First let me send my best regards to the ABC affiliates

I'm reaching by means of this wonder called video-tape.

As you know, through television Americans can follow history
as it happens -- TV brings us the triumphs and, unfortunately,
the tragedies of life as well. It is hard for most of us to
imagine being cut off from this important flow of information.

This year marked the first time that some 16 million hearing-impaired Americans had the opportunity to share in the televised inauguration of a president. This miracle was the result of closed captioning. I feel very honored to be the first president in history to have spoken directly to people who never before had experienced this historic tradition.

Since the Inaugural, the National Captioning Institute and the American Broadcasting Companies have cooperated in making my televised speeches available to the hearing-impaired through captioning. Through closed captioning the large segment of our population who are hearing-impaired will continue to have access to the governmental process at work. This interaction is at the heart of our democracy.

Listen to what a teacher of the hearing impaired at the Rochester School for the Deaf had to say. "For some of our students, this was their first inauguration. For all of us hearing impaired people, it was the first time we really

knew what was happening. I have seen every inauguration since John F. Kennedy, but this was the first one I really took part in and I cannot explain the feeling of it all."

Closed captioning has opened new avenues of understanding and participation to those who previously were isolated. I wanted to take this moment to thank you for your efforts and urge your continued support of closed captioning. Pass the word and best wishes.

TAPING: BARRY GOLDWATER TESTIMONIAL DINNER OCTOBER 13, 1981

Good evening ladies and gentlemen and good evening to you, Barry. I wanted to be present this evening but wasn't able to do so because of other commitments. However, I do want you to know I'm with you in spirit and I'm pleased to join with many of your other friends who are here tonight, to say thank you for a life full of public service. We honor you tonight for the great contribution you have made to the American political system over three decades.

I can't begin telling those of you with Barry tonight what an important role he has played in all the dramatic new legislation that has passed in the Congress during recent months. As you know, Barry has a reputation for being shy and indecisive on the issues . . . well, just kidding . . . I thought you'd like to know that Barry is still that pretty rare thing in Washington, a powerful and important influence for what's right.

But I have to admit that I'm glad for another reason that Barry's here in Washington -- I've finally found an elected official who admits to being older than I am.

Let me just say that like many of you in the room with Barry Goldwater tonight, my first formal entry into National politics, Republican National politics, was for a man who would become known as a phrophet in his time.

Barry Goldwater walked alone in 1964 on the strength of his principles and the strength of his character. He warned us then about the growth of Government, about the drain of the public sector on our economy. He talked about the stifling of individual initiative and that can-do spirit that had made us a great Nation.

Barry Goldwater's lonely voice warned us too that crime in our streets would become an epidemic in America. He warned us too that the Soviet Union had to be taken seriously, that their designs for global domination would be vigorously and aggressively pursued.

Barry, you've often heard me say that none of the new directions and exciting changes we see in Washington today would have been possible without your willingness to walk the lonely road you walked 17 years ago.

In my mind's eye, I can still see you at the hot July night in San Francisco as you reminded us of our National heritage, of how far we had come together. you told us we still possessed the strength and national will to set, as you put it, "the tide running again in the cause of freedom."

You said we must persevere in our dedication to our principles and our ideals "until our cause has won the day, inspired the world, and shown the way to a tomorrow worthy of all our yesteryears."

Well, Barry, that tomorrow is here -- we are making America great again. And you should know tonight what millions of Americans feel in their hearts toward you . . . and what history will someday record: that it was a tall tan Arizonian with rock hard principles that showed us the way and made all of it possible.

Goodnight ladies and gentlemen and congratulations to you Barry, and for all of us thank you.

TAPING: BROADCAST MAGAZINE, OCTOBER 13, 1981

Good evening to you who have gathered for Sol Taishoff's 50th anniversary dinner, and a special good evening to you Sol. And, Sol, put that pen down; you're not working this evening.

I've often thought that no sooner had Marconi sent the first radio message than his secretary must have rushed into the room and said, "Mr. Marconi, there's a Sol Taishoff of Broadcasting magazine here to see you."

Broadcasting magazine has always been there to cover the industry it is named after. It has chronicled the explosive growth of a industry that changed the world more than any of us, except perhaps for Sol, could foresee. The man we are honoring tonight has covered this revolution -- nearly from the beginning. He reported on its successes and failures, comings and goings, its present and its future. And he told us what Washington was doing for us -- or more often, to us.

For those of us in the business, <u>Broadcasting</u> was our professional book and bible. I know there are those of you who at some time in your careers read <u>Broadcasting</u> not only front to back but also back to front -- turning first to the very end and the classified pages that held the jobs.

Broadcasting was one of the first national magazines to take notice of my own career -- back in 1937, when its April 15

issue reported that a "Dutch" Reagan was leaving his sportscasting job at WHO in Des Moines to go to work for Warner Brothers in Hollywood. Photography had been invented by this time, and accompanying my announcement was a picture of a 26-year old fellow trying to look terribly urbane holding a pipe in his hand.

But <u>Broadcasting</u> has not only reported on the events of the industry, it has spoken out forcefully when the broadcast media's first amendment rights were threatened. It has shaped industry opinion on the vital communications issues and, of course, does to this very day.

Sol, I'm sorry I can't be there in person this evening, but perhaps it's all the more appropriate that I'm coming to you through the miracle of broadcasting. And this way, well, if I go on too long, you can always unplug me.

But before I go, I know I speak for everyone in broadcasting whether they are with you at the Hilton or keeping the industry on the air right now, in thanking you for what you have done over the last half century, and in wishing you the best in the years ahead. So let me sign off by just saying, "This is Dutch Reagan, WHO, Des Moines. Good night and God bless you."

TAPING -- ORANGE COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE OCTOBER 13, 1981

To those of you assembled in the Anaheim Convention

Center at the 19th Annual Economic Outlook Conference, a

warm and sincere welcome. This is like talking to old

friends. Some of you may remember, my original announcement

to run for Governor of California was made at one of your

meetings.

It is certainly gratifying to know that the title of this prestigious economic outlook conference is, "A New Beginning."

Your conference is an excellent example of the private and the public sectors working together to promote economic progress. I understand that it is sponsored by the Orange County Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with the U.S. Small Business Administration and the U.S. Department of Commerce.

A special greeting to Art Kelly of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and Luke Williams, Chairman of the Board of National Association of Manufacturers. They and the organizations they represent have done so much to help over the last few months.

As you know, we've made progress; but it truly is -only a beginning. Correcting problems that have been building
for decades doesn't happen overnight. Right now, in fact,

we're just catching our second wind. We intend to keep coming back to the Congress with proposals to trim spending, taxes and excessive regulation until economic recovery is secure.

Jefferson is attributed in saying eternal vigilance is the price of liberty. He wasn't talking just about foreign threats. With your continued help, we must and will remain vigilant about Federal spending, taxation and regulation. For these things are as great a threat to the Freedom of our country as any foreign enemy.

The Founding Fathers never thought Government should dominate society, but that is exactly what has been happening, especially during the last decade. Unelected regulators in Washington ended up with authority over things that should be handled by locally elected officials, as well as authority over areas which were not the proper province of Government in the first place.

This centralization of power snowballed in the final years of the last decade, threatening both liberty and prosperity. I don't have to tell you. Inflation robbed us of our savings and of our standard of living. Unemployment jumped to 8 million. Interest rates shot through the roof.

At the same time, our people exhibited pessimism totally inconsistent with the American character. I'm happy to point out today that we've turned that situation around.

Wall Street may have had the jitters, but the American people have never been more supportive.

During our fight on Capitol Hill, I went to the people 5 times to enlist their support. Each time they responded with an avalanche of phone calls, letters, and telegrams that tipped the balance. Many of you did your part. I want you to know how appreciative I am for that support -- you were the crucile factor. And the help offered by your fine organization was indispensible.

The economic program only went into effect a little under two weeks ago, but you should know I am as confident about it today as when it was proposed. There were those who were claiming it wasn't working, even before it went into effect. Of course, they never supported the program in the first place. That is the kind of thing that happens every time one tries to get something done.

Remember when oil was decontrolled back in January?

There were those who condemned that too. Since then we've witnessed the biggest spurt in oil exploration in the Nation's history. And in an astonishing reversal, oil production in the lower 48 States has just increased for the third month in a row.

Just as important is Vice President Bush's drive against excessive regulation. He has mobilized people in every department and agency. By the end of our first year, he will have cut the number of rules and new regulations in half.

These things are in the process of having a lasting impact on our economy. It won't happen overnight, but if we stick to our guns, we will again have the kind of vital and expanding economy that is every American's birthright.

I am grateful to you for allowing me to spend this time with you. I know if I could see your faces, I would feel like I was speaking to a family reunion. I wish you success in your meetings out there in beautiful California. You can bet my heart is with you. Good by and Good luck.

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS FOR OFFICIAL DINNER IN HONOR OF HIS MAJESTY JUAN CARLOS I, KING OF SPAIN

October 13, 1981

- 7:00 p.m. Dinner guests arrive at the Diplomatic Reception Room. Alternate dinner guests, with special cards, are led through the West Garden Room into the Rose Garden for cocktails by Social Aides.
- 7:10 p.m. The regular dinner guests are escorted by Social Aides to the East Room where they are announced. (A Social Aide will also announce each guest to the Press Pool in the ground floor cross hall.)

The Secretary and Mrs. Haig will arrive the North Portico. They should be escorted into the Red Room to await the arrival of Mrs. Annenberg and the Official Party.

(Harpist is in the Diplomatic Reception Room.)

7:15 p.m. First motorcade of the Official Party departs
Blair House escorted by the Chief of Protocol,
Ambassador Annenberg, and arrives White House
at the North Portico. The party enters the Main
Foyer.

At the arrival of the first motorcade, a Social Aide will escort the Secretary and Mrs. Haig from the Red Room to join the arriving party at the foot of the Grand Staircase.

The Chief of Protocol escorts the following to the Yellow Oval Room via the Grand Staircase:

Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig Foreign Minister and Mrs. Perez Llorca Spanish Ambassador and Mrs. Llado Ambassador and Mrs. Todman

Second motorcade of the Official Party then departs Blair House.

7:19 p.m. Second motorcade of the Official Party arrives White House at North Portico.

A Social Aide will escort them to the Red Room.

7:19 p.m. A senior Government official will serve as host in the Red Room to the remainder of the Official Party. A Social Aide, with the help of a Protocol Officer, will give out seating cards to the quests.

Four additional Social Aides will then escort the Party, one by one, into the East Room at 7:35.

- 7:28 p.m. King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sophia depart Blair House with The Hon. Walter Annenberg. (Military Cordon will line the driveway.)
- 7:29 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN depart the living quarters by elevator and proceed to the North Portico.

(U.S.M.C. Orchestra in Main Foyer)

The Chief of Protocol will serve as hostess pro-tem for THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN as they greet King Juan Carlos and Queen Sophia at the North Portico.

- 7:31 p.m. The King and Queen of Spain are greeted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN; pause for press photo. Proceed to Yellow Oval Room through grand foyer via the elevator.
- 7:35 p.m. The remainder of the Official Party in the Red Room is escorted to the East Room and announced.

Color Guard proceeds up Grand Staircase to hallway outside Yellow Oval Room.

7:40 p.m. Guests (save PRINCIPALS) depart Yellow Oval Room via elevator for East Room and are announced. The Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig are announced first.

OIC requests permission to secure the Colors. THE PRESIDENT responds, "Permission granted." Color Guard proceeds to secure the Colors and proceeds out of Yellow Oval Room down the Grand Staircase, led by OIC.

At foot of staircase, Color Guard divides.

7:45 p.m. The PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase, pause at the foot of the Stairs for press photo session, and proceed directly to the East Room to full Honors. The Color Guard remains at the stairs.

7:45 p.m. Cont.

After the announcement of the PRINCIPALS, the PRINCIPALS, led by THE PRESIDENT, enter the East Room and form a receiving line which faces south and will be between two trees.

The order of the line is as follows: THE PRESIDENT, KING JUAN CARLOS I, MRS. REAGAN, QUEEN SOPHIA.

The Chief of Protocol stands to THE PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

Having come through the receiving line, the Official Party will be led directly into the State Dining Room by Social Aides.

After all the guests have gone through the receiving line, the PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the State Dining Room, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the State Dining Room.

(Appropriate music should be played.)

- 8:10 p.m. Guests in the Rose Garden should be led into the West Garden Room to be seated for dinner.
- 8:15 p.m. Dinner is served in the State Dining Room and the West Garden Room.

(The Staff Mess will be used for dinner for attending Aides.)

- 9:00 p.m. Dessert is served accompanied by the Strolling Strings.
- 9:15 p.m. Toasts:

THE PRESIDENT

KING JUAN CARLOS I. (to be simultaneously translated)

9:30 p.m. Following the toasts, THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will be escorted into the Blue Room with King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sophia.

All other guests will be encouraged by Social Aides to mix and mingle in all color rooms.

9:30 p.m. Cont.	The after-dinner guests arrive in the Diplomatic Reception Room and are escorted with the guests from the West Garden Room immediately by Social Aides to the Color Rooms for coffee and liqueurs with other guests.
	(Harpist will play in the Diplomatic Reception Room.)
10:05 p.m.	All guests but PRINCIPALS will proceed to the East Room for seating.
10:10 p.m.	PRINCIPALS enter the East Room and are seated for entertainment on specially allocated chairs.
10:15 p.m.	The entertainment begins.
10:45 p.m.	Conclusion of the entertainment.
	THE PRESIDENT makes brief remarks to the guests and mounts the stage to be photographed with entertainers.
10:50 p.m.	King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sophia are escorted to the North Portico by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN for departure.
11:00 p.m.	THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN return to the Main Foyer to begin the dancing.
	Guests are served champagne and join in dancing.
11:30 p.m.	All guests depart the Residence.
