REMARKS FOR MEETING WITH TASK FORCE ON PRIVATE SECTOR SURVEY ON COST CONTROL, JULY 15, 1982

What a pleasure it is for me to welcome you to the White House. I've been talking about streamlining this Government for an awfully long time. Now, with your help, we're finally going to do it.

You and your organizations have volunteered time and expertise to help our Government undertake a massive task of utmost importance: bringing efficiency and cost-control to the public sector. Of course, the Federal Government has never been known for penny-pinching, so, as you prepare your report, there won't be much precedent to help you. I'm told runaway costs drove even President Madison to distraction. I know how he must have felt.

Applying the management experience of the private sector -where the bottom line means success or failure -- can make a
difference in Government. One of my first acts as governor of
California was to create a task force like this one, and those
people found tremendous savings across-the-board. I have even
greater hopes for you.

As I have said before, you and I will not compile information just for the sake of creating another report. Our mission is to cut back the time spent shuffling papers, not increase it. Instead, we will launch a cooperative effort

between the private and public sectors to unclutter the mess, untangle the tape and unscramble the procedures that have accounted for the waste of billions of tax dollars over the years. We will sort out the bureaucracy so that the American people can run their Government the way they run their lives: with common sense.

You have come from across the country, and from many fields -- including industry, labor and the academic community -- to take part in this effort. On behalf of all Americans, I thank you. Your eager responses and earnest dedication give me every confidence we can succeed. I pledge to you that your work will be a high priority of my Administration, and look forward to the day when your report is complete. Then we will move to an even more exciting step -- to implementing your recommendations.

I know you have been lectured by a host of informed speakers all morning, so I will step down and we will have a chance to talk more personally in the next room. I want to thank all of you for shouldering this great responsibility. I promise you my personal support and I wish you good luck.
