I. PURPOSE

Ed Noble, Chairman of the Synthetic Fuels Corporation, has been concerned for the past several months about the fact that salaries at the Synthetic Fuels Corporation are not sufficient to keep and retain qualified people in key positions. Ed Meese has engaged in a series of discussions with Ed Noble on this matter and consistently indicated that we could not endorse salary increases above the current maximum level; however, Ed Noble has asked for a final appeal on this salary question. It should be noted that the Synfuel Corporation salaries have increased above and beyond the other executive branch salaries already.

Ed Meese will provide you with additional background material prior to the meeting and will attend the session with Ed Noble.

MEETING WITH HOUSE AND SENATE REPUBLICAN LEADERS
ON DEFENSE ISSUES

DATE: Friday, May 7, 1982

LOCATION: The Cabinet Room

TIME: 10:30 a.m. (45 minutes)

FROM: Kenneth M. Duberstein *KMD*.

I. PURPOSE

To provide an opportunity for discussion with Congressional leaders in the defense area on major defense items, and to allow the President an opportunity to demonstrate his interest in providing a strong defense, as well as his willingness to cooperate with the Congress to seek true defense savings and efficiencies.

II. BACKGROUND

Senator John Tower (R-Texas), Chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, has requested this meeting, and feels strongly that in order to preserve the President's defense programs, it will be necessary for him to take a personal and active role in encouraging both public and Congressional support for his defense programs. Senator Tower has indicated that he "can live with" the defense numbers currently under consideration by the Senate Budget Committee, but would resist further cuts.

The Senate has begun debate on the FY 83 Department of Defense authorization bill, and will continue this debate next Tuesday. It is likely that there will be numerous amendments offered, among which may be attempts to undercut the MX missile program. These and other specific defense programs, as well as the defense budget in general, should be the topic of discussion with these Republican leaders. It will be helpful for these members to have the strong reassurance of the President that he remains committed to his defense program.

The DOD authorization bill has been reported from the House Armed Services Committee, but has not been granted a rule nor been scheduled for floor action. The bill, as reported, is approximately \$3 billion less than the Administration's requested amount.
