASSISTANCE FOR PERU.

5. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION, AND OLD PRESIDENT REAGAN OF HIS GREAT SATISFACTION WITH THE ONTRIBUTION AND EFFORTS OF THE AID PROGRAM IN PERU. HE AID HE WAS ALSO PLEASED BY THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE NTER-AMERICAN DEVELOPMENT BANK AND THE WORLD BANK. OWEVER, HE BELIEVED THAT ALL EXTERNAL DONORS NEEDED TO

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LOWER THEIR REQUIREMENTS FOR COUNTERPART FUNDS, BECAUSE IF THEY WERE TOO HIGH, THE GOVERNMENT COULD NOT MEET THEM AND THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE DONGRS SIMPLY COULD NOT BE LSED. AMBASSADOR JORDAN POINTED OUT THAT AID'S DISASTER ELIEF ASSISTANCE THIS YEAR WAS DESIGNED TO HELP THE COVERNMENT MEET ITS COUNTERPART REQUIREMENTS FOR IBRD PROJECTS, THEREBY TRIGGERING THE RELEASE OF IBRD PROJECT UNDS.

HOSE THAT NEEDED TO BE DISCUSSED IN APRIL AT THE MEETING IN THE DEBT PROBLEM AND ASSOCIATED ECONOMIC PROBLEMS. HE AID THAT IT WAS NECESSARY TO FOCUS ON THE WEED'S AND ROBLEMS OF THE LESS DEVELOPED COUNTRIES AND TO CONSIDER HEIR PERCEPTION OF WHAT CAN BE DONE TO RESUME ECONOMIC ROWTH. THE IFI'S AND THE DONORS HAD MADE THEIR VIEWS NOWN; NOW IT WAS IMPORTANT TO HEAR FROM THE RECIPIENT OUNTRIES. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE COMMENTED THAT THIS WILL BE A VERY IMPORTANT MEETING.

L7. BELAUNDE THEN EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN MIGHT VISIT PERU SOME DAY. PERU MOULD BE VERY MONORED TO RECEIVE PRESIDENT REAGAN IF HE COULD FIND THE TIME TO VISIT. PRESIDENT REAGAN NOTED THAT BEFORE HIS ELECTION HE HAD NEVER TRAVELLED FURTHER SOUTH THAN MEXICO. BUT SINCE HIS ELECTION HE HAD VISITED BRAZIL AND COLOMBIA AND CENTRAL AMERICA IN ADDITION TO MEXICO.

LO. PRESIDENT REAGAN EXPRESSED HIS BELIEF THAT THE COUNTRIES OF THE AMERICAS HAD MUCH IN COMMON THAT SHOULD SERVE TO BRING ALL OF THEM TOGETHER. RELATIONSHIPS WITHIN THE AMERICAS HAD NEVER BECOME AS CLOSE AND AS STRONG AS THEY SHOULD HAVE OR AS THEY COULD BE IF EVERYBODY WORKED AT IT. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE RECALLED THAT PERU HAD BENEFITTED SIGNIFICANTLY FROM THE CONTRIBUTION OF INDIVIDUAL AMERICAN CITIZENS. HE ATTRIBUTED THE CONSTRUCTION OF PERU'S RAILROAM SYSTEM TO A FORMER CALIFORNIAN WHO HAD FLED TO SOMITH AMERICA BECAUSE OF GAMBLING DEBTS. HE ALSO MENTIONED OTHER AMERICAN CONTRIBUTORS, PARTICULARLY SCIENTISTS SUCH AS ARCHAEOLOGISTS AND EXPLORERS.

HELPFUL AS POSSIBLE. HE ASKED ABOUT PERU'S MILITARY SUPPLY RELATIONSHIP WITH THE SOVIET UNION. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE RECALLED THAT IN HIS TIRST PRESIDENCY HE HAD WORKED CLOSELY WITH AMBASSADOR JONES TO ENSURE THAT THE U.S. WAS THE PRIMARY SOURCE OF PERUVIAN MILITARY EQUIPMENT. HOWEVER, THE U.S. HAD DECIDED THAT IT WOULD

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OT BE APPROPRIATE FOR THE PERUVIAN AIR FORCE TO ACQUIRE -5 AIRCRAFT. CONSEQUENTLY PERU HAD PURCHASED BIRAGES ROM FRANCE. LATER, UNDER THE SILLITARY GOVERNMENT, THE IR FORCE ENTERED INTO A SUPPLY RELATIONSHIP WITH THE OVIET UNION. BELAUNDE SAID HE SOULD LIKE TO SEE ALL OF HE SOVIET HILITARY EQUIPMENT IN PERU REPLACED BY -5.-ORIGIN EQUIPMENT; HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE U.S. UPPLIERS RETURN. THE ARMY IS HOW INTERESTED IN COULRING BLACKHAWK HELICOPTERS AND THE PRESIDENT HOPED HIS COULD BE ACCOMPLISHED. THE PERUVIAN AIR FORCE IS MALL AND IS NOT TRYING TO EXPAND ITS SIZE BUT IS ALWAYS AGER TO REPLACE ITS OLDER PLANFS. THE PERUVIAN MAVY IS LOSELY TIED TO THE UNITED STATES AND PARTICIPATED IN THE NITAS EXERCISE A FEW MONTHS AGG.

. O. SECRETARY REGAN ASKED ABOUT PRESIDENT BELAUNDE'S EETING WITH IMF MANAGING DIRECTOR DE LAROSIERE ELAUNDE SAID IT WAS POSITIVE BUT THERE WERE SOME IFFERENCES IN VIEW. HE SAID THE INF IS UNDER THE HPRESSION THAT PERU IS NOT DOING ENOUGH WHEN IN FACT IT S BOING AS HUCH AS IT CAN. SOME OF THE TARGETS MAY HAVE FEEN SET TOO LOW. HE WAS CERTAIN THE FISCAL DEFICIT FOULD BE LESS THAN THE CURRENTLY PROJECTED 30 PERCENT, FOSSIBLY & PERCENT, BUT THE 4-1 PERCENT TARGET WAS TOO OW. BELAUNDE SAID SOME OF THE PEOPLE AT THE IMP DO NOT CONSIDER THE SOCIAL AND POLITICAL IMPACT OF THE ECONOMIC FEASURES THEY RECOMMEND. FOR EYAMPLE, GASOLINE IS SOLD IT THE SAME PRICE IN PERU AS THE UNITED STATES EVEN THOUGH PERU PRODUCES ITS OWN PETROLEUM. IF THE GOP WERE TO RAISE THESE PRICES IT WOULD INCREASE THE PRICE OF FUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND PEOPLE MOULS RIGT AND BURN FUSES, UNLIKE IN THE UNITED STATES, WHERE THE PUBLIC FUIETLY ACCEPTS INCREASES IN TRANSPORTATION COSTS. THESE THE THINGS THE FINANCIAL EXPERTS DO NOT UNDERSTANDS THEY DOK ONLY AT NUMBERS.

FIRST SECRETARY REGAN SAID THAT IF PERU CAN END THE YEAR FITH A L PERCENT DEFICIT THAT PROBABLY WOULD BE CEPTABLE TO THE IMP AND THE BANKERS.

PRESIDENT BELAUNDE SAID THAT BETWEEN NOW AND JULY 1 PRAY YEAR, PERU WILL NEED TO REPAY THE BANKS DOLS 3 FILLION. TO DO THAT PERU WILL NEED A BRIDGE LOAN OF DOLS 100 MILLION, DOLS 100 MILLION A MONTH FOR THREE MONTHS EIGINNING IN FEBRUARY OF 1785. THAT WOULD SOLVE MANY SERIOUS PROBLEMS AND EASE A LOT OF THE POLITICAL RESSURES. PERU WOULD BE ASKING FOR EXACTLY THE SAME IND OF ASSISTANCE THAT WAS PROVIDED TO ARGENTINA, MEXICO AND BRAZIL. SECRETARY REGAN POINTED OUT THAT BRAZIL AND

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EXICO HAB TAKEN STEPS TO REDUCE GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES, HCREASE REVENUES AND REDUCE INFLATION. WERE PERU TO DO HE SAME, THE BANKS MIGHT WELL BE FORTHCOMING TO IT AS ELL. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE SAID HE BID NOT UNDERSTAND THE TITUDE OF THE BANKS. RECENTLY PERU HAD REQUESTED A OLS JOD MILLION LOAN WHICH IT LEEDED TO MAKE A DOLS JUSTICION PAYMENT TO THE BANKS. HOWEVER, THE BANKS HAD EFUSED. SECRETARY REGAN SAID HE BANKS ARE TAKING THEIR DE FROM THE IMF.

3. PRESIDENT BELAUNDE CONGRATULATED PRESIDENT REAGAN ON HE SUCCESS OF HIS ADMINISTRATION. HE SAID THAT, JUST IKE PRESIDENT REAGAN, HE ENJOYLD THE FULL CONFIDENCE OF IS PEOPLE. HE COULD GO ANYWHERE IN PERU AND WHILD ECEIVE A WARM WELCOME. PRESIDENT REAGAN AND PRESIDENT ELAUNDE THEN EXCHANGED COURTESY REMARKS AND THE MEETING AS TERMINATED.

The State Department has proposed that President Reagan meet with President Belaunde in Washington between October 1 and 5. Belaunde will be at the UNGA immediately before those dates; he is unable to be in New York during the President's visit.

A presidential meeting with Belaunde would be very desirable. Belaunde is a model in Latin America of democratic rule and moderate economic policies. The Andean region--particularly Peru and Bolivia -- is emerging as the Latin American region of greatest concern and policy focus after Central America. Peru poses some serious challenges for us: growing Soviet presence, the "Shining Path" insurgency, deep recession, narcotics, and April 1985 elections in which unfriendly elements could win.

A presidential meeting with Belaunde would be a good opportunity to demonstrate that USG interest in developing democracy in the hemisphere extends beyond Central america. It is a noteworthy coincidence that Jimmy Carter will be visiting Peru during the same dates and would be received by Belaunde if the Peruvian President does not stay on here to meet with Reagan.

SUBJECT: Appointment Request for President Belaunde of Peru with the President

President Fernando Belaunde Terry will be in the United States September 27 to October 5, and will be addressing the United Nations September 29. Belaunde's wife will accompany him. His Ambassador here tells us that Belaunde would very much appreciate a meeting with President Reagan between October 1 and 5, preferably at the beginning of this period, in Washington. Unfortunately, he cannot be in New York at the same time as President Reagan, since his Congress granted him permission to leave Peru only on September 27 and then went into recess.

Belaunde reluctantly had to cancel a State Visit to the United States in November 1982 after the atmosphere was poisoned when a trade dispute flared into a cause celebre in Lima. Belaunde has pursued political and economic policies we favor during a term marked by severe recession, leftist terrorism and growing popular pressure for more radical solutions. He is well-respected in U.S. academic and Hispanic circles after having spent twelve years in exile here during the radical military regime which deposed him in 1968 and which he succeeded in 1980.

The timing is right for a meeting now with Belaunde, the dean of South American democratic leaders who is preparing Peru's first constitutional transfer of power in 40 years. A meeting would give the President a unique opportunity to manifest his support for Peruvian and Latin democracy and moderate economic policies as Peru moves toward next spring's elections. The Department recommends that Belaunde make an office call on the President during the period October 1-5 in Washington.
