I. PURPOSE

The Georgia Republican Party and the NRLA requested that The President attend and speak to a joint fund-raising reception while in Atlanta for the National Conference of State Legislators. The State Party and the NRLA support the President on the issues. There are no local issues that warrant the President's attention at this event.

III. PARTICIPANTS

Attending the reception will be major contributors to the Republican Party of Georgia, and members of the NRLA.

IV. PRESS PLAN

Press pool coverage, Georgia GOP Photographer to take candid photographs.

V. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

The President will be escorted from the holding room to Galleria entrance. After the announcement, he will proceed to the lecturn for brief remarks. Upon conclusion of remarks, he will proceed to mix and mingle with the approximately 200 attendees.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR RECEPTION
WITH THE GEORGIA REPUBLICAN PARTY AND
THE NATIONAL REPUBLICAN LEGISLATORS
ASSOCIATION

- Georgia has traditionally been predominately a one-party state.
- Election last November of the first Republican U.S. Senator in Georgia since Reconstruction - Mack Mattingly.
- Extraordinary response in Georgia to President Reagan's request to contact Congressmen on the tax cut. Substantial pressure has been placed by both Democrats and Republicans.
- The subject of the Voting Rights Act is very sensitive, and under no circumstances should it be discussed.
- The following congressmen are supporting The President's tax bill:
 - Doug Barnard (D-10CD)
 - Jack Brinkley (D-3CD)
 - Billy Lee Evans (D-8CD)
 - Newt Gingrich (R-6CD)
 - Charles Hatcher (D-2CD)
 - Larry McDonald (D-7CD)
 - Bo Ginn (D-1CD)
- Because power is being returned to the states, the role of the state legislator is very important to the success of the New Federalism.

BRIEF REMARKS: ATLANTA POLITICAL EVENT
JULY 30, 1981

These are exciting days for Republicans and all Americans. We have won our new beginning.

Fred and Chuck and all of you here, thank you for the support that made yesterday's victory possible. The adoption by the House of the bipartisan tax cut -- the first real tax cut for everyone in nearly 20 years -- was our most difficult accomplishment to date. It was not achieved by one man, one Administration or one party. This vote was won by and for all Americans.

The American people made the crucial difference Wednesday. Congressmen of both parties tell of being engulfed by phone calls and telegrams and other messages of support for our tax cut -- messages urging them to give our programs a chance.

It worked.

Americans proved yesterday they are not afraid to rely on themselves. They are not afraid to trust their own strength. They reaffirmed their belief that together, we can and we will straighten out this economic mess.

You can be proud of the efforts in Washington by Mack Mattingly and Newt Gingrich. I have relied on their help to design and implement the sweeping reversals of past, failed policies. With their continued help we will restore American prosperity.

Thomas Jefferson once said that ours was the kind of country that was "slow to move, yet when once in motion, its momentum becomes irresistible."

We are a people bound together not so much by land or blood but by free choice. We make the laws we must obey, but when they become oppressive, we can throw them off.

The movement we feel is the dynamic result of millions of individuals coming together, committed to preserving a society where we can each seek our own goals, assured of the freedom to climb as high as our own drive, ambition and talent can take us.

This generation has forged an historic coalition to strengthen our society and ensure it for generations to come.

It should be clear that men and women of both parties have joined this coalition, braving political threats to do so. Now we must work to strengthen our ties.

We are, after all, only beginning a recovery that will take many long months. Let those of us in office equal the example of the people we represent. We must not waver in our faith or we will betray it in others. We must not fail to lead or we will desert those who have shown us the way. Working together, with faith in each other, we can rid ourselves of the economic miseries we have known for so long.

Most of you are in State or local government and politics, and are well aware of the dissatisfaction the voters have

had with the way their country has been run. You are closer to them than faraway officials in a distant bureaucracy, and I will continue to rely on you for advice and counsel in the years ahead. I pledge my continued dedication to the return of as many powers and resources as can be effectively handled in the States.

Together we will return this Nation to the structure and principles we are supposed to live by. John Kennedy once asked us never to forget we are the heirs of that first revolution. We of this generation have just begun a revolution of our own, and wage its battles with the very same ideas.

When we grow tired, and we will, we should think of the people who gave us our ideas, and of the children to whom we hope to pass them. We will be renewed.

I. PURPOSE

To be interviewed by Lou Cannon for his book, which is a biography of the President.

II. BACKGROUND

The interview will concentrate on your sense of yourself -- your vision, roots, what you stand for. Cannon may have some general questions about Administration positions, but will not ask about anything specific that is still under review.

This is the first time since January 20 that Lou Cannon has interviewed you for his book. He did interview you once or twice during the campaign for it.
