

I. PURPOSE

Mayor Maynard Jackson (D-Atlanta) would like to personally thank you for the assistance the city has received for the Atlanta murder investigation.

II. BACKGROUND

Twenty-eight black children have been killed in Atlanta since July, 1979. You established an inter-agency task force on February 21, 1981, to coordinate Federal and local efforts in the investigation. The Federal government has granted \$4,136,000 to Atlanta and surrounding areas. (See Attachment I - Fact Sheet)

- March 5, The President announced that the federal government would provide \$979,000, basically from Juvenile Justice funds, to assist Atlanta in a wide range of programs. In addition to this, the federal government allotted:

\$38,000 from LEAA for technical assistance

\$258,000 from the U.S. Public Health Service (mental health care)

Indiv. Depart. Funds \$46,000 from the U.S. Public Health Service for technical assistance to make the service more effective

\$100,000 from the Department of Education for the schools to train the teachers to recognize problems

The Center for Communicable Disease provides aid concerning the traits of the victims -- \$26,000

The Community Relations Service provides -- \$8,000

Previously announced LEAA grants re-programmed -- \$21,000

March 13, \$1.5 million for additional and overtime police assistance

June 15, \$1.160 million for "Safe Summer" Parks and Recreation program for Atlanta, Fulton, and DeKalb Counties

TOTAL ADMINISTRATION OUTLAY: \$4,136,000



SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH MAYOR MAYNARD JACKSON

- -- Welcome Mayor Jackson and let him know you are pleased he could come on such short notice.
- -- The Nation has been appalled by the tragic murders of the 28 children.
- -- Reiterate your statement of March 13th -- "I want the people fo Atlanta and the Nation to know that my Administration is doing and will continue to do what we can to help bring an end to this tragedy."
- -- Tell him you are pleased that progress has apparently been made in the investigation with respect to at least one of the killings.
- -- If the Mayor should request more Federal funds:
 - -- remind him that you have already committed over \$4 million;
 - -- the Federal government will continue to provide technical assistance.
- -- Ask him how the "Safe Summer" parks and recreation program is going.

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
