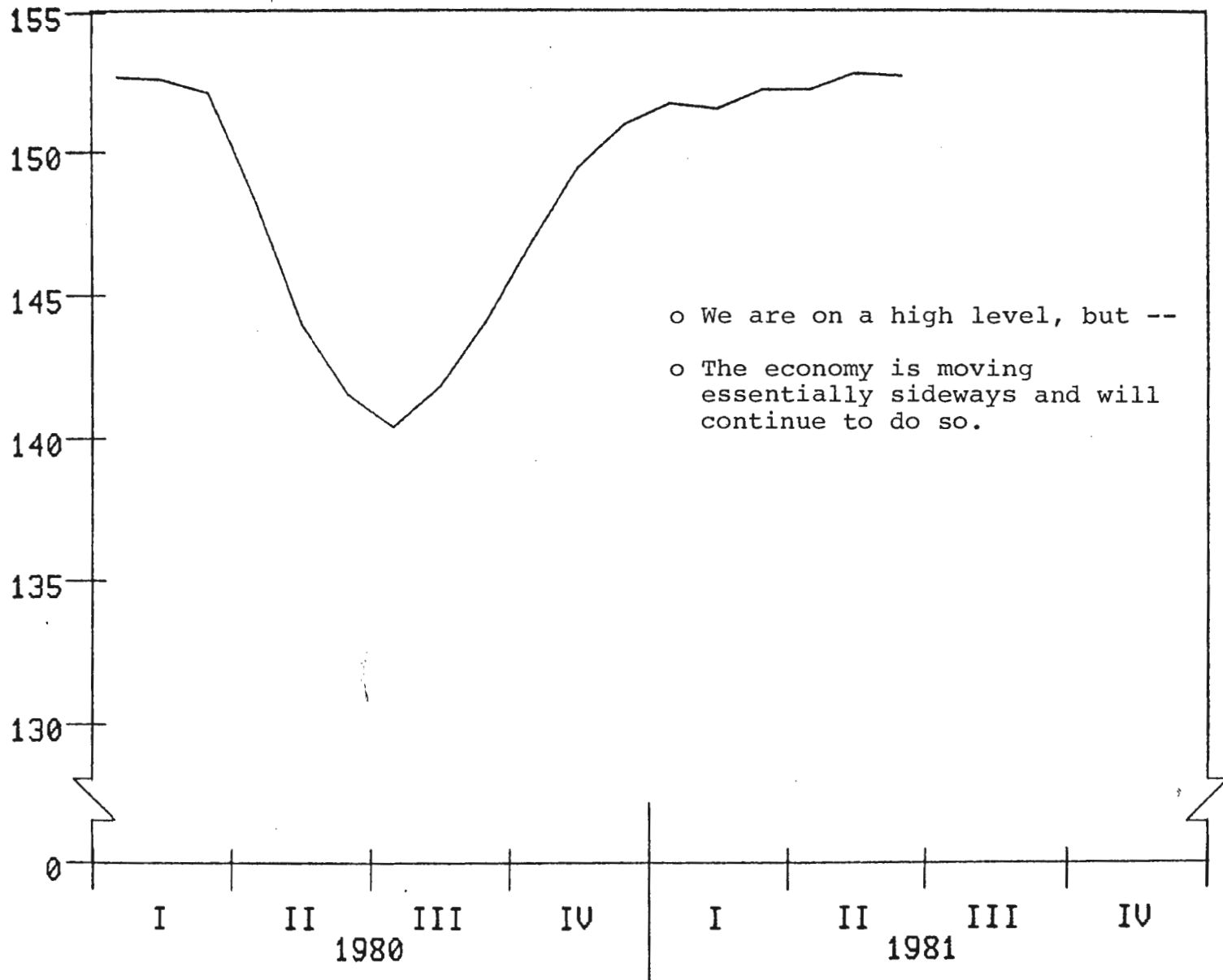

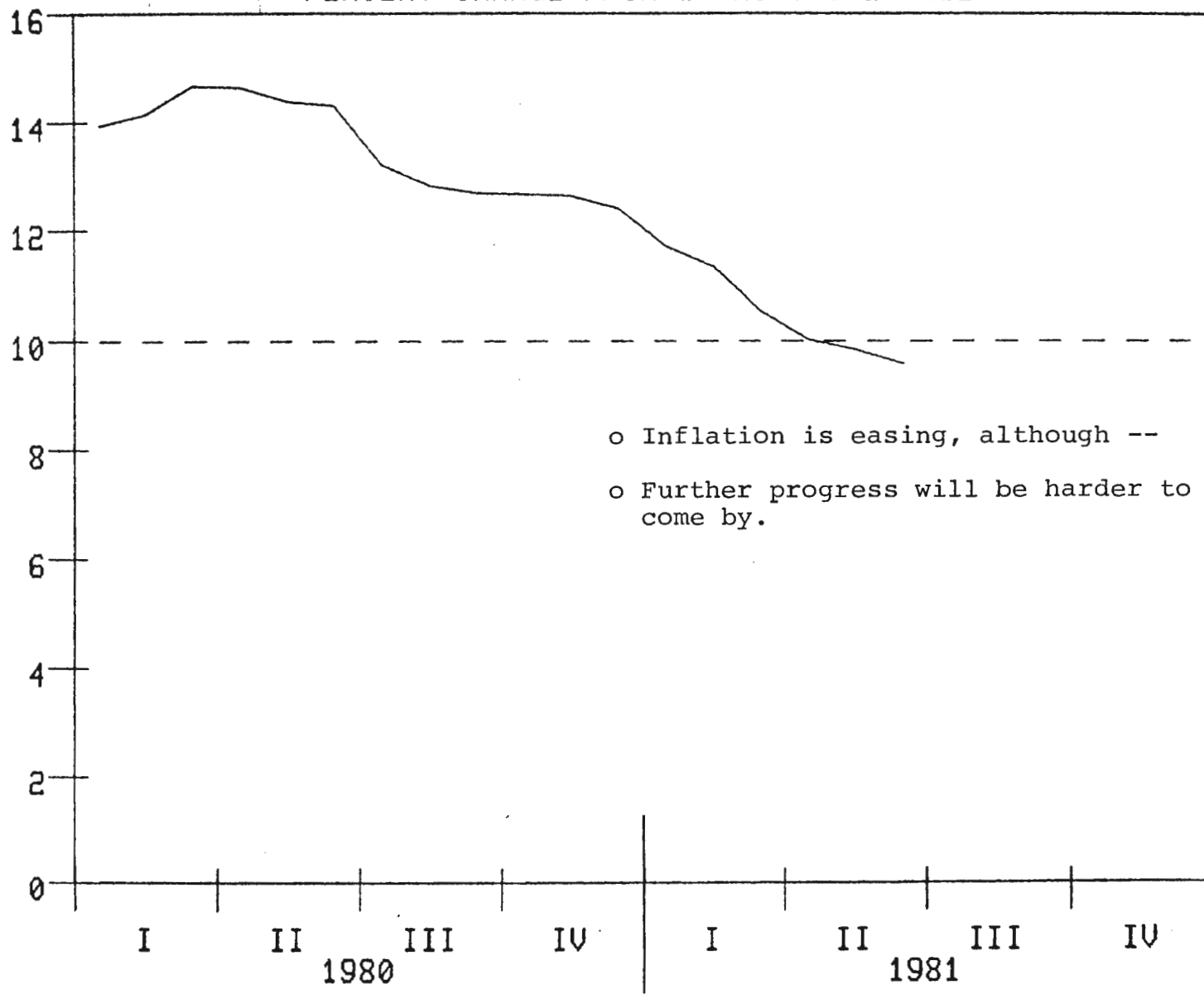
ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

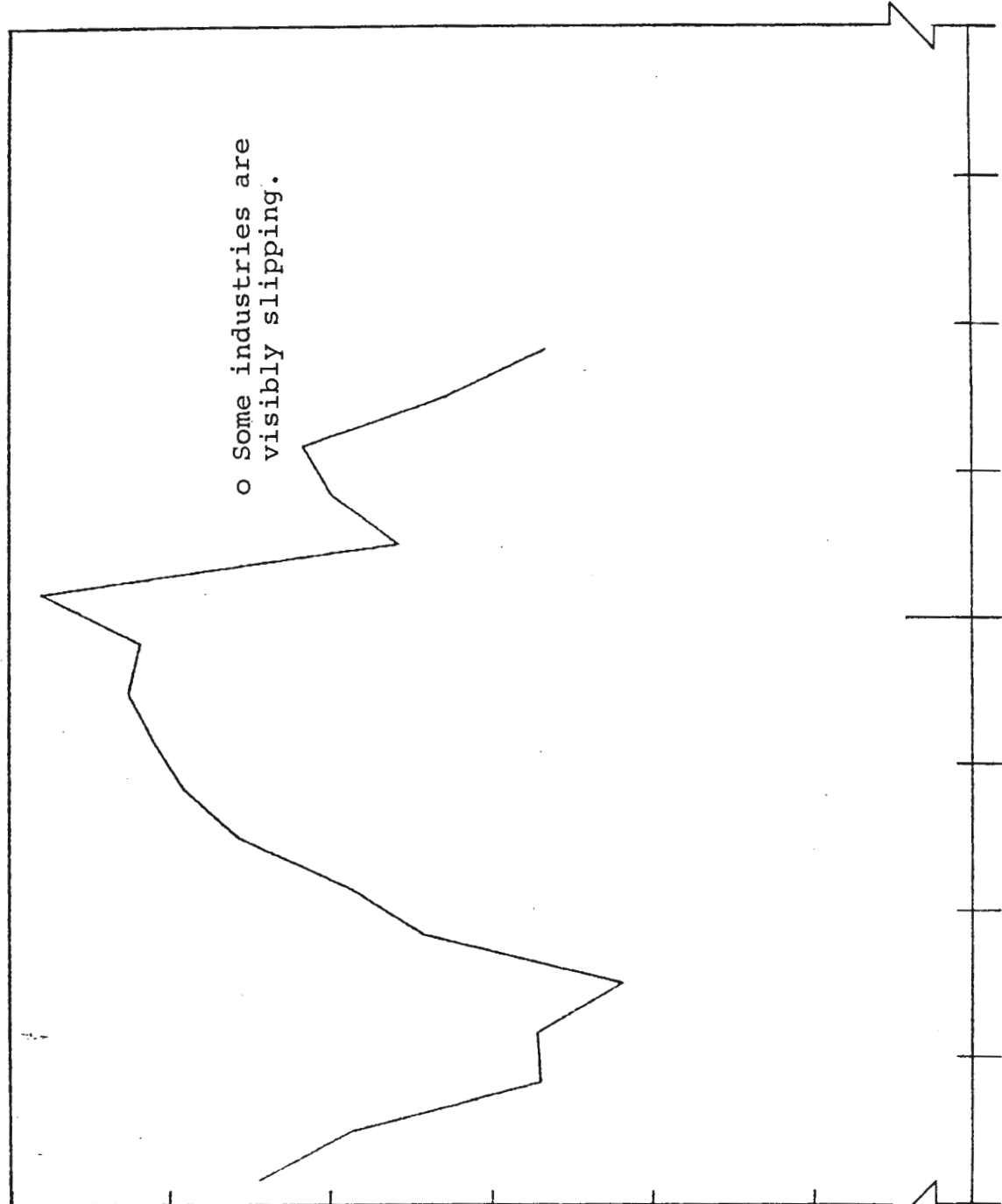

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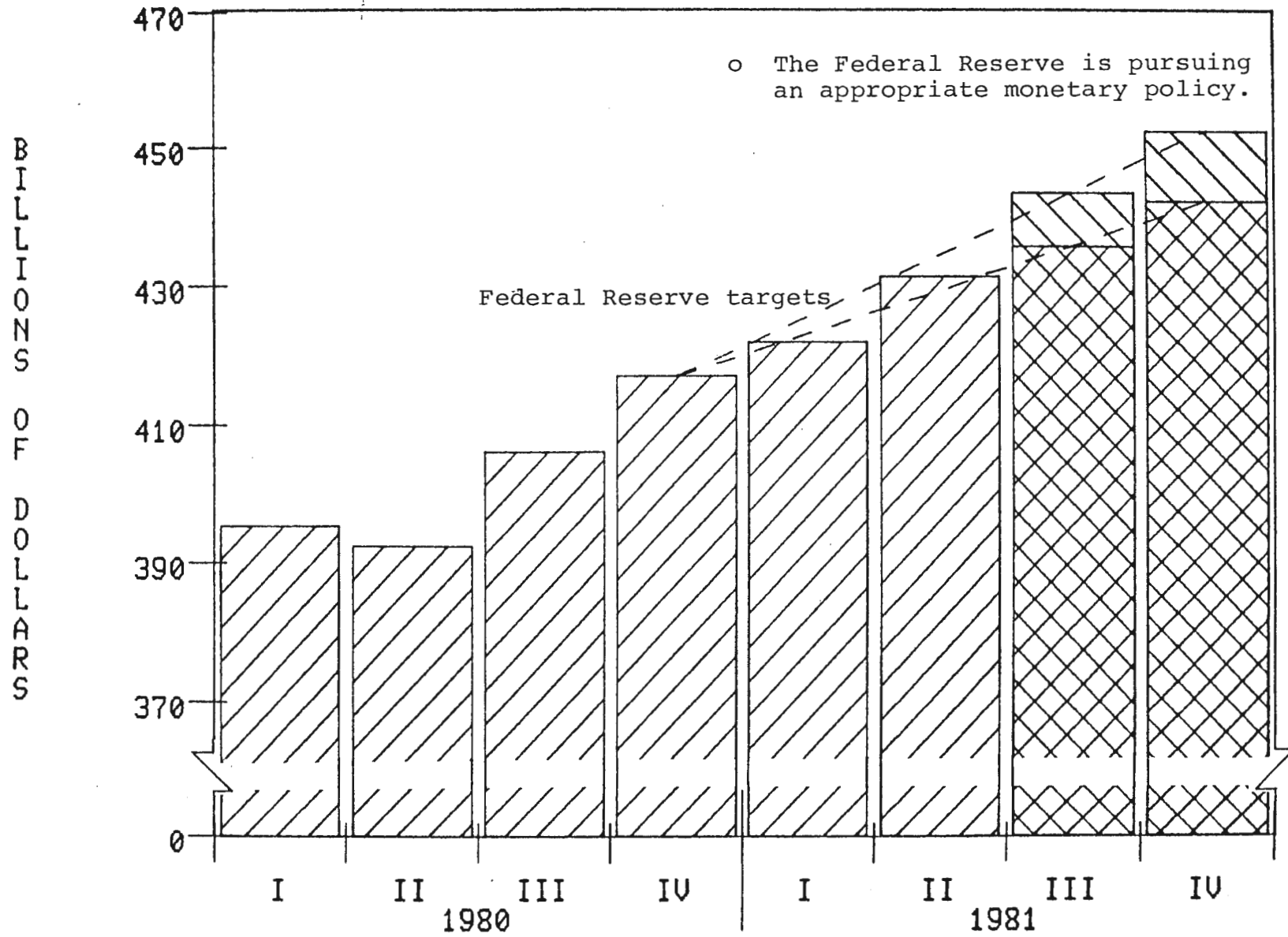

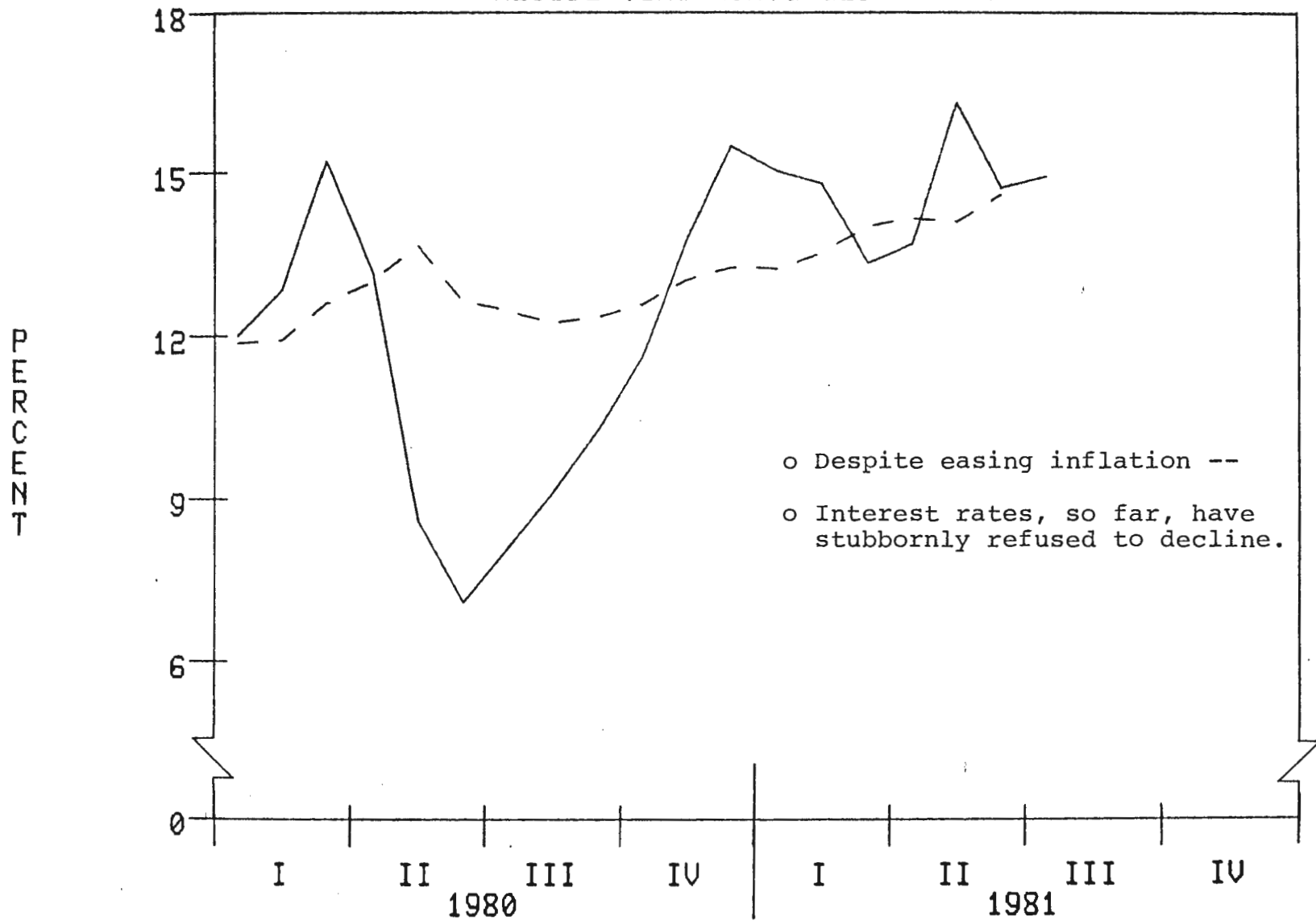

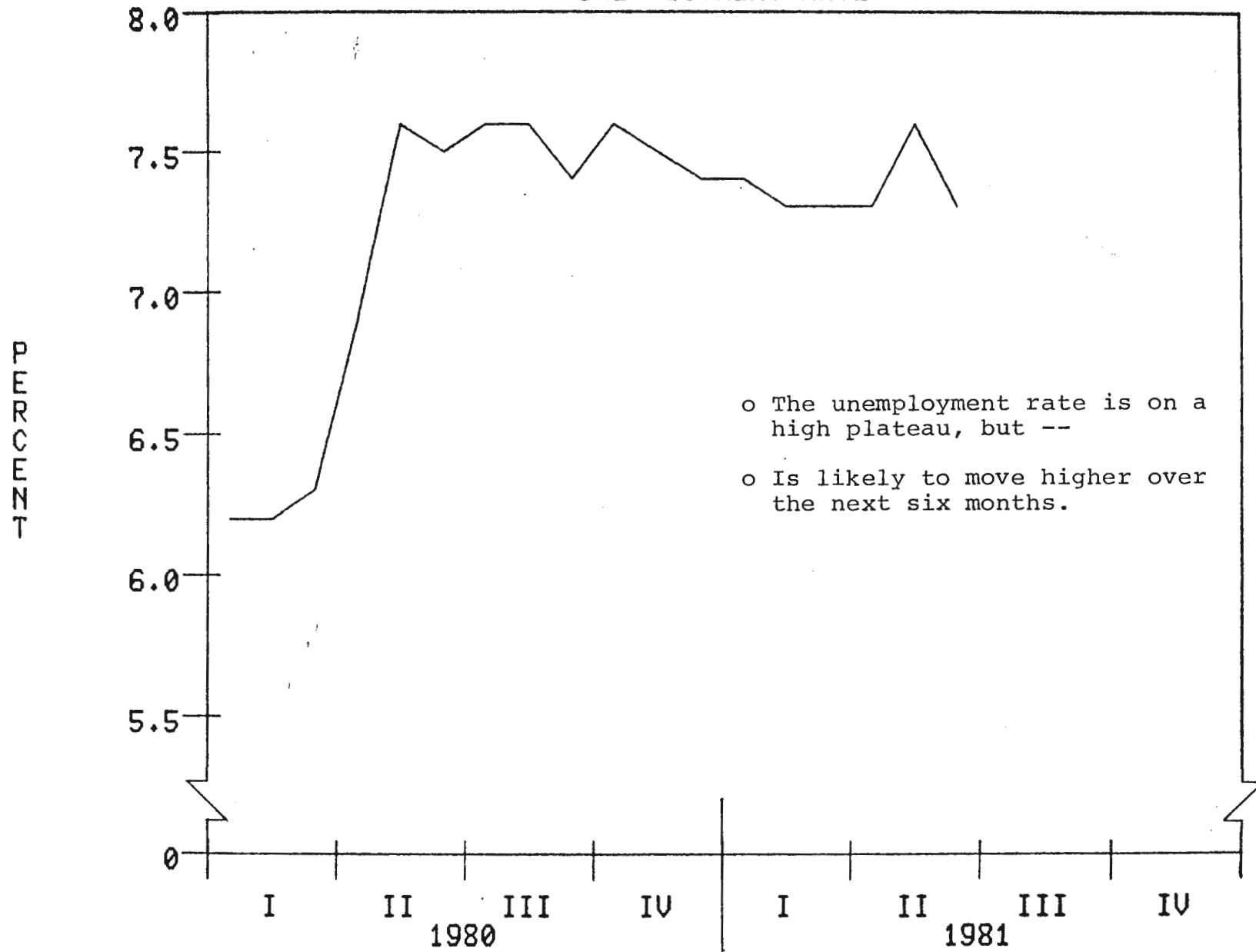
MONEY SUPPLY (M1B) QUARTERLY AVERAGE LEVELS

RESIDENTIAL MORTGAGES (----)

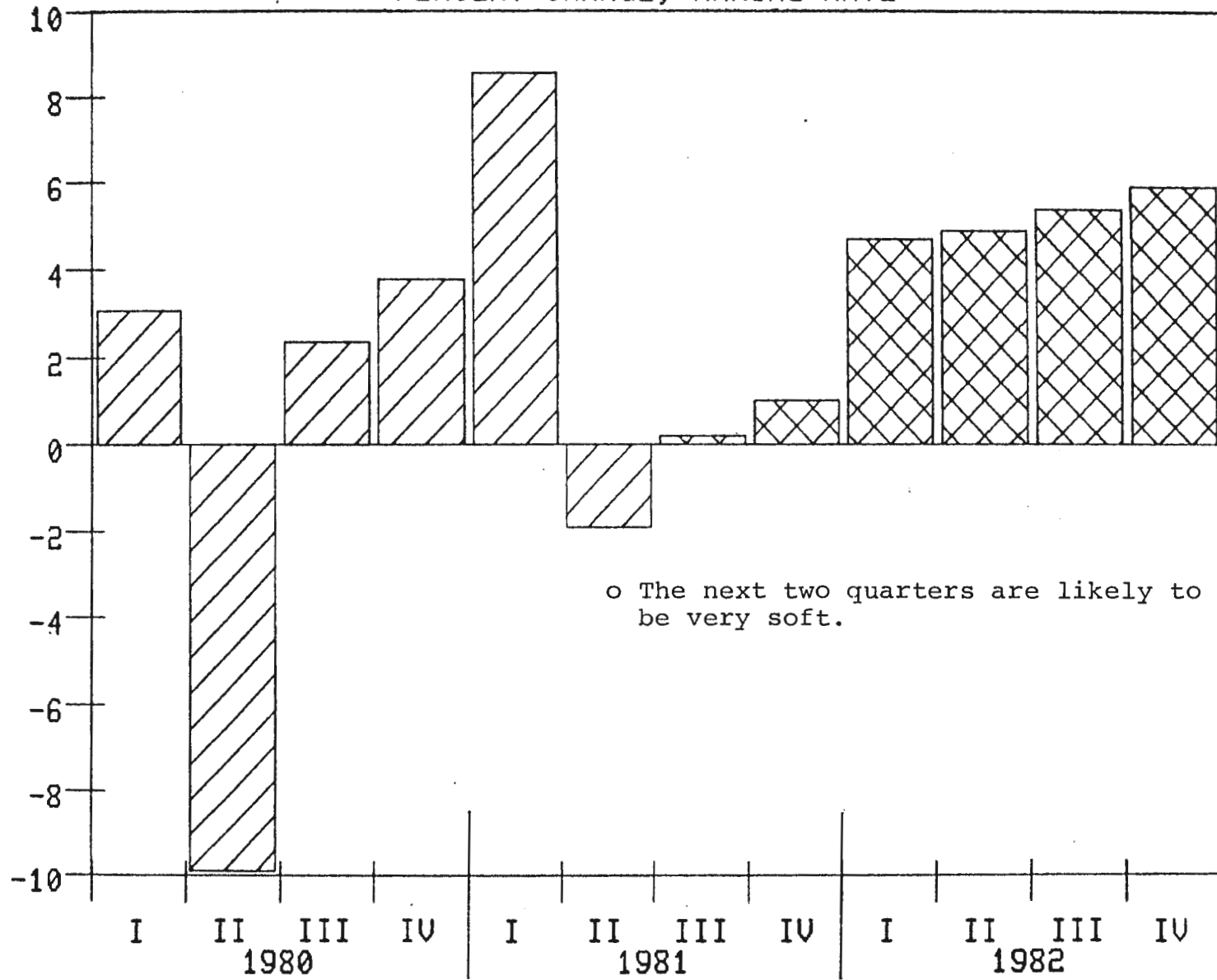


UNEMPLOYMENT RATE
