I. **PURPOSE**

To listen to the views of Governor Clements and Governor Treen on the issue of deregulation of natural gas.

II. BACKGROUND

The issue of deregulation of natural gas was considered in a Cabinet Council meeting in early December. All options were presented to you, but a decision was withheld based on the argument that the "time was not ripe" for the announcement of a decision. It was agreed that this issue would be reviewed in early 1982.

The Cabinet Council recommended a phase-out of price controls on regulated gas by allowing prices to rise smoothly from January 1, 1982, levels toward an oil equivalent price on January 1, 1985, when complete decontrol would occur. The Council recommended that some categories of "new" gas be allowed to rise immediately to the oil equivalent price, so as to create a greater immediate incentive for increased production. Finally, the Council recommended that all demand restraints on natural gas be repealed.

Other options considered included immediate decontrol of all gas, decontrol of "new" gas only, and other phasing options.

You should indicate to the Governors that no decision has been made on deregulation. You need make no commitment to any option or suggestion raised by the Governors.

Governor Treen will advocate the following:

Deregulation of "old" gas and acceleration of the 1. Natural Gas Policy Act (NGPA) schedule for new gas decontrol.

- Adoption of the same target date for decontrol of both "old" and "new" gas.
- 3. Removal of restrictions on intrastate pipeline access to outer continental shelf gas.
- 4. Opposition to a windfall profits tax.

Governor Clements will state that Texas faces a serious problem under current law because there is the possibility of curtailment of the natural gas supply during this winter and subsequent years because:

- The interstate pipeline system has a competitive advantage in bidding for new gas which, therefore, flows out of state; and,
- Texas is primarily served by intrastate pipelines which are deprived of access to gas produced in certain areas (most importantly, the outer continental shelf).

He will urge immediate decontrol of "new" gas and an accelerated phase-in of decontrol of other categories of gas. In addition, he will oppose the imposition of a windfall profits tax.

Please note that Governor Clements may also raise the issue of dismantling the Department of Energy and the issue of the state share of the outer continental shelf oil lease trust fund. You need not comment on either of these issues.

Governor Clements is up for reelection in 1982. Governor Treen is Chairman of the NGA Oil and Gas Committee.
