The Attorney General and the Solicitor General will have been seated at counsel table. They will wear formal morning clothes in the Courtroom. At 1:57 P.M. Mrs. Burger and Mrs. Reagan will be escorted to their seats in the Justices Box. At 1:58 P.M. Judge O'Connor will be escorted to the well of the Courtroom and seated in the John Marshall chair in front of the Clerk of the Court. The President of the United States is escorted to the traditional seat reserved to the President at 1:59 P.M. by the Marshal of the Court. AT 2:00 P.M. the Justices will enter the Courtroom, and as soon as they are seated, the Chief Justice will announce the special session of the Court.

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: This special session of the Court is held to receive the Commission of the newly appointed Associate Justice, Judge Sandra Day O'Connor. The Court recognizes the Attorney General of the United States.

(The Attorney General would then go to the Counsel lectern.)

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL: Mr. Chief Justice, and may it please the Court: I bear with me the Commission issued to Judge Sandra Day O'Connor as an Associate Justice of this Court. It has been duly signed by the President and attested by me as Attorney General. I move that the Clerk read this Commission and that it be made part of the permanent records of the Court.

(The Commission is handed to a Courtroom Attendant near the lectern.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Your motion is granted, Mr. Attorney General.

(The Commission having been handed to the Clerk of the Court by a Court Attendant, the Clerk then reads it for the record.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Mr. Clerk, will you kindly escort Judge O'Connor to the bench to take the oath?

(As Judge O'Connor is being escorted to the bench, the Chief Deputy Marshal will enter the rear center of the bench carrying the robe of the new Justice. He will stand to rear of the Chief Justice as the oath is administered; the Clerk will hold the Bible.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Judge O'Connor, please place your left hand on the Bible and raise your right hand and repeat after me:

(OATH)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Congratulations, Justice O'Connor; Mr. Marshal, will you kindly robe the new Justice and escort her to her seat. (The Chief Deputy Marshal will then escort Justice O'Connor to her place at the bench.) When the new Associate Justice is seated the Chief Justice will say:

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Justice O'Connor on behalf of all members of the Court I extend to you a warm welcome as an Associate Justice of the Court and wish for you a long and happy career in our common calling.

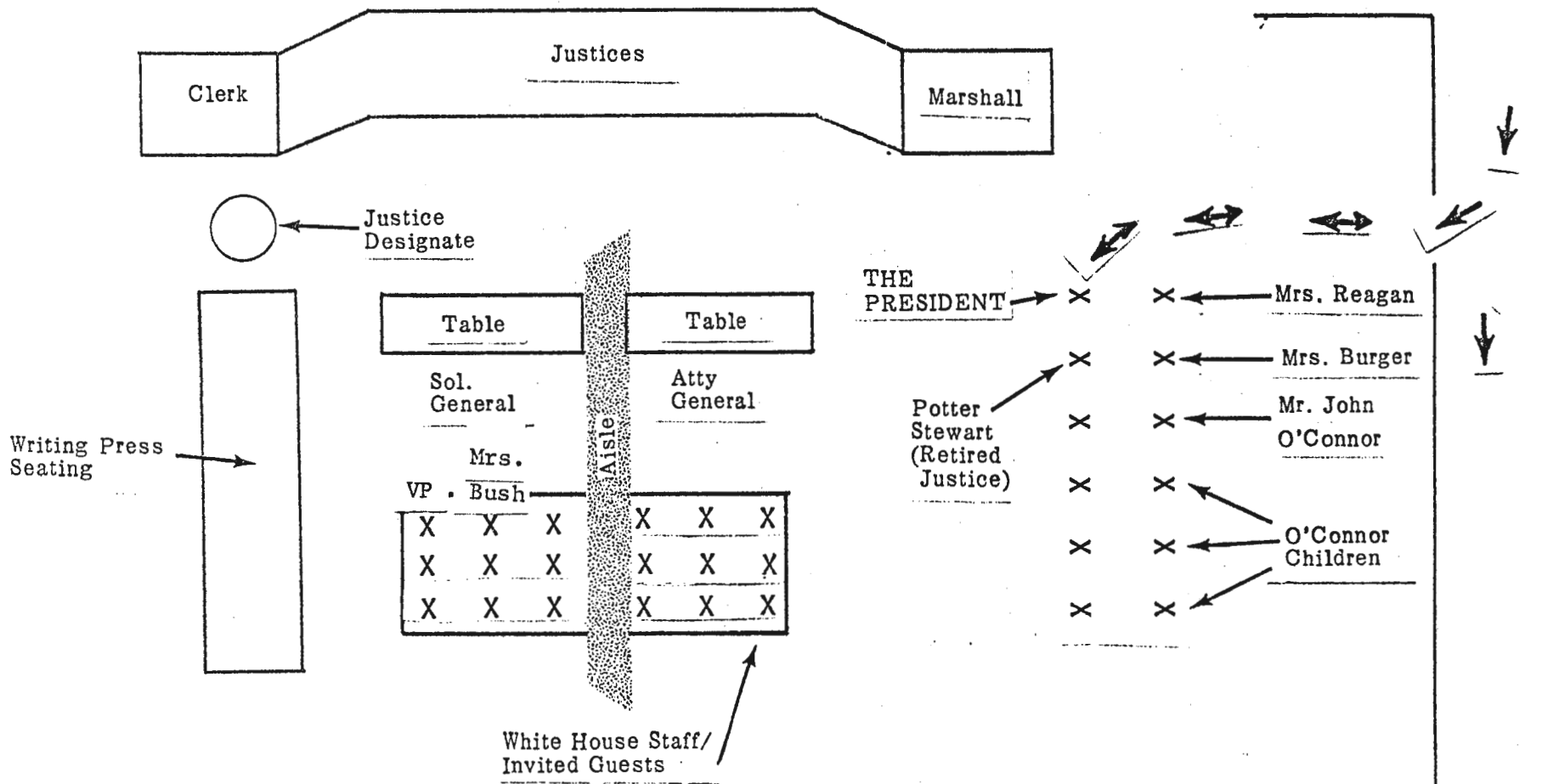

The Attorney General and the Solicitor General will have been seated at counsel table. They will wear formal morning clothes in the Courtroom. At 1:57 P.M. Mrs. Burger and Mrs. Reagan will be escorted to their seats in the Justices Box. At 1:58 P.M. Judge O'Connor will be escorted to the well of the Courtroom and seated in the John Marshall chair in front of the Clerk of the Court. The President of the United States is escorted to the traditional seat reserved to the President at 1:59 P.M. by the Marshal of the Court. AT 2:00 P.M. the Justices will enter the Courtroom, and as soon as they are seated, the Chief Justice will announce the special session of the Court.

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: This special session of the Court is held to receive the Commission of the newly appointed Associate Justice, Judge Sandra Day O'Connor. The Court recognizes the Attorney General of the United States.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL: Mr. Chief Justice, and may it please the Court: I bear with me the Commission issued to Judge Sandra Day O'Connor as an Associate Justice of this Court. It has been duly signed by the President and attested by me as Attorney General. I move that the Clerk read this Commission and that it be made part of the permanent records of the Court.

(The Commission is handed to a Courtroom Attendant near the lectern.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Your motion is granted, Mr. Attorney General.

(The Commission having been handed to the Clerk of the Court by a Court Attendant, the Clerk then reads it for the record.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Mr. Clerk, will you kindly escort Judge O'Connor to the bench to take the oath?

(As Judge O'Connor is being escorted to the bench, the Chief Deputy Marshal will enter the rear center of the bench carrying the robe of the new Justice. He will stand to rear of the Chief Justice as the oath is administered; the Clerk will hold the Bible.)

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Congratulations, Justice O'Connor; Mr. Marshal, will you kindly robe the new Justice and escort her to her seat. (The Chief Deputy Marshal will then escort Justice O'Connor to her place at the bench.) When the new Associate Justice is seated the Chief Justice will say:

THE CHIEF JUSTICE: Justice O'Connor on behalf of all members of the Court I extend to you a warm welcome as an Associate Justice of the Court and wish for you a long and happy career in our common calling.

LUNCHEON FOR MOI -- SEPTEMBER 25, 1981

Your Excellency and honored guests, it is with utmost pleasure that I welcome you to the White House. Our meeting this morning was both cordial and productive, but that was to be expected.

Kenya and the United States enjoy a natural bond that links our destinies and unites our peoples. It is not a bond of steel, like that which ties despotic regimes, but the bond is our common beliefs and values -- something stronger than metal and more powerful than weapons.

Today, few nations demonstrate those characteristics that separate them from the despotism of ancient times; Kenya and the United States shine as rare exceptions -- socially, politically, and economically.

We are, importantly, both God fearing people. Your national anthem begins with the words "O God of all creation"; the motto of our country is "In God We Trust." And while others may dismiss this as irrelevant, you and I, President Moi, know just how important it is.

Then there are the numerous political and economic beliefs our nations share. We are both representative democracies -- respecting the rights of our citizens and based on such institutions as an independent judiciary, civilian control of the military, and freedom of the press.

Economically, Kenya, as the United States, recognizes the importance of private enterprise to progress and national development.

These things, which are the foundation for both our nations, have served our people well. Kenya is an outstanding example of stability and progress, a partner with whom we seek to work.

And while we can be proud of our countries, we justifiably share concerns for the security of our peace and freedom. These concerns make cooperation between Kenya and the United States essential.

The Soviet Union's invasion of Afghanistan and its increased presence throughout Southwest Asia and the Indian Ocean have focused American attention on the importance of your region. The United States applauds your efforts to encourage solutions to the difficult problems facing your continent, especially in Southern Africa, Western Sahara, the Nigeria-Cameroon border and Libya's occupation of Chad. Your moderation and diligence, free from ideological and rhetorical cant, are admirable examples for African nations as well as other members of the world community.

President Moi, we bear a tremendous responsibility as individuals. We must offer leadership to our people, as our nations must offer leadership to others. I am proud to have you as a guest and as a friend because, as your domestic accomplishments and your Chairmanship of the O.A.U. clearly

demonstrate, you have risen to the task God has placed before us.

After our meeting this morning, I more fully understand the meaning of "Nyayo" (nee-hi-yo)\* -- the watch word of your administration. You and your nation are showing the way for others. The path on which you have embarked demands courage and perseverance. I want you to know that you have our respect and will have our support in your efforts. And so I lift my glass to you and your delegation and wish you Godspeed in your travel to Australia and your return home.
