ATTACHMENT #II

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH COUNTY OFFICIALS  
JULY 1, 1981

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- Welcome. I appreciate this opportunity to meet with you.
  
- I want to say how much I appreciate your support of my economic recovery program -- particularly the policy statement adopted at your NACo meeting here in March.
  
- I think you probably know how pleased I am with the victory on the budget in the House last week. Many county officials were very helpful in that effort, and I am grateful for that support.
  
- What that budget reflects is a reordering of priorities so that the national budget reflects truly national needs.
  
- It also includes a series of block grants, free from the burden of federal control and regulations, replacing literally scores of categorical grant programs.
  
- We firmly believe that state and local officials, such as yourselves, are every bit as competent and caring and compassionate as those in Washington, D.C. And, you have the advantage of being closer to the people and, therefore, more accountable to the voters and more aware of the particular needs in your area.

- The next step in our Economic Recovery Program will be to achieve enactment of our tax cuts. This effort is directly connected to the block grants because I consider block grants to be just an interim step. My ultimate goal is to give state and local governments virtually total freedom in the areas covered by the block grants, by returning revenue sources which have up to now been usurped by the federal government.
  
- A vital step in that effort is to reduce the oppressive level of federal taxation.
  
- We have also established a Cabinet Council working group, under the leadership of Secretary Regan, to look at revenue return issues. I have asked Rich Williamson to ensure that there is full and genuine consultation with county officials and other state and local representatives as we proceed in this area.
  
- But, I came to this meeting principally to hear from you, and I would, therefore, like to open the discussion up for your questions and comments.
