I. PURPOSE

To thank Congressman Dicks for publicly committing himself to supporting the bipartisan tax bill.

II. BACKGROUND

Congressman Dicks represents the 6th District of Washington (Bremerton and Tacoma) and is serving his third term. Serves on the Defense and Interior Subcommittees of the Appropriations Committee.

As the result of a July 28 telephone conversation with the President, Congressman Dicks committed himself and publicly announced to supporting the Conable-Hance tax bill.

The Presidential speech generated a large number of calls to his Congressional office in support of the bipartisan bill.

He had not supported Gramm-Latta I or II.

He is a proponent of a stronger defense posture.
