This memorandum describes the evaluations proposed for assessing achievements and progress made during Phases I and II on Presidential priorities described in the President's Strategic Plan, and for providing information needed for Phase III decisions. It is critical that the specific Presidential activities planned or considered for the next several months be coordinated with the President's policy agenda, and not solely as reactions to problems and issues raised by others.

With this in mind, a series of thoughtful evaluations should be performed to provide reliable and valid data for decision-making and policy development, and to guide the Phase III policy focus described in Strategic Planning Memorandum #1.

The information derived from each evaluation should aid in coordination of policies consistent with the President's commitments. In addition, the evaluations should help to improve the management of the policy and decision-making processes within the Executive Office of the President. Though Phase II is not over until September 30, 1981, some evaluation results will be due prior to then so as to support early related events. Also, some of the topics that should be evaluated are to be stressed more in Phases III and IV than they have been in Phases I and II. Thus, the results should be useful in Phase III planning and strategy development.

Separate recommendations are made for evaluations that should be performed by OPE and those that should be performed by other organizations or individuals.

Evaluation Topics

A careful review of the Strategic Plan and Strategic Planning Memorandum #1 suggests a broad list of topics for which evaluations should be performed. The topics were selected on the basis of their importance and the need for information about them for Phase III decisions and actions.

Attachment A lists the topics of the evaluations proposed. For each topic the following are suggested:

o <u>Questions</u>. Each evaluation should provide answers to general or specific questions, e.g., what has been accomplished?, or what actions are needed? Some basic questions about each topic are suggested.

- o <u>Responsibility</u>. An individual or group of individuals should be responsible for the detailed design and completion of each evaluation. Recommendations for lead responsibility on each topic are included.
- o <u>Type Evaluation</u>. Suggestions are made as to the type of evaluation that might be performed for each topic.
- o <u>Product(s)</u>. It is important to specify the product(s) intended from each evaluation. Most will be reports, though some will also include briefings.
- o <u>Due Date</u>. Due dates are recommended for each product.
- o Related Events. For each topic, several related events the evaluation may help to shape are indicated.

Types of Evaluations

Four major types of evaluations are proposed. Some are not evaluations in the strictest sense of the term. That is, they do not include the use of "grades", nor do they place blame or criticism on specific individuals or organizations. They do, however, include the use of some rigor in the design and conduct of the project, and in some instances result in findings, conclusions and/or recommendations. The four types are:

- 1. Strategic Plan Analyses. These are analyses of policy areas, goals, issues and activities referenced in the Strategic Plan. Specific emphasis is on analyzing results or achievements associated with major Presidential priorities, including those stressed in Phases I and II and those planned for Phase III. Strategic Plan Analyses will provide conclusions and recommendations, and are intended to be broader in scope than policy audits, for which more detail is provided below. Methods of inquiry will parallel those used in many program evaluations, and final products will include statements of purpose and scope, brief descriptions of methodology, and listings of findings, conclusions, and recommendations. A wide variety of methods may be employed in performing these analyses. An example report format is included as Attachment B-1.
- 2. Policy Audits. Policy audits are relatively thorough reviews of specific policies which have been announced and which have proceeded through several stages of implementation. The purpose of a policy audit is to evaluate 1) the activities performed in developing and implementing the policy, and 2) the impact a policy has had. These will be compared against established goals, expectations, and standards. Findings, conclusions, and recommendations will be developed. The primary difference from analyses is that policy audits are much more precise, limited evaluations whose design and execution tightly adhere to an audit plan. An example Policy Audit report format is included as Attachment B-2.
- 3. Activity Summaries. Activity Summaries are compilations of data and statistics pertaining to major policy areas, goals, issues, activities, policies and strategies. Conclusions or recommendations will not necessarily be included.

The primary purpose of Activities Summaries is to provide supporting data for analyses, policy audits, or surveys; however, they may be used to focus discussion of decisions or actions under consideration. An attempt will be made to keep Activity Summaries relatively "value free", that is, they will be rid of bias to the degree possible. An example Activity Summary report format is included as Attachment B-3.

4. <u>Surveys</u>. Surveys are interviews or questionnaires administered to individuals carefully selected for their knowledge or importance to one or more Presidential policy areas, goals, activities, issues, policies or strategies. Surveys will employ standard methods in their design and execution. The purpose is to collect and display information that reflects subjective views on results of decisions and actions. These data will be useful in discussion and decision-making on future strategies. Surveys will ordinarily include interpretations and analyses, as well as suggestions as to how the findings should be treated and used. An example Survey report format is included as Attachment B-4.

These four categories should enhance selection of the most appropriate evaluation method from among relatively differing methods. While other methods are available, one of these four should satisfy the needs currently envisioned. Attachments B-1 through B-4 contain suggested outlines of the four types of evaluations.

Balance

There should be some balance between evaluations of the President's "proactive" agenda and those of the "reactive" strategies and actions required in response to unplanned agenda items. There should also be a balance among evaluations of policies handled by various processes, e.g., Cabinet Councils, Task Forces, White House staff, departments and agencies, Presidential Commissions, etc.

OPE Role

OPE will perform selected evaluations, and will manage or participate in others. The following are areas in which OPE can assist:

- 1. Selection and management of an evaluation team
- Selection of evaluation methods
- 3. Identification of expected results
- 4. Determination of data indicators
- 5. Data collection methods
- 6. Analytic or processing techniques
- 7. Presentation formats
- Scheduling

Phase III Policy Review

Most of the evaluations should be completed by the beginning of Phase III on October 1, 1981, with all completed by October 31, 1981. A Phase III Policy Review Meeting of White House Senior Staff should be held on October 31 with a follow-up meeting with the President and others during the second week of November 1981. The purpose of the Phase III Policy Review is to develop policies prior to the President's Fall review of agency and OMB budget recommendations, and the framing of the FY 1983-86 budget message.

The results of evaluations should contribute valuable information, recommendations and structure to the policy and decision-making processes for Phases III and IV. All evaluation topics are consistent with the Strategic Plan and Strategic Planning Memorandum #1.

Recommendations

- 1. It is recommended that the inventory of topics in Attachment A be reviewed, and a number of them selected and assigned for completion. OPE specifically recommends policy audits of the following:
 - Immigration
 - Social Security
 - Clean Air
 - Thrift Industry

These were selected because different "tracks" were used for their development and implementation. The evaluations (audits) should provide valuable information on policy problems encountered and means for avoiding future difficulties. OPE will assist in the design and/or management of these policy audits if desired.

- 2. It is recommended that OPE conduct evaluations of the following:
 - Cabinet Council Processes
 - Coalitions in the House of Representatives
 - Foreign Visits
 - State-of-the-Union Addresses and Messages

Separate evaluation plans will be prepared for each of these, and results will be provided in special reports.
