#### I. PURPOSE

To discuss your FY '83 budget.

#### II. BACKGROUND

The FY '83 budget will be formally submitted at noon today. The support and cooperation of both Houses of Congress is essential. It is appropriate for you to commence our work with the Congress on this important issue by personally encouraging the leadership to work with the Administration in an effort to assure expeditious consideration of your package. You will recall that you held a similar meeting with these leaders last year before presenting your FY '82 budget.

It is anticipated that there will be a good deal of discussion and debate on certain aspects of the proposed FY '83 budget, and it is important to stress with these Congressional leaders the fact that this program is key to your efforts to seek a full economic recovery. Acknowledge the fact that we face many hard decisions on budget issues, and assure these members that you are anxious to work closely with them in the months ahead to reach an agreement that will benefit the economy of the American people.

# SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH HOUSE AND SENATE BIPARTISAN LEADERSHIP

- -- Point out that your FY '83 budget package is being released today at noon and mention that you wanted an opportunity to meet with the Congressional leadership before Congress begins its consideration of this important subject.
- -- Remind the members that you held a similar meeting with them last year before presenting your FY '82 budget.
- -- Without going into detail on numbers and programs, explain to the leadership that your FY '83 budget proposals are the result of long and detailed consultation which involved many difficult decisions. Acknowledge the fact that some of the provisions will generate a good deal of discussion on Capitol Hill but that you believe these difficult choices are a part of the price we must pay to bring us back to a sound economy.
- -- Indicate your desire to work closely with the Congress on this issue, and encourage the leadership to consult with you at every step along the way. Stress your desire to proceed with expeditious action on the budget, and ask these leaders for their cooperation.

- -- Recognize the outstanding leadership of Howard Baker and Bob Michel and point out that, by continuing to work as a team, we will be successful again this year.
