

I. PURPOSE

As part of your overall campaign to gain support from the business community, you will meet with financial leaders to press them for support of the Domenici budget plan.

II. BACKGROUND

Participants at this session include insurance industry CEOs, investment bankers, investment advisors, and major brokerage firm CEOs. Together, they represent much of the leadership of the non-commercial banking financial markets. Although this community has been supportive of your economic recovery plan, they have been skeptical of burgeoning deficits and the inability of the Federal Government and the Congress to restrain spending. They are concerned we will have a repeat of prior recession recoveries when inflation roared back. Prior to your arrival, the group will have been briefed on the Hill "politics" of the issue by Senator Pete Domenici (R-N.M.) and Representative Trent Lott (R-Miss.). Dave Stockman will have provided an overview of the Domenici proposal and the House alternative.

You need to convince the group that the Domenici proposal represents a solid path of decreased deficits moving toward a balanced budget, and that this approach is led by reduced spending rather than a heavy reliance on tax increases. You should ask the group to help you work with the Congress to cut spending growth as the only responsible approach. They need to hear of your commitment to continued moderate growth of the money supply, not only for the next several months but next several years.

7:45 p.m. The PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase, pause at the foot of the Stairs for press photo session, and proceed directly to the East Room to full Honors. The Color Guard will precede them.

After the announcement of the PRINCIPALS, the PRINCIPALS, led by THE PRESIDENT, enter the East Room and form a receiving line which will be in the center of the east wall. The order of the line is as follows: THE PRESIDENT, HIS EXCELLENCY THE PRESIDENT OF BRAZIL, MRS. REAGAN, AND MRS. FIGUEIREDO.

Note: The Color Guard will precede the PRINCIPALS into the East Room and take their places on either side of the PRINCIPALS for the receiving line.

The Chief of Protocol stands to THE PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

Having come through the receiving line, the Official Party will be led directly into the State Dining Room by Social Aides.

After all the guests have gone through the receiving line, the PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the State Dining Room, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the State Dining Room.

(Appropriate music should be played.)

8:10 p.m. Guests in the Lower Cross Hall should be led into the West Garden Room to be seated for dinner.

8:15 p.m. Dinner is served in the State Dining Room and the West Garden Room.
