SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH
SENATOR MATHIAS AND CONGRESSWOMAN HOLT

- Tell Senator Mathias and Congresswoman Holt that as a result of recent discussions with Maryland state officials (see background) you will support an appropriation of \$7.5 million for the Baltimore Channel deepening project.

- The Port of Baltimore has demonstrated leadership in putting together the first major deep-draft coal port project. Senator Mathias and Congresswoman Holt have been key players in this project. You should commend them for their cooperation and assistance.

- You should expressly link this action to our general policy on new water resources projects and our port user fee proposal. Express your hope that this agreement will serve as a model for other projects.

- Point out that this project will expand our coal exports, and help European allies meet their energy needs.
