REMARKS FOR MEETING WITH TASK FORCE ON PRIVATE SECTOR SURVEY ON
COST CONTROL, JULY 15, 1982

What a pleasure it is for me to welcome you to the White House. I've been talking about streamlining this Government for an awfully long time. Now, with your help, we're finally going to do it.

You and your organizations have volunteered time and expertise to help our Government undertake a massive task of utmost importance: bringing efficiency and cost-control to the public sector. Of course, the Federal Government has never been known for penny-pinching, so, as you prepare your report, there won't be much precedent to help you.
