I. PURPOSE

To comply with a request of Senator Cochran to visit with you in order to discuss the Voting Rights Act extension and a vacancy on the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals.

II. BACKGROUND

Senator Cochran is an important Republican Senator on the Senate Appropriations Committee and the Senate Agriculture Committee. He has requested this meeting with you in order to discuss his concerns regarding extension of the Voting Rights Act and his personal interest in the appointment of the next member of the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals.

Senator Cochran favors extension of the Voting Rights Act with two modifications: (1) the extension should be nationwide; and (2) the jurisdiction for pre-clearance should be placed in the Federal district courts rather than the Justice Department. Cochran believes it is a political fact of life that the Voting Rights Act cannot be repealed. However, as the Senator from Mississippi, he cannot support extension of the Act in its present form as it singles out specific states, such as Mississippi, for scrutiny and review.

Cochran discussed his views on this subject with the Attorney General on July 2, 1981. At that time, he presented to the Attorney General a law review article, by a Mississippi jurist, which discussed and supported his views on modification and extension of the Act.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS
FOR MEETING WITH
SENATOR THAD COCHRAN OF MISSISSIPPI

- Your stated position on the Voting Rights Act is that you strongly favor protection of those rights which the Act seeks to protect, the question is whether or not the Act as it now stands is the proper vehicle for the protection of these rights. State that you are sensitive to the fact that certain features of the Act are inequitably aimed at certain parts of our country.
- State that you have requested the Attorney General to study the issue of extension of the Voting Rights Act, in all its aspects, and report back to you by October 1, 1981.
- Thank Senator Cochran for his recommendation of E. Grady Jolly to be appointed to the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals. State that you understand that the Justice Department is reviewing the qualifications of several individuals for appointment to this vacancy.
- Inform Senator Cochran of your instructions to the Attorney General with regard to appointments to the Circuit Courts of Appeals:
 - He should accept recommendations from interested Senators but it is not mandatory that these appointments, unlike District Court appointments, be from individuals recommended by a Senator.
 - While geographic representation on the Circuit Courts is an important factor in evaluating individuals for appointment to the bench, it should not be the determinative factor.
- State that you are looking for qualified and experienced men and women to appoint to the bench and you look forward to reviewing Justice's recommendations for the 5th Circuit.

PURPOSE: To meet with Willie Stargell to discuss sickle cell anemia and funding for the National Institute of Health.

BACKGROUND: Sickle cell anemia is a hereditary blood disease found predominately in Blacks. Its symptoms are similar to rheumatic fever, viral hepatitis and heart disease. Sickle cell anemia is one of the most common chronic illnesses among Black children. When both parents carry the sickle cell trait, there is a 25% chance of their children being born with the sickle cell trait. In the U.S. sickle cell anemia occurs in about one in 500 black births and about one in 12 Blacks carries the trait. Presently there is no cure for sickle cell anemia.

Mr. Stargell has started the Willie Stargell Foundation, which devotes the majority of its funds to research on sickle cell anemia.

The Health Service Administration (HSA) provides funds for services in sickle cell centers. HSA funding was maintained at \$3,567,000 for 1979, 1980 and 1981. However, in 1982 these programs will go into block grants. NIH, which provides research grants for sickle cell, will have a cut in its overall budget for FY 81, even though the President's original budget proposed an \$83 million increase.

Willie Stargell is a native of Earlsboro, Oklahoma. As a member of the Pittsburgh Pirates baseball team, he was named most valuable player of the 1979 World Series.

TALKING POINTS

- I am encouraged to see people like yourself who are nationally known and respected taking a leading role in fighting sickle cell anemia.
- In the nine years since sickle cell centers have been established, many advances have been made both in diagnosis and treatment but we still have a long way to go.
- A major job still exists in both education and research.
- The general feeling, right now, in the fight against sickle cell anemia is hope -- hope that scientific research will find a cure.
- The funds allocated for sickle cell research from the National Institute of Health will increase from \$26 million dollars for 1981 to \$28 million dollars for 1982.

I. PURPOSE

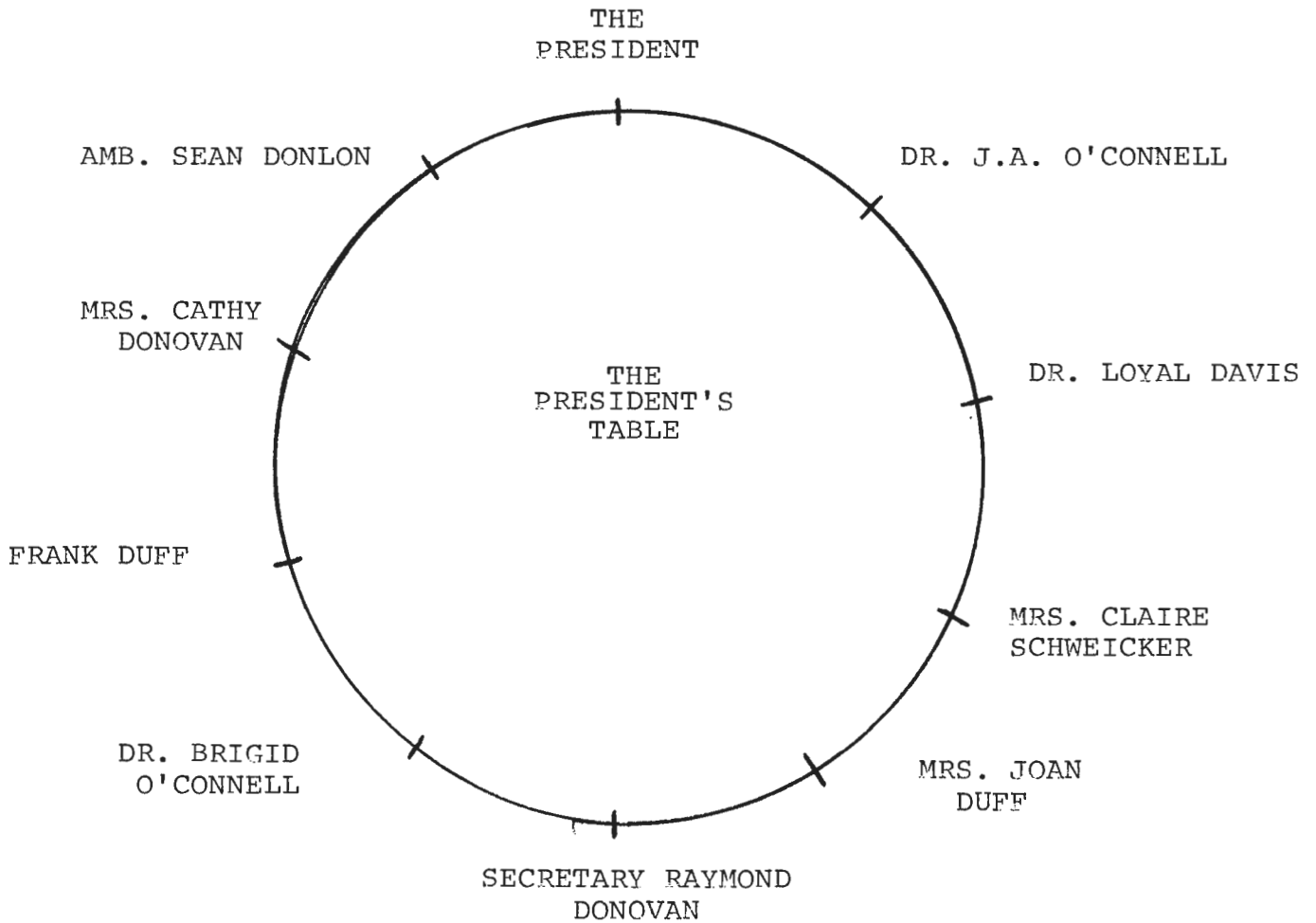
