Secondary Party and White House Staff be in place at Diplomatic Entrance by 10:20 a.m. (See Tab A)

Presidential Guest pins will be issued to all Official and Secondary Party members. Please wear this pin at all times during the visit.

DEPARTURE FOR CAMP DAVID

See Motorcade and Helo Manifest. Please proceed directly to your assigned vehicle and helo.

ARRIVAL CAMP DAVID

You will be escorted to Laurel Lodge.

LUNCHEON

See Page 6 for those having lunch at Aspen. All others (Tab I) will lunch at Laurel with the exception of support staff who will be served lunch in Mess Hall.

MEETING

All members of Official and Secondary Parties not in meetings with the Presidents will attend sessions in Laurel Lodge.

BARBEQUE

All Official and Secondary Parties should proceed to Aspen at 6:30 p.m. sharp. DRESS CASUAL (NO TIE).
Rooms will be provided for change of attire.

MONDAY P.M. DEPART CAMP DAVID

At the conclusion of barbeque all persons not remaining overnight at Camp David will be transported from Aspen to helo landing zone. (See Tabs K and L for assigned helos.) Helos will land in Washington at Monument Grounds where transportation will be provided.

TUESDAY A.M. CAMP DAVID GUESTS

Breakfast will be served for support staff beginning at 7:00 a.m. in Mess Hall. Those not attending breakfast meeting at Aspen Lodge will be served breakfast at 8:00 a.m. at Laurel Lodge. 






