- -- I appreciate the opportunity for a dialogue with You WHO ARE this distinguished group of county officials.
- THAT WE MICHO

 -- of want to reaffirm my commitment to establish a working partnership with you as we attempt to solve our nation's economic problems.
- as you know, restoring a balance between the Federal government and other levels of government is a priority of this Administration. The White House Intergovernmental Affairs Office, under the leadership of Rich Williamson, will be playing a key role as liaison to you.
