They believe that the present recession requires moving up the tax cut scheduled for July 1, 1982 to January 1, 1982.

Walker and his co-sponsors have been solid supporters of the Administration and are upset by the efforts to increase taxes in 1982. Additionally, they hope that their efforts to accelerate the tax cuts will counter-balance Democratic efforts to delay the tax package. They believe that this economic stimulation earlier in 1982 will have a favorable budgetary and political impact by avoiding a lingering recession in 1982.


