## Border/Employer Documents/Inspection

- Consider establishing separate passageways for vehicular/foot traffic at Mexican land borders for U.S. citizens and aliens
- Improve method for counting Mexican border crossings by category (e.g., establish border entry identification system that provides each entrant with cards containing electronic coding that is inspected at each crossing; use turnstiles)
- Inspect documents of all aliens at entry
- Reissue Mexican border crossing permits (I-444) annually and require that all persons over 18 possess their own permit
- Have a photograph/thumb print placed on all alien entry documents
- Require that employers check entry permits of aliens (at hire and periodically) and hire only those authorized to work

## Deportation

- Deport more illegal aliens who have given birth to children in the U.S.
- Deport more legal/illegal alines who are involved in other criminal acts and tighten controls over reentry of those deported back into the U.S.
